Wolverines Defeat Priddy 38 To 7

Compost Pile Will Pay Big Dividends

College Station - Leaves which are now falling and cluttering yards and gardens can give a boost to next year's flower or vegetable garden if properly handled.

Burning the leaves may be easier but the extra-time required to put them in a compost pile will return big dividends, explains Bennett. The compost can be used next year to increase soil organic matter for mulching flowers, shrubs or vegetables.

Making a compost pile is simple operation, points out the chemist. Scrap lumber or a few feet of net wire and four posts will take care of the enclosure. Then start with a six inch layer of leaves. For every four square feet of enclosure, dissolve a cup of commercial fertilizer, such as 8-8-8 or 6-2-6, in water and sprinkle the solution over the layer of leaves. In areas where soils are acid, Bennett suggests adding a cup of lime to the fertilizer.

About 2,400 Cast Ballots In County General Election

Eastland County voters objected to changes in the state constitution last Tuesday as more than 2,400 people went to the polls in the general election. A total of 713 of the votes were cast in Cisco — 564 at the City Hall and 149 at the Lone Star Gas Company.

Only one of the nine proposed constitution changes won approval in Eastland County. The favored amendment was No. 3, which would permit the Commissioners Court to fill vacancies in elective offices. The vote was 1,097 for and 1,047 against — a bare majority.

All other amendments were rejected by substantial margins.

The Democratic candidates won one-sided victories. Governor Price Daniel received 2,252 votes as compared with 189 for Republican Edwin S. May. Ralph Yarborough to 416 for Roy W. Republican.

Pecan Show Will Be Held Dec. 12 And 13 At Ranger

The annual Eastland County Pecan Show will be held in Ranger on Dec. 12-13, according to Oscar Schaefer of the Cook community, president of the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association. His organization, jointly with the Ranger Chamber of Commerce, will sponsor the affair.

Schaefer said that the show site was selected by a mail ballot after both the Ranger and Cisco Chambers of Commerce had asked for the show. The show has been held in Cisco for the past by eligible voters consisting of members of the association, together with those who exhibited entries at the 1957 show.

Over 250 entries were shown at last year's show, Schaefer said, making it the largest pecan show in the state. It is expected that the number of exhibitors in the coming show will be even larger.

"We have the soil and climate for pecans here in the West Cross Timbers area, and our organization is dedicated to forwarding the pecan industry in the county and in this area," Schaefer said.

Cecil Shults of Rising Star and Arthur Littlefield of Gorman were on a committee to count the ballots which had to be in by Oct. 20.

Schaefer is calling a meeting of the officers and directors of his organization for the near future to begin plans for the annual show.

Good Eating

Almost 12 million meals will be served in 15,000 Texas restaurants this week. If you're average you'll eat at least two of them.

You could go into the vast majority of those restaurants and be assured of getting a wholesome meal — totally oblivious of the fact that you're eating food cooked and served by complete strangers.

How can this be, especially since some 26 different diseases can be spread by improperly handled food? Included in the list are such scourges as trichinosis, the deadly botulism, strep infections, and salmonellosis (food poisoning).

There are many reasons of course, but among the main ones are the four-day short courses in sanitation conducted by the State Department of Health for persons engaged in food preparation and service. In the past five years, according to official records, some 30,000 persons have taken the instruction.

The subject matter, presented in a non-technical, easy-to-understand style with films and demonstrations, covers such essential points as basic bacteriology, insect control and personal hygiene.

Two public health instructors

from the department's division of public health education, assisted by local health officials, will put on a course anywhere in the State on request. Attendance is open to anyone, but usually those who come to the two-hour daily sessions are cafe and cafeteria personnel.

In four Texas cities — Abilene, Big Springs, Midland and El Paso — attendance is mandatory for all food service persons by city ordinance. It's a moot question as to which is preferable — mandatory or voluntary attendance.

When a restaurant employee completes the instruction, he is given a certificate of attendance, signed by the state health commissioner and attesting the fact that he has been indoctrinated. And when 80 percent of the workers in a food service establishment completes the course, the restaurant is awarded a placard suitable for framing and display so customers can see the owner has an interest in health protection.

They're good things, these schools for foodhandlers, good in their implications of higher health standards for restaurant-goers. The food service business has grown to gargantuan size. Latest estimates put the number of meals served daily in the United States at 82 million, 1.7 million in Texas.

Lone Star Sinking Deep Wildcat Oil Test Near Cisco

Two drill stem tests had failed Saturday to yield impressive results in a wildcat oil test, Lone Star Producing Company's No. 1 Clarence Stroebel, located some eight miles south of Cisco, according to information here.

The tests were run in sections of the Marble Falls lime at about 3,000 feet. There was no show on the first, and the second had 96 feet of oil and gas cut mud with a salt taste. Formations were running high, it was understood.

It was understood that the hole was contracted to test the Duffer and it was reported that it might be carried on to the Ellenberger lime.

Elsewhere, Gulf Oil Corporation had plugged its No. 3-A Fee Ranch well as a dry hole two miles east of Cisco. Located in Section 77, Block 4, H&TC Survey, the well was drilled to 3,693 feet with no results. It was an offset to production of the Gallagher property.

G. A. Bloomquist of Cisco recently made location to drill his No. 2 E. C. McClelland in the Bloomquist Lake Sand Pool five miles southeast of Moran in Eastland County. The test was scheduled for 3,950 feet. Location was in Survey 466 of the SP Survey.

Good Quail Crop Is Forecast For Coming Season

AUSTIN, Nov. 8. — Early reports have indicated there'll be a big crop of quail for the opening of the season Dec. 1. Now indications also point to a good crop of quail hunters, according to the assistant director of wildlife restoration of the Game and Fish Commission.

"We've had a lot of good food and cover this year, and a wonderful hatch of birds," he said.

"Our men from every part of Texas tell us that conditions are excellent and birds are plentiful."

The quail season begins Dec. 1, and ends Jan. 16. The limit is 12 birds per day, or 36 in possession.

Applications are still coming in for the public hunts to be held on the Gene Howe Wildlife Management area in the Panhandle. These hunts are scheduled for Dec. 6; Dec. 20; Jan. 3, and Jan. 15. All applications must be in the Game Commission office in Austin by 8 a. m. Nov. 14. A drawing then will be held.

The hunters will be paired, with 10 pairs of hunters each day, for a total of 80 hunters. Only

persons over 17 will be given permits. The bag limit on this area is 10 birds per person.

Shooters are urged to bring their own dogs. There is a heavy growth of flowering weeds and dogs are needed to prevent loss of birds.
