Soil Survey Is 65% Finished In This County

Soil surveys are completed on about 65 percent of Eastland County. During the coming year, an additional 98,000 acres are planned to be completed. Joe Moore and Fred C. Burn, soil scientist with the Soil Conservation Service, are making the survey.

District operators of the United States Soil and Water Conservation District are the main force in the soil survey. They study the soil and its limitations and many other factors. City planning and many other things are also finding it helpful.

Carbon Soldier Earns Army Heroism Medal

Sp-4C Charley J. Stephenson, a Carbon High School graduate and native Eastland Countian now on duty has been awarded an Army Commendation Medal for Heroism according to a report here.

So of the late Charles Stephenson and wife the young man is married to the former Peggy Haile daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Marvin Haile. The soldier's wife is staying with her parents while he is over seas.

Dated Aug. 22, the commendation award said in part: "For heroism in connection with military operations against a hostile force in the Republic of Vietnam: PFC. Stephenson distinguished himself by valorous actions on June 11, 1968 as a howitzer cannoneer during a heavy enemy mortar and rocket at-

tack on Special Forces Camp atum in Tay Ninh Province.

"During the initial moments of the attack Pvt. Stephenson was directed to take cover inside a personnel bunker but he refused the safety and security of the bunker and received permission to take his position on his howitzer instead. As the incoming rounds continued to impact in and around their position he and eight other men fired counterfire programs until the enemy weapons were silenced.

"Pfc. Stephenson's heroic actions were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself his unit and the United States Army."

It is signed by Brig. Gen. Frank H. Linnel US Army Chief of Staff.

Army ROTC Open To Students

Male high school students who plan to enter college for the first time in the fall of 1969 may apply now for 800 four-year Army ROTC scholarships, the Army ROTC Directorate, Fort Monroe, Va., announced today.

Each scholarship pay for the student's tuition, textbooks and lab fees and provides a \$50 per month subsistence allowance for the duration of the award except for a six-week summer camp period when the student receives one-half the pay of a second lieutenant.

The scholarship winner may attend any one of the 259 colleges and universities offering Detailed information about the four-year scholarship program the four-year Army ROTC

program. Except for officer training subjects, which are taught by Army professors of military science, the ROTC student pursues the same academic courses in the field of his choice as any other student.

Application closing date is Jan. 15, 1969. Announcement of scholarship winners will be made in the spring of 1969. The scholarships become effective with the opening of the 1969-70 school year.

Since part of the scholarship selection is based on the College Entrance Examination Board (CEEB) tests, high school students who intend to compete for one of the awards should take the CEEB test program and application forms may be obtained from the Commanding General Fourth U. S. Army, ATTN: AKAAG-R, Fort Sam Houston, Tex. 78234.

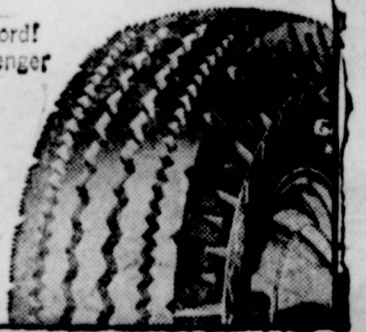

Leaf spot, a disease of peanuts, is causing a lot of damage this year. The lower leaves of peanuts were showing leaf spot infection early in the season. This causes leaves to fall and a reduction of yields. It has been proven that the control of this disease is economical. The leaf spot is worse in irrigated peanuts and is worse in dry land peanuts in wet years.

We had a leaf spot demonstration on Edwin Schaefer's place near Pioneer last year. Peanuts that were treated made from 12 to 23 dollars more per acre above cost of treatment than the non-treated peanuts.

This year we have another leaf spot demonstration on Claude Fuller's farm near Gorman. We are using three different fungicides - Cal-Cop 10 Kocide, and Poly-ram. Different rates of water are also being used. Each chemical is being applied with three different rates of water. Some plots are sprayed with 15 gallons per acre, some with 25 and some with 35 gallons per acre.

Other fungicides that are being recommended for leaf spot control are sulfur, Sperlox, Dithane and Maneb.

The fungicides should be applied to the peanuts every 10 to 14 days.
