Refund Is Given Candidates After Vote Costs Paid

The County Democratic Executive Committee refunded a total of \$1,941 to the 1958 election candidates, both winners and losers, who had paid for the campaign, according to a financial report released by A. J. Blevins, chairman.

The candidates originally paid \$5,853 for the two Democratic primary elections. The expenditures of the elections totaled only \$3,892, therefore the candidates were refunded the excess amount. Candidates received a rebate of their original payment on a percentage basis.

A breakdown of the expenses follows:

Bill Blackmon, erecting, storing and caring for election board, \$137; Crowell Lumber Co., rental lumber, \$14.50; The Steck Co., \$3.50; Eastland Telegram, first primary ballots, \$312.15; Lucille Sims, mimeographing, \$2.50; precinct chairmen, called meetings, \$135; cost of first primary, \$1,850.46; cost of second primary, \$975.16; secretarial help, \$55; Stephens Printing Co., second primary

Student Memorial Building Is Name Picked By Board

"Student Memorial Building" was the name selected for the new dormitory-class room building at Cisco Junior College at a meeting of the board of regents Tuesday night, President Grady Hogue reported today. The structure is expected to be completed in about a month.

Mr. Hogue said the board decided that the new structure should be dedicated to the memory of ex-students of Cisco Junior College, Randolph College and Brittain Training School.

The building, which will have quarters for 40 girls along with several class rooms and a book store, is being erected by Welborn Garrett, local contractor. It will be in use by the time the second semester begins, Mr. Hogue said.

Part of the money used in financing the building came to the college in the form of gifts in the memory of deceased ex-students, Mr. Hogue said.

Routine business matters also came before the board. Ballots, \$82; and chairmen's fee, \$250.

Mrs. Workman was assisted in a Round Table discussion of the functions of PTAs and PTA officers by Mrs. A. E. Unruh, Ft. Worth, Mrs. M. W. Horweck, Ranger, and Mrs. Benton. The state program theme for the year, "Education is Life in the Making," was discussed as well as many other important phases of Parent-Teacher work.

Some 15 members were in attendance, representing local PTA units in Morgan Mills, Ranger

(Young School), Ranger (Hodges Oak School), Eastland (South Ward), Cisco (West Ward), Ft. Worth and Arlington.

"Education is Life in the Making" will be the theme of the 49th annual convention of the Texas Congress of Parents and Teachers in El Paso, November 12-14. It will be developed in keynote addresses, panel and workshops.

Mrs. W. D. deGrassi, state president, will be held in Liberty Hall. Featured speakers include Mrs. A. L. Hendrick of Jackson, Miss., a vice-president of the national congress and its official representative to the convention, and Dr. Hollis M. Moore, executive secretary of American Association of School Administrators, Washington, D. C.

There will be four state vice-presidents elected. Area members planning to attend are urged to get in touch with the El Paso Chamber of Commerce without delay.

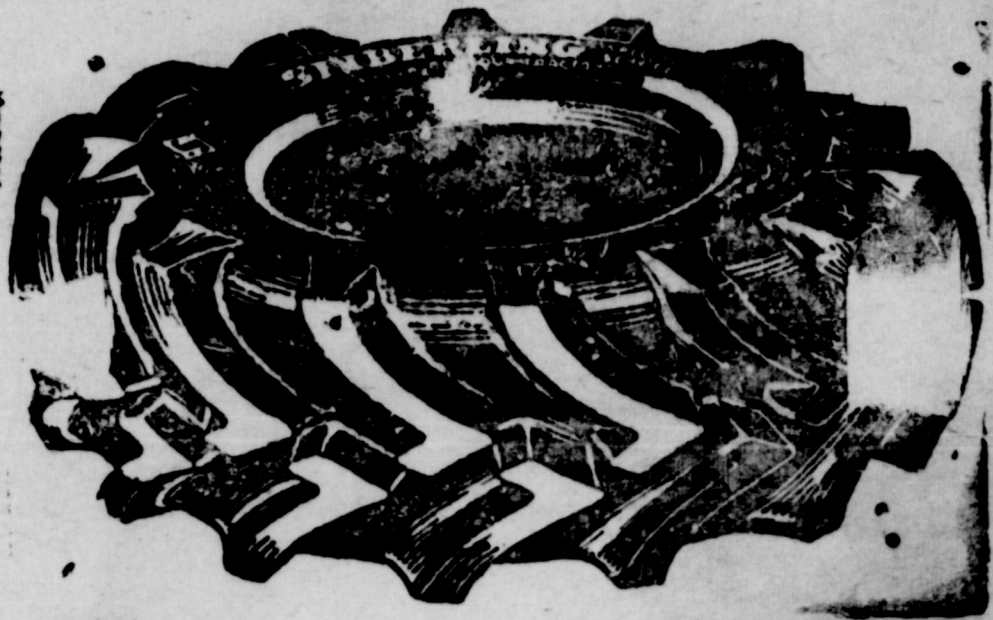

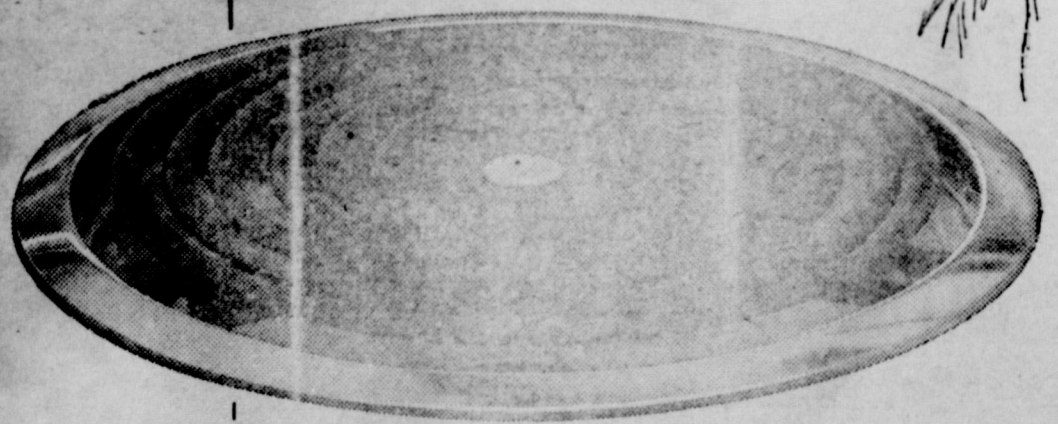
