INDIFFERENCE IS BIG PROBLEM FACING UPPER LEON SOILS UNITS

A group of farmers who were tired of seeing their land misused banded together in 1941 to organ-

ize the Upper Leon Soil Conservation District.

Today the District comprises some 5000 farm and ranches and 1,346,412 acres in Eastland, Comanche and Erath counties.

Actually the district was formed under State authority in an election held Dec. 14, 1940. Since organization it has been enlarged by 338,790 acres in 12 annexations. Approximately 57 percent of the land is cultivated and 43 percent is pasture and rangeland. Of the 5000 to 5300 operating units in the District 3,015 of these owners and operators are District cooperators.

Members of the Board of Supervisors are B. B. Hickman, Rising Star; F. M. Spurlen, Route 2, Eastland; W. J. Fritts, Route 1, Comanche; Wade George, Route 3 De Leon; and H. W. Turney, Route 7, Dublin.

The District's first supervisors were T. E. Castleberry, Eastland; J. B. Eberhart, Rising Star; T. E. Hughes, Dublin; J. H. Huddleston, DeLeon; and W. J. Fritts.

The District cooperates with local, county, State and Federal agencies in seeing that soil conservation practices are made available.

Efforts of the District have not been small, nor have results. In 1957, 1549 cooperators applied one or more conservation practices. Since 1941, 121,359 acres of contour farming has gone into the District's books.

In that same period 148,815 acres have been planted to cover crops and 3,365 farm ponds have been constructed, 207 of them in the last year. Other practices such as strip cropping, brush control, pasture planting, rotation grazing, fish pond improvement, field terracing and many others also have impressive figures.

What problems face the District? The annual report best explains that. "The attitude and understanding of the people is a factor that needs our constant attention and will remain so for years to come. The constant changing of land ownership, complications arising out of the many agricultural problems, and indifference on the part of some landowners makes the need for informational programs a continuing thing."

"We have been highly successful in getting the leadership in the town in our District interested and informed about the program and the aims and problems of the District."

"This is impossible because of the various town organizations that are interested in civic improvements. District philosophy can be discussed with such groups when the need arises."

"There is no counterpart to these clubs in most of the rural areas. Active formal civic or social organizations in rural areas are rare. A high percentage of rural churches and most of the rural schools no longer exist in our district."

similar disasters from time to time. Many of them had never realized the value of a safe place just as we never miss the water until the well goes dry.

But, why not construct a storm cellar before a tornado strikes to remind you that you need one? It can be constructed easily without any special skills and only a few special tools.

Since tornadoes generally move from southwest to northeast, the storm cellar should be located far enough from the house that a falling wall, large trees or other debris will not block the entrance. Too, select a well-drained site which can be landscaped to harmonize with the home surroundings.

Storm cellars should be constructed strong enough to withstand the impact of falling debris. It should also be watertight, economical and relatively easy to keep.

The size of the cellar depends on expected use. For an extended period of comfortable occupancy, allow about 10 square feet of floor area per person. Short occupancy requires only about two square feet per person. Adequate ventilation should be provided.

Instructions on constructing a satisfactory storm cellar plus information, such as other uses for the cellar, food storage, for example, is contained in a Texas Agricultural Extension Service leaflet, L-388, "The Disaster Cellar." It may be obtained from local county agents or the Agricultural Information Office, College Station, Texas.

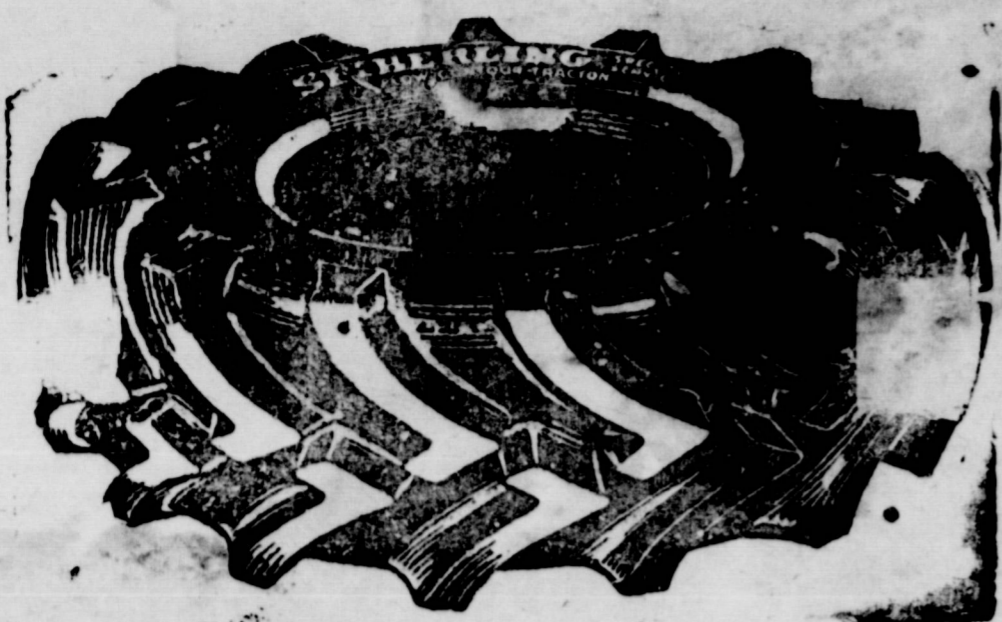

The area headquarters of the American Cancer Society in Abilene has announced that Mrs. Roscoe Hopper of Ranger will lead the 1958 Cancer Crusade in Eastland County. The educational and fund-raising drive will begin April 1.

Mrs. Hopper, as chairman of the local campaign, will direct the raising of \$2,500, the quota for Eastland County. The goal of the country-wide campaign is \$30,000,000. The money will be used in three fronts to push the war on cancer — research, education and service.

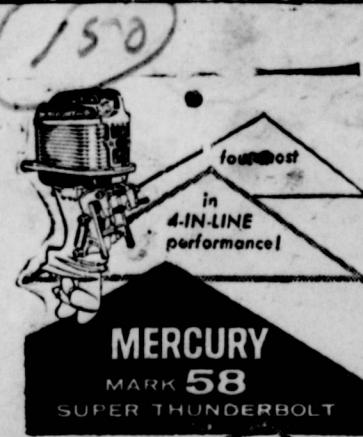
