# Absentee Vote Is Very Heavy For Election

Voting in the Tuesday, Nov. 5 General Election will be heavy -- judging by the interest in absentee voting in Eastland County.

land County. A total of 135 persons had either voted in person or asked for mailed ballots, County Clerk Johnson Smith reported. Absentee voting began Wednesday and ends on Friday, Nov. 1, at 5 p. m., he said.

Smith provided the following information regarding absentee voting:


