Forfeited Land Offered For Sale By State Agency

AUSTIN, March 11 — Seventy-seven tracts of forfeited land in 23 Texas counties will be offered for sale by the Veterans' Land Board on March 31.

The forfeited tracts are located in every part of the state, says Frank Driskill, administrative assistant to Land Commissioner Bill Allcorn.

Meanwhile, the veterans' Land Program is continuing at top speed, Driskill says. 2,750 application forms have been mailed since the Board sold \$12.5 million worth of bonds on December 16. About 55 application forms are mailed every day to veterans on the waiting list, Driskill points out. The Board reached application number 8,750 today.

Tracts of forfeited land to be offered in the March 31 sale are located in these counties:

EAST TEXAS: Cass; Franklin; Nacogdoches, 2; and Upshur.

VALLEY: Cameron; and Hidalgo, 2.

WEST TEXAS: Culberson; and Pecos, 2.

Fertilizing Fish Pond Also Helps Control Weeds

COLLEGE STATION, Feb. 13. Applying fertilizer to a farm fish pond not only increases the amount of food in the water but also is one of the best practices for controlling submerged mosses in the pond, says Ed Cooper, extension wildlife specialist.

The first application of fertilizer should be made immediately, he says. Since the pond is usually deficient in the same nutrients as is the soil over which the water flows into the pond or tank, Cooper suggests the use of the same commercial mixture as is used for crops on the farm. An initial application of 100 pounds for each surface acre of water is suggested. This amount should cause a change in the color of the water. This is due to the development of a great amount of plankton which is used for food and organisms upon which the fish feed. Bloom is another term used to describe the water in a properly fertilized pond.

Cooper advises periodic checks of the pond to determine when additional fertilizer applications are needed. He says to submerge the arm into the water to elbow depth and if the thumb can be plainly seen, more fertilizer should be applied. Only the amount required to get the desired bloom should be applied and this may be about half of the first application.

Pond fertilization should be stopped during the hot summer months. The fertilizer can cause a shortage of oxygen in the water, especially during the period when the wind is not strong enough to cause wave action. Fish will die when their oxygen supply is depleted.

Finally, Cooper emphasizes that all of the fertilizer to be used during the year should not be applied at one time. Start now and make enough applications to maintain the desired bloom. The shading from the bloom will also control submerged mosses and make fishing and swimming in the pond more enjoyable.

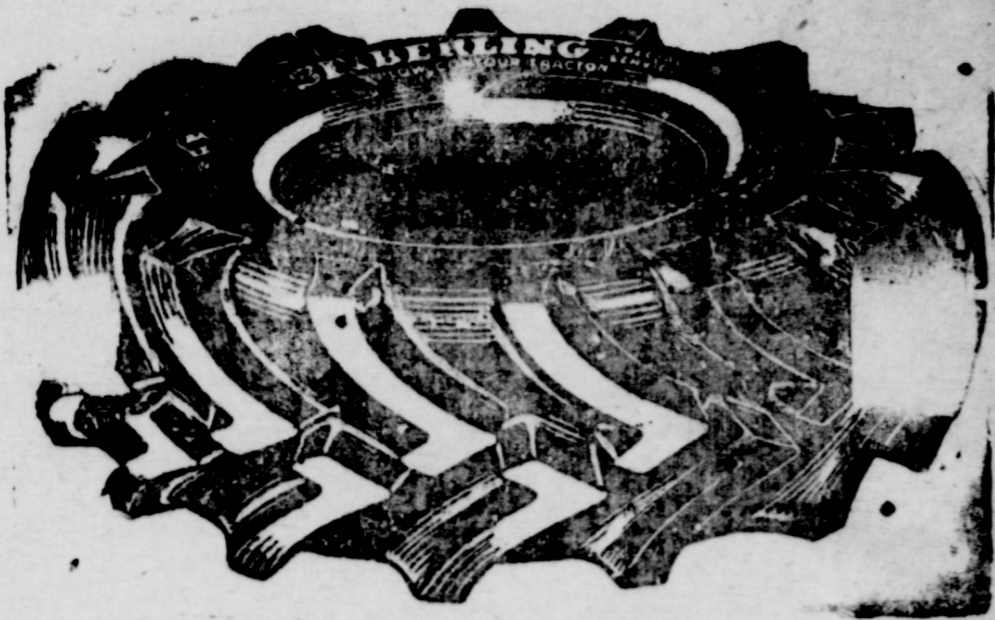

FLOOD PREVENTION PROGRAM DISCUSSED AT EASTLAND MEET

W. H. Heizer, Soil Conservation Service, Dublin, Tex., met with the Eastland Chamber of Commerce on February 20, and discussed the flood prevention program as provided by Public Law 566. Mr. Heizer is in charge of the technical assistance given by the Soil Conservation Service on the Greens Creek Pilot Watershed.

He stated that all floodwater retarding structures, numbering thirteen, had been completed and had functioned very nicely during heavy rains. On April 30, 1956, an eleven inch rain fell in the watershed on the heels of showers a few days earlier making a total, in excess, of 14". No flooding was experienced due to these structures combined with a good soil and water conservation program on the farms and ranches of the watershed. He further stated that Greens Creek had been flowing practically clear water since these earlier rains. The success of this project, Mr. Heizer says, is due to the full cooperation given by the local agencies and the many individual landowners.

There is a growing interest among many local people for a similar program on the south and North Forks of the Leon River, for this to be possible the combined efforts of businessmen and landowners will be necessary.

The extremes of weather seems to continue over the state. The drought which began in October 1950 over much of the state and extended through February 1957 was really something to talk about. Covering a period of approximately 77 months, it was the most severe drought in the state's recorded history. The drought broke in February 1957 and Eastland recorded an all time record rainfall for the year 1957. Thus far, the year 1958 has started out as a wet one. Farmers and ranchers alike are in good spirits and look forward to what appears to be the best Agricultural year since 1949.

Some landowners of the district plan to build terrace systems, diversion terraces, waterways, etc. but have been temporarily held up due to wet grounds. Soil conservation technicians have recently run terraces for the following landowners: D. G. Fambrough, East-

land, 2,000 feet; Roy Adams, Cisco, 11,000 ft.; W. D. Gattis, Scranton, 13,500 ft.; H. C. Pounds, Eastland, 11,000 ft. and J. O. Jones, Eastland, recently completed 4115 ft. Also, 10,560 feet of terraces were completed by Doyle Johnson, Desdemonia. The following men have requested terraces on their croplands: U. E. Brown, H. J. Hamilton and Frank Ziehr of Cisco and H. A. Tyrone of Carbon.

Diversion terraces have been requested and run for W. D. Gattis, Doyle Johnson, D. H. Harbin, Roy Adams, N. E. Richardson and J. O. Jones.

Ten landowners have recently requested farm ponds on their range lands for livestock water and better distribution of grazing. Of the above request, W. H. Cooper, George Waters and Fred Burfiend have already completed ponds on their places.

Huge Sum Spent On Road Work In Eastland County

According to records made available by Gordon Smith, Eastland County resident highway engineer, a total of \$11,804,312.37 has been spent on construction and maintenance of highways in Eastland County since 1917.

A break down shows that \$8,544,308.89 has been spent on construction and \$3,260,003.98 on maintenance. Of the money spent on construction, the state paid the biggest share, \$4,958,779.10. The Federal government is next with expenditure of \$2,757,544.60. The county has spent \$811,568.39 and railroad and other participation has amounted to \$16,416.30.

Regular maintenance expense during the period is listed at \$1,972,139.04 and special expenditures are listed at \$1,287,864.94.
