## Countians Plan To Attend State History Meeting

Berry Greenwood of Carbon and Mr. and Mrs. Lee White of Rising Star will represent Eastland County Historical meeting of the Texas State Historical Survey Committee, Nov. 1 and 2 in San Antonio.

TSHSC President Charles R. Woodburn, said topics which will be discussed will include the National Historical Preservation Act of 1966; historic preservation grants, the future of the Institute of Texan Cultures, history and tourism, how to write the county history, setting up local history collections in the public library, and others.

At the awards luncheon on Saturday, members of 254 County Historical Survey Committees and fellow citizen historians will learn the winners for 1968 in the various areas of County Committee Competition.

Awards at the luncheon will be given for the Best County Committee Newsletter, Best Program of Work and Best Scrapbook. Also the best Chairman of a County Historical Survey Committee and Sub Committee Chairman will be announced.

In addition, a 30-minute color film, "How Will We Know It's Us", dealing with historical preservation and restoration, will be previewed. An educational tour of San Antonio's historic points of interest, including the King William Historic District, is also scheduled.

Mr. Walton said: "I want to take this opportunity to announce as a 'Write-In' candidate for the office of County Attorney of Eastland County at the General Election on Tuesday, November 5, 1968. The incumbent, Mr. Perry T. Brown, is not seeking re-election.

"It is necessary for me to announce as a 'Write-In' candidate since I was not a resident of Eastland County for a sufficient period of time to file as a candidate for the office of County Attorney in the May primary election. Had I been so qualified as a resident to the required period of time then, I would have filed and actively campaigned for this office in the May primary election.

"I have a strong feeling that effective law enforcement and firm prosecution constitute our principle deterrents to crime. ## New Budget of \$432,139 Set By Eastland County In 1969

The County Commissioners approved a budget of \$432,139.17 for 1969 expenses. County Auditor Earl O'Brien said. Expenses is fairly well distributed in each category of the budget.

Expected available resources for next year are \$582,135. O'Brien said. "This is a conservative figure, because no one can say for sure what will happen. For instance, car license sales could decrease or increase. We usually figure

tax collections at 85% of the years 1963 through 1967 is amount levied, although the average tax collection for the

Expected expenses for 1969 are: jury, \$11000.04; road and bridge, \$196,210.76; general fund (covers many items including maintenance of courthouse, expenses of elections, commissioners court, auditor's office, etc.), \$97,849.24; permanent improvement, \$2,000.; officers salaries, \$113,722.63; interest and sinking fund, \$51,467.50; and all others, \$8,000.

## Absentee Vote Is Very Heavy For Election

Voting in the Tuesday, Nov. 5 General Election will be heavy — judging by the interest in absentee voting in Eastland County.

A total of 135 persons had either voted in person or asked for mailed ballots, County Clerk Johnson Smith reported. Absentee voting began Wednesday and ends on Friday, Nov. 1, at 5 p. m., he said.

Smith provided the following information regarding absentee voting:

Voters in the coming general election on or after May 15 to November 1, 1968, must vote in the county offices and issues. However, instead of voting at a regular polling place on election day, they must vote during a special time period in the county clerk's office in the county of their new residence. This period, which is the same as the period for absentee voting, began on Oct. 16 and will end on Nov. 1.

If the voter has lived in the same congressional, legislative, or judicial district for six months, he may also vote

on that district office.

In order to vote, the person must be registered as a Texas voter for the 1968 voting year, and he should have his registration certificate with him when he applies for his ballot at the county clerk's office. However, if he has lost his certificate, he may vote after making an affidavit of its loss.

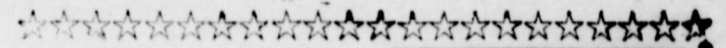

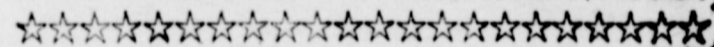

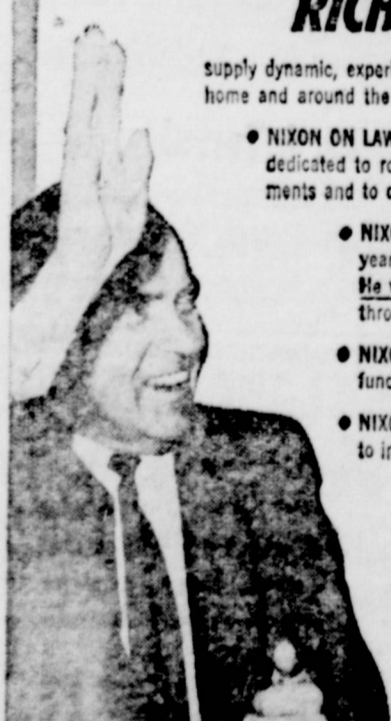
