Eastland County Represented At Turkey Meeting

Turkey growers from every corner of the nation including Eastland County — nearly 4,000 of them — demonstrated a faith in the future of their industry by holding one of the most successful conventions in their 19 years of experience at St. Louis recently.

Attending the convention from Eastland County were Mr. and Mrs. Don Kincaid, Robert and Alvin Kincaid and Mr. and Mrs. Hardy Tidwell.

While official attendance figures are still to be tallied, Federation officials placed it as "close to 4,000" — one of the best attended meetings in NTF history. But the success of the St. Louis conclave was hard to write into the record books, for it could only be measured in enthusiasm, and a determination to build a more prosperous future for the industry.

One of the major developments that took shape and form was the turkey industry's long-range plan to double and re-double its efforts to make turkey meat a staple on U. S. dinner tables all year 'round. To achieve that end, Federation officials mapped and endorsed a long-range program of marketing and stabilization, expanded research and product promotion.

The convention officially got underway with a luncheon to raise \$175,000 for turkey promotion in 1958. From then until the final banquet every moment was crammed with activity.

The banquet provided the grand finale for the three-day conclave. There the retiring president, Trevor L. Jones, Havana, Ill., officially turned over his gavel to the incoming chief, Peter Crafts, Grasmere, N.H.

M. C. Small, executive secretary of the Federation, had high praise for the Missouri industry committee that were host to growers from the rest of the country — and played a major role in the successful arrangement and operation of many convention activities.

The National Turkey Federation, established in 1939, is the spokesman for the nation's \$350,000,000-a-year turkey industry. Through it some 10,000 turkey growers are able to make a united effort to build an expanding future for their industry.

Start the new year right — eat a good breakfast every morning. Two out of three Americans eat too little breakfast. How about you? A good breakfast can prevent that empty, shaky feeling that often hits around 11 a. m. when breakfast has been inadequate. A good breakfast pattern goes something like this: fruit, cereal, eggs, toast and beverage. Vary the basic pattern by the kind of fruit, cereal or bread you use and by the way you prepare the eggs.

One of the benefits of serving fruit first is that the acid taste of fruit starts the saliva flowing, thus helping to create an appetite for breakfast. The pulp of fruit as well as the minerals are useful for their laxative effects. Although most fruits are acid, they don't have an acid effect on the body. Instead they help to counteract the acids of the body. Many fruits, especially citrus fruits, also provide much needed vitamin C.

If you plan breakfast around a cereal, be sure to include milk, meat or eggs, too, in order to get the most from the incomplete protein of the cereal. Animal foods contain complete protein.

Keep the menu simple and easy to prepare. Allow time for all family members to eat leisurely and enjoy the meal. An attractive centerpiece and colorful mats or dishes will spark appetites, and add interest to this important meal.

What's the status of health in your family? Could it be improved in 1958? Here is a check that is certain to add to better family health.

Here are the seven important factors; good nutrition, sanitation, regular health examinations, immunization, exercise, rest and recreation, an adequate home health center, and a means of achieving the status of radiant health which is the result of complete physical, social and mental well-being.

An accepted guide for good nutrition is the Texas Food Standard. Mrs. Johnson points out that family attitudes toward food and the enjoyment of meal time are just as important as the kind and amount of food eaten. Sanitation includes a healthful water supply, safe sewage and garbage disposal, cleanliness around the barn and home, as well as clean milk free from bacteria.

Mary McMeekin's Savory Rice and Sardine Loaf Combines Deep Sea Goodness and Satisfying Rice

MARVELOUS flavor, delightful appearance, and very few ingredients to assemble make this rice loaf the perfect main dish. The garnish of egg slices and delicate sardines dress it to hold the spotlight until eaters experience the enticing taste treats of this especially good main dish. The cheese sauce lifts this inexpensive, "prize in eating" to an all time high for flavorful eating.

INGREDIENTS:
 3 cups cooked rice
 1/4 cup milk
 1/4 cup grated American cheese
 3 1/2 ounce cans sardines, packed in mustard sauce
 2 hard cooked eggs, sliced (for garnish)

INGREDIENTS FOR CHEESE SAUCE:
 4 tablespoons butter or margarine
 4 tablespoons flour
 1 teaspoon salt
 1/4 teaspoon pepper
 3 cups milk
 1/4 cup grated cheese

PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE: To make 3 liberal cups of fluffy rice; put 1 cup uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt in a two-quart saucepan and cover with a tight-fitting lid. Bring to a vigorous boil and then turn the heat as low as possible — leave over this low heat for 14 minutes. Turn off the heat. This cooking time results in firm grains of cooked rice. For extra tender grains, allow the rice to steam — with the heat off — for an additional 5 minutes before removing the lid. * Never remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. After rice is cooked, remove lid, lift gently with fork to allow rice to steam dry to the desired consistency.

It is then ready — perfectly cooked — with all the grains separate and fluffy. This method allows all the water to be absorbed and the full nutritional value of the rice to be retained.

METHOD: Thoroughly grease a 9 1/2" x 5 1/2" x 3 1/2" oven-proof loaf pan with a thick coating of melted butter or margarine. Mix the rice, milk and cheese. Place 1/2 of this rice mixture in the bottom of the pan and firmly press with a spoon. Lay 1/2 of the sardines on top of the rice layer. Add 1/2 of the rice mixture. Top with the second 1/2 of the sardines. Press the last of the rice over the sardines. Reserve the last 1/2 of the sardines to garnish the loaf.

Place the loaf pan in a 350° F. oven and bake 20 minutes. To unmold, run a knife around the edge of the pan to loosen the loaf. Place a platter over the pan. Invert the platter and pan together. Gently lift loaf pan up from the platter.

