HOME MAKERS Views and News

From the man's point of view—Tasty homemade breads and rolls can make any of your meals or snacks a special occasion—and contrary to what most folks think, the art of making bread is easy to learn.

To help you, Extension Foods and Nutrition specialists take the mystery out of bread making in a colorful bulletin entitled "Yeast Breads Made At Home." Steps for mixing ingredients, kneading the dough, shaping loaves and rolls of many kinds are clearly outlined and pictured in the bulletin.

You'll find recipes for French bread, rye, whole wheat, cheese, yeast bread, in addition to the plain white yeast bread... Refrigerator rolls, buttermilk rolls, oatmeal yeast rolls and many other tested recipes for different kinds of coffee cake, fruit filled rolls of all kinds, kolaches and yeast donuts.

Surprise your family with some of these delicious homemade breads or rolls. Ask for this bulletin in your home demonstration agent's office.

Limp, over-cooked, drab-looking vegetables have little appetite appeal, and little food value. The skillful cook will save color and food value by proper cooking.

Serve three vegetables each day—a green or yellow vegetable, sweet or Irish potatoes, and one other vegetable. Here are some pointers to remember in cooking vegetables: Use fresh, crisp vegetables. Cook in as little water as possible. Cook vegetables in their skins whenever possible. Cook only until tender, don't overcook. Cook most green and all yellow vegetables in a covered pan. Never use soda in cooking vegetables—it destroys part of the food value. Serve vegetables as soon as possible after cooking. The longer they are exposed to heat and air, the more Vitamin C they will lose.

The current supply of pork is sufficient to rate the feature spot on the USDA's April list of plentiful foods for this area. This list also includes many other energy foods that go well with increased spring activity. Lamb has taken a spot on the list. Broilers and fryers continue plentiful, as do eggs, milk, and other dairy products, peanuts and peanut products. Lard is plentiful too.

Potatoes, cabbage and canned peas are still sufficiently abundant to rate the plentiful tag. Honey and walnut supplies continue plentiful.

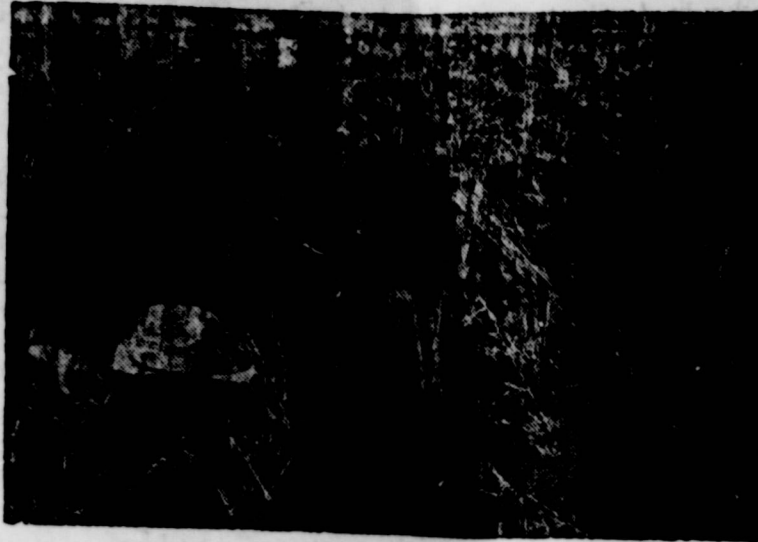

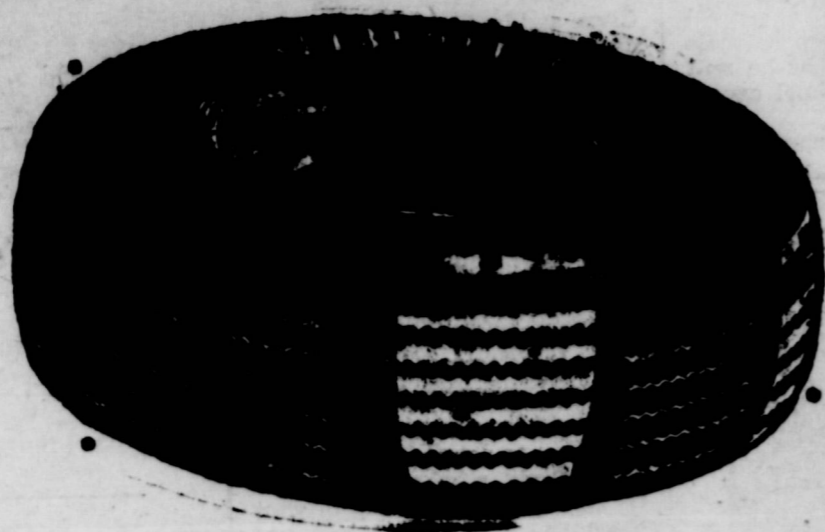

Dr. Craig's office hours will be eight to five on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, and from eight to 12 on Tuesdays and Thursdays. This does not apply to emergencies, he said. He plans to have a general practice, treating farm animals and pets. He said that he will treat "almost any animal except parakeets." The agricultural committee of

the Chamber of Commerce, headed by Sam Kimmell, had been trying for some time to locate a veterinary before contacting Dr. Craig.

Dr. Dan J. Craig has moved to Cisco and will open his veterinary office and practice here Friday, April 3, according to information today.

He is now in the process of moving his equipment and family to Cisco and as soon as he completes this work he will be open for business to the Cisco area residents.

A 1958 graduate of Texas A&M College, Dr. Craig holds degrees in animal husbandry and veterinary medicine. He has been practicing in Waco. Cisco has been without the services of a veterinarian for about a year now.

Dr. Craig purchased the Curtis Hailey office building in west Cisco on Highway 80, and has converted it into living quarters and office space.

He is married and they have four children. They are Methodists. Dr. Craig, 30, is a veteran of the Air Force. He is an orphan and grew up in the Methodist Home in Waco.
