### H. E. Wilson Rites, World War 1 Vet Held In Eastland

Hubert Cecil Wilson was born April 13, 1896, near Carbon and departed this life September 30, 1957, at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Houston at the age of 61 years, five months and 17 days.

When he was a young man he accepted Christ as his Savior and Lord and united with the Methodist Church at Flatwoods. At the time of his death he was a member of the Fairmont Methodist Church of Abilene.

On August 26, 1917, he married Lu Priscilla Henson, and enlisted in the United States Army on October 8, 1917.

Four children were born to this union, Claxton E., minister of the Cedar Bayou Church of Christ, Bayton; Mrs. Lubert Brewer of Dallas; Alton H., minister of music and education director of the Second Baptist Church of Pasadena, and Mrs. Naomi Harris of Lubbock.

He was a kind and devoted husband and father. Patient in suffering he left a glowing testimony of readiness to meet his Lord. He was appreciative of the many cards and deeds of kindness by loved ones and friends, also the constant attention of his devoted wife during the many months of illness.

Other survivors included four brothers, Henry of Eastland, Ollie of Cisco, Fred of Coleman, and Sherman of Clute; two sisters, Mrs. Zettie Taylor and Mrs. Bertha Lenz, both of Cisco, and many other relatives and friends.

An important Soil Conservation District Supervisor election has been reset for Monday, October 14, at Rising Star. The election will take place at 7:30 p. m. in the Rising Star Agriculture Building on North Main Street. Refreshments will be served after the election is completed.

The election will be for Supervisor of Subdivision 4 of the Upper Leon Soil Conservation District. All farmers and ranchers in this subdivision are encouraged to attend this event and vote.

Subdivision 4 of the District includes that portion of Eastland County lying south and west of the MKT railroad. This railroad goes from Gorman to Carbon to Cisco and then on to the County line toward Moran. All landowners (agricultural) south of Gorman, Carbon, and Cisco and all landowners in Eastland County in the vicinity of Rising Star, Pioneer, Sabanno, Nimrod, Romney, Long Branch and Scranton are eligible to vote in this election.

Bernol Hickman, Rising Star rancher, is currently serving as supervisor from Subdivision 4. The district set October 14 as election date after failure to hold the election on October 1.

"This is an important election to the farmers of our District. The voter turn-out on October 1 was so light that we decided to set another date in the hopes of having a good cross section of the man said.

We will attempt to contact every eligible voter and urge him to attend the meeting and vote for the farmer or rancher who he thinks will best serve his interests with the Board of Supervisors of the Upper Leon SCD," Hickman stated.

Hickman, who has served on the board of supervisors for the past four years, is presently the board chairman. He believes that the job of the board is becoming more important and that the supervisors are deserving of full support from the farmers they represent.

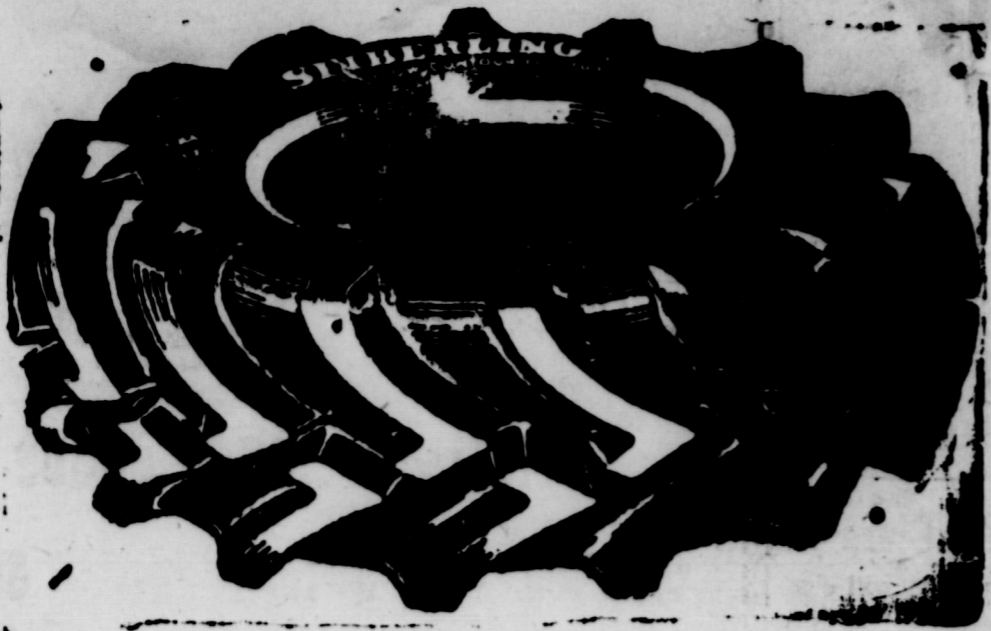

### Oct. 20 Deadline For Egg Licenses Under New Law

The deadline for obtaining licenses under the new Texas egg law by dealers, retailers, wholesalers, brokers and processors is October 20. There is no fee to any retailer, as defined by the law — that is any person selling or offering for sale eggs to consumers only in this state.

Grocerymen have been advised to write to the Texas Commissioner of Agriculture, Austin, for the license.

The Texas Egg Law, which became effective on Aug. 22, may have been "just what the doctor ordered" to assure Texas consumers that high quality eggs are being placed on the market for sale, it was reported.

This law provides primarily for inspection and careful labeling of all eggs that are to be sold on grade. The eggs are inspected primarily at retail outlets and if sold on grade are labeled according to size and quality. Ungraded eggs must be so labeled.

It shall also be unlawful to sell or advertise shell eggs below the quality of Grade A as "fresh," "selected," "cage," "infertile," "new-laid," or other words of
