Good Profit Is Earned By Board

The Veterans' Land Board has now purchased \$114,425,000 worth of bonds available to it, Land Commissioner Earl Rudder said this week.

Payments from veterans participating in the program are used to buy more land.

Eventually, a \$25,000,000 "profit" will be realized from the first \$100,000,000 in the program, Commissioner Rudder said. This money will be put in a fund which the State Legislature controls.

The land commissioner also noted that the bond market continues to block the sale of some part of the second \$100,000,000 worth of bonds in the program.

No more than three per cent interest may be paid to purchasers of these securities. Bonds on the market are now selling at an average interest of 3.43 per cent.

Overseas Jobs Are Offered To School Teachers

Headquarters of the U. S. Air Force has announced the need for school teachers for its overseas schools for dependent children during the 1958-59 school year. Countries available in the program include: Azores, England, France, Germany, Iceland, Japan, Morocco, Newfoundland, Philippines, Spain and Tripoli.

To be accepted for consideration a candidate must possess at the time of the interview the following general and special requirements: A Bachelor of Arts degree with eighteen semester hours in education courses; two years public school teaching experience; must be currently teaching and possess a teacher's certificate. Age requirements are 23-40 for women and 23-50 for men.

The approximate salary is \$377. Transportation by air is furnished to and from the overseas post of duty, plus free living quarters. For further information inquiries should be addressed to the Overseas Placement Officer, Civilian Personnel Office, Kelly Air Force Base, Texas.

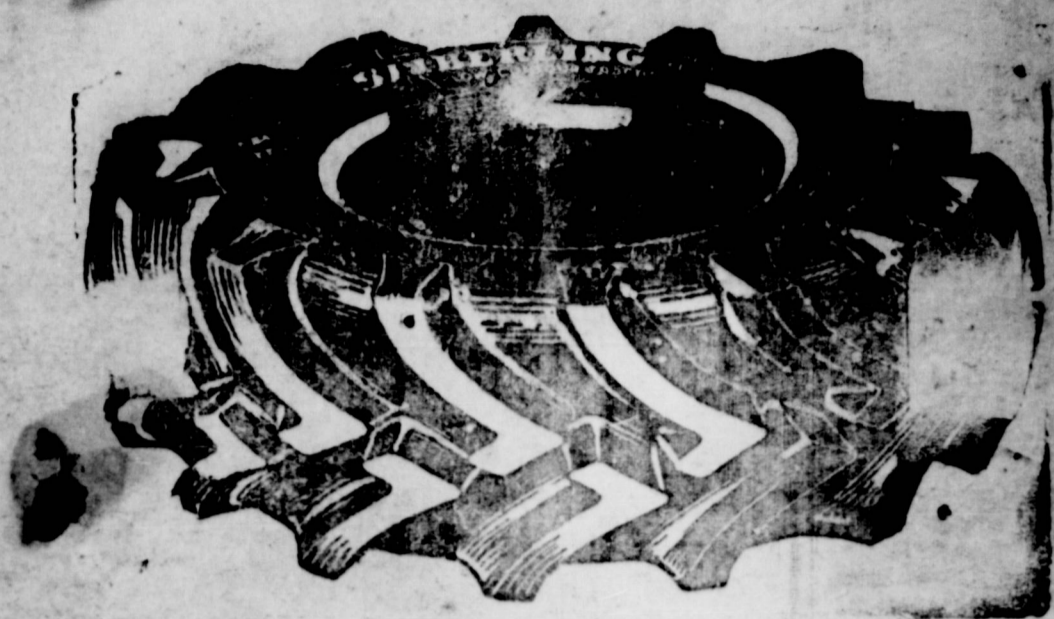
