Pecan growers in both Eastland and adjoining counties are being invited to enter exhibits at the Sixth Annual Eastland County Pecan Show to be held in Ranger on Dec. 12-13.

Wilson Guest, president of the Ranger Chamber of Commerce, is issuing a special invitation for growers to enter pecans in the show. The two-day affair will be held in the Joseph building on Main street at Ranger.

A quart of pecans will constitute enough for an entry. People who live in towns are equally welcome to have entries in the show, the same as those in the country.

"We are planning to make this the biggest and best pecan show ever held in the county," T. C. Wylie, chairman of the agriculture committee, said in commenting on plans for the show that has attracted attention throughout West Central Texas.

Growers are limited to one entry of each of the improved varieties of nuts. For example they may have one entry of one variety of nuts.

Apples, peaches, pears, plums, nectarines, cherries, grapes, and other fruits will also be entered. The percentage of meat to shell and other factors. A team of horticulturists from Texas A & M will be on hand to judge the entries.

The judging on Saturday, Dec. 13, according to Oscar Schaefer of the Cook community, president of the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association, whose organization, jointly with the Ranger Chamber of Commerce, is sponsoring the show.

The largest papershell division of the show is expected to be in the Burket entries, it was explained. Over 50 growers entered this variety at the 1957 show held in Cisco. It is anticipated that an equally large number of entries of the variety will be in the Ranger show.

Duck Hunters Are Asked To Help In Wildlife Project

AUSTIN, Nov. 26. — Some 7500 Texas duck hunters have an opportunity to provide information which will be helpful in setting up seasons and bag limits on waterfowl, according to the director of wildlife restoration of the Game and Fish Commission.

A random sample of 7500 license buying hunters has been sent a questionnaire designed to help the commission regulate the annual game harvest at peak efficiency.

Civil Service To Hold Job Exams

An examination for Geologist has been announced by the U. S. Civil Service Commission for filling positions paying starting salaries of \$4,490 and \$5,430 a year in various Federal agencies in Washington, D. C., and throughout the United States. Some positions in foreign countries may also be filled. Most of the positions to be filled are in the Department of the Interior, principally in the Geological Survey. Some vacancies also exist in the Bureau of Reclamation and in the Bureau of Mines.

To qualify, applicants must pass a written test. In addition, they must have completed appropriate college study or show a combination of such study and experience in geological work.

Quail Hunting Season To Open

AUSTIN, Nov. 29. — Two more shooting seasons on important species will open Dec. 1, according to the director of law enforcement of the Game & Fish Commission. Of widest importance will be the opening of quail season, with a bountiful crop reported throughout the state. The deer season west of the Pecos also will open at that time. Shooting of quail will be legal until Jan. 16, but trans-mountain deer season will end Dec. 31. All dove shooting in Texas now is over for the year. Any further killing of doves is illegal. The season is open now on all species of geese. It is now legal to kill Canadas and white-fronted geese. He warns, however, no more than two of either of the Canadas or specs, or one of each, may be legally killed.

Questions & Answers

Q — I am 21 years old, the son of a World War I veteran who has just died of a service-connected condition. I understand that War Orphans education is generally limited to children between 18 and 23. Will my War Orphans benefit end when I am 23?

A — No. Since your veteran parent died after you had passed age 18, you will have five years from the date of his death in which to complete your War Orphans schooling.

Q — There has just been a new addition to our family, a baby boy. I am at school under the Korean GI Bill, and I know this entitles me to an increase in my allowance money, but what do I have to send VA as proof of my new dependent?

A — To support your claim of additional allowance money, send VA either a certified copy of the public record of birth, or a certified copy of the church record of the child's baptism.

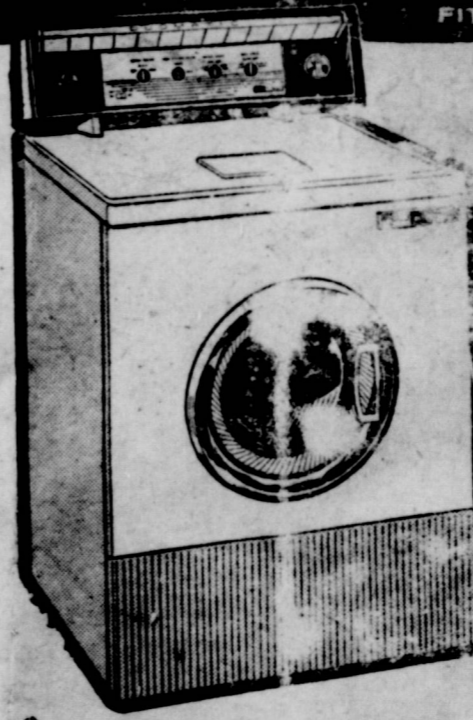

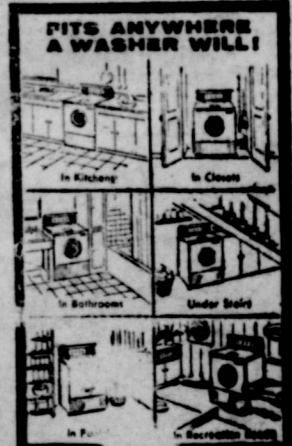
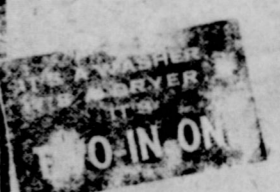