Serve with the cheese sauce which may be placed in an individual serving dish or may be served over the loaf. Garnish by arranging egg slices and the last 1/2 of the sardines over the top of the loaf and on the platter around the loaf. This recipe makes 7 servings.

METHOD FOR MAKING CHEESE SAUCE:
 Over a low heat, melt butter, stir in flour and blend thoroughly. Allow to cook 4 or 5 minutes, stirring constantly to prevent browning. Add salt and pepper. Gradually add milk. Continue stirring and cook until mixture thickens. Add cheese and continue stirring until cheese has melted.

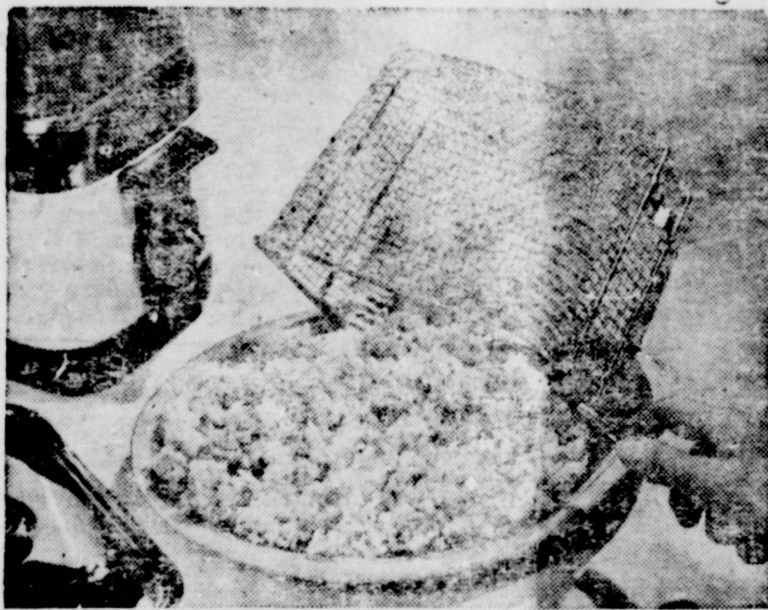

INGREDIENTS:
 Cooked cooked rice

METHOD: If you don't have cooked rice in your refrigerator ready to use, put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt into a two-quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil. Turn heat as low as possible. Cover saucepan with lid and leave over this low

heat for 14 minutes. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. Turn off heat, remove lid, and allow steam to escape as the rice cools.

Heat frying fat or oil in a deep kettle, saucepan or in an electric or gas deep fat fryer. Place 2 serving spoons of cooked rice (more if large container is used) in a fine mesh basket, kitchen strainer or sieve. Fry in deep fat (375° F.) until a light brown, about 2 1/2 minutes. Remove from deep fat and drain fried rice on absorbent paper.

The rice must be fried in a basket of FINE MESH. An inexpensive kitchen strainer or sieve of fine mesh is ideal. The handle may be bent to allow the strainer to be easily lowered into the deep fat.

Fried Rice is delicious as a party-snack food. It is something entirely new and different served with chow mein, chop suey, creamed meats, vegetables, meat sauces or gravy. It stays crunchy crisp even when covered with gravy. A new kind of candy is made by dipping clusters of fried rice into or pouring melted dipping chocolate over the fried rice. A fried rice brittle is made by pouring the syrup used for making peanut brittle over the fried rice and allowing the hot syrup to cool.

Q. — My wife and I are Korean veterans attending school under the GI Bill. We have a small child. May each of us claim our child as a dependent for GI allowance purposes?

A. — Yes. You may claim both your wife and child as dependents. She may claim the child alone.

Q. — I have a chance to get a better job with a better future in another city. If I change jobs and sell my GI house, could I get my GI loan rights restored so I could buy another home?

A. — Yes, it is possible to get your GI loan rights restored under your circumstances. A voluntary change of employment for a better job may be considered a valid reason for restoration. VA also must be relieved of liability on the old guaranty.

Q. — I understand there's a limit on VA outpatient dental treatment. I have a dental condition that is service-connected and rated at 30 per cent. Will I be limited in my dental treatment?

A. — No. Since you are receiving compensation for your dental condition, you may apply for dental treatment at any time and receive as many treatments as are necessary for your condition.

Q. — I am a 35-year-old World War II veteran getting a pension for a total and permanent non-service-connected disability. Must I wait until I reach age 65 before my monthly payments will be raised from \$66.15 to \$78.75?

A. — No. Your monthly payments will be increased to \$78.75 after you have been on the VA pension rolls for 10 years.

Q. — I have a 100 percent disability rating from VA. Does this mean I could receive VA outpatient treatment for any ailment I might have?

A. — No. You may receive outpatient care only for the disability or disabilities which have been adjudged service-connected. Your notification from VA lists those specific conditions.

Q. — I am considering paying GI insurance premiums once a year in advance. What if I were to die shortly after making my yearly advance payment? Would that money be lost?

A. — No. VA would refund to your beneficiaries any money which hasn't been applied to premium payments actually due.

Questions & Answers

Q — I am a World War II veteran and I live in a house I bought with a GI loan. If I were forced to dispose of it after July 25, 1958, for some compelling reason such as health or job transfer, could I get my GI entitlement reinstated?

A — Yes, so long as VA would be relieved of its guaranty liability. You then would be eligible for another GI loan until January 31, 1965, even though the World War II GI loan deadline would have passed.

Q — I am the father of a deceased World War II veteran, receiving monthly payments under the Survivors Benefits law. In computing my annual income to determine whether I will remain eligible for the payments, do I include just my net take-home pay or my gross wages including various deductions? I have a small part-time job.

A — You must include your gross salary, including money deducted for such items as taxes and retirement.
