Bond Interest Is Income IRS Warns Taxpayers

"Don't forget to report interest on those U. S. Savings Bonds," Arthur E. Fogle of Internal Revenue Service, Abilene, reminded taxpayers today.

"If you are on the cash basis, you have an option as to when you may report the interest on your income tax return. You may choose to report interest yearly. If you do it this way, the amount of interest to be included in income each year is given in the table on the bond." The taxpayer may elect to wait until the bonds are matured or

cash before reporting the interest earned. In this case the interest must be included as income for that year. Also, once the taxpayer elects to report interest yearly, he must stick with this method unless he is given permission to change to another method.


Asked about Savings Bonds held beyond maturity, Mr. Fogle said, that if a taxpayer owning Series E Bonds wishes to hold them beyond maturity they will continue earning interest for ten more years, or until they are cashed, whichever is earlier.

Win Top 4-H Project Awards

Young forester Darrell Bozell, 18, of Mount Pleasant, Titus County, won the 1958 state 4-H Forestry award of a fountain pen and pencil set given by the American Forest Products Industries.

He started his forestry project two years ago when he cleared a 10-acre plot. Since then, he has planted 2,000 pine trees furnished by the Texas Forestry Service. Over 75 per cent have survived, he reports, and now stand two to three feet tall.

Young Bozell hopes to improve the area until he has the 10-acre plot in commercial pines.

Miss Paula Joan Obrecht, 19, of Claude, State winner in 4-H Dress Revue, was awarded a trip to National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago by Simplicity Pattern Company.

There she modeled a rose-beige wool flannel modified chemise dress with a shirred overback, self belt in front, three-quarter sleeves, and a stand-up roll collar opening to a V in front.

A nine-year 4-H'er, she has won first in Armstrong County dress revue each year. For the past three years, she has been one of the top five girls in district event.

She makes most of her clothes and also western shirts for her brother. About \$660 has been saved by her sewing project, she estimates.

Miss Obrecht is district representative at the State 4-H Council and president and junior leader of the Claude 4-H Club.

Now a home economics major at Harding College, Searcy, Arkansas, she hopes to become an Extension worker.

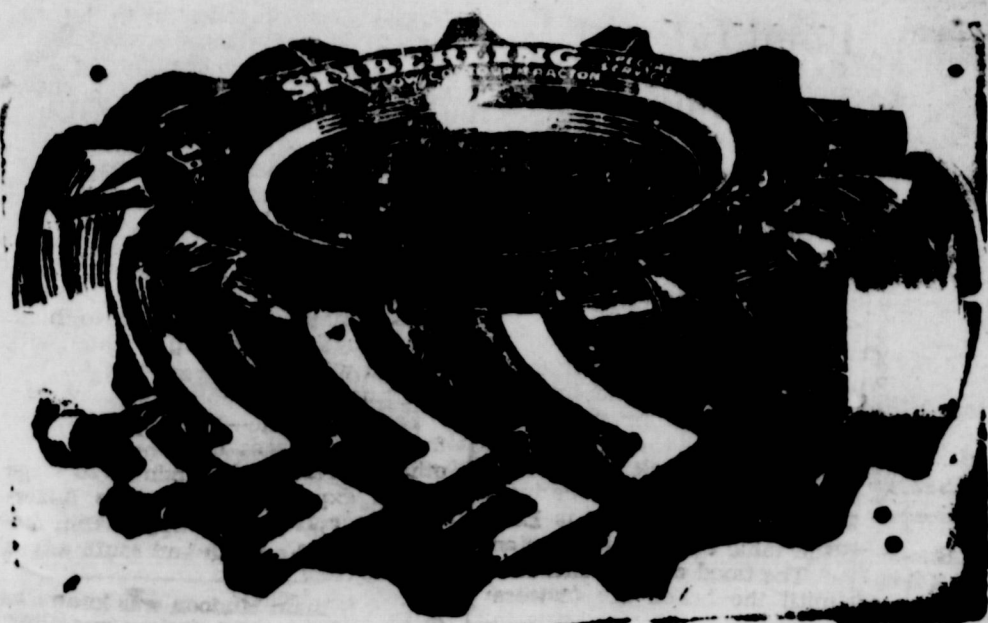

Quotes On Farming

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Last year at the end of the session, Congress passed a Farm Bill filled with "hope." Few people were really for it, and many of us in the Congress involved in the fight were doubtful then, and still doubtful, as to its effects. The fact remained it was the only bill which could be passed and approved by the President. Obviously, something more is needed. Just what we will be able to do in this session remains to be seen.

A few days ago Secretary of Agriculture Benson told the Congress he is ready to toss in the towel and give up the battle to support farm prices and control production. "Why," he asks, "continue a program that is bankrupt?"

It is a perfectly good question he asks, but the question as to "who and what got us this way," is also justified, and that question should be directed to Mr. Benson. The Secretary says the way to

correct this situation is to let farm prices seek their law of supply and demand level. "It doesn't make sense," he says, "to pay farmers to produce for the Government."

Both the President's message and Mr. Benson leaves the impression that a large share of the estimated cost of \$7½ billion for the Farm Program this year will go to the farmer.

As a matter of fact, it figures mean anything at all, the farmer himself will receive very little of this huge figure.

Farming costs — prices paid by farmers for wages, machinery and other necessary production items — are expected to increase this year over 1958 by a billion dollars or more. At the same time, income from farm produce is estimated to decline by about the same amount.

Farm prices have gone down approximately 20 per cent. If farm products had risen by as much as the cost of things the farmer has had to buy since 1952, consumers would be paying at least \$10 billion a year more for their food and clothing than they pay at the present time.

One thing on which we can agree with the Secretary of Agriculture: If the Farm Program is not going bankrupt, the average-size farmer is. It is time some answers are found to this situation.
