At the annual reorganization meeting of the Board of Regents of Ranger College held recently, Joe Nuessle was named chairman of the Board, F. P. Brashier, Jr., vice-chairman and Joe Dennis secretary-treasurer.

At the same time a motion was made and seconded and was unanimously carried to drop the word "Junior" from Ranger Junior College and make the name from here on out officially, Ranger College.

Other members of the Board of Regents are A. W. Warford, Carl Page, Dave Pickrell, Alvis Wood and Morris Newnhart.

Asked why the name "Junior" was dropped from the school's official title, Dr. Price Ashton, president, said all other "Junior" colleges had done the same thing. "Actually," he said, "in order to be Junior you have to be a junior to something and we are not a Junior to anybody. We are a fully accredited two year college."

The college is making preparations to begin its 32nd Year September 9, which promises to be one of the best in history. The school is looking forward to bigger growth each year for many years to come as the school population throughout the state grows and as more students are turning to the two-year colleges for their required work.

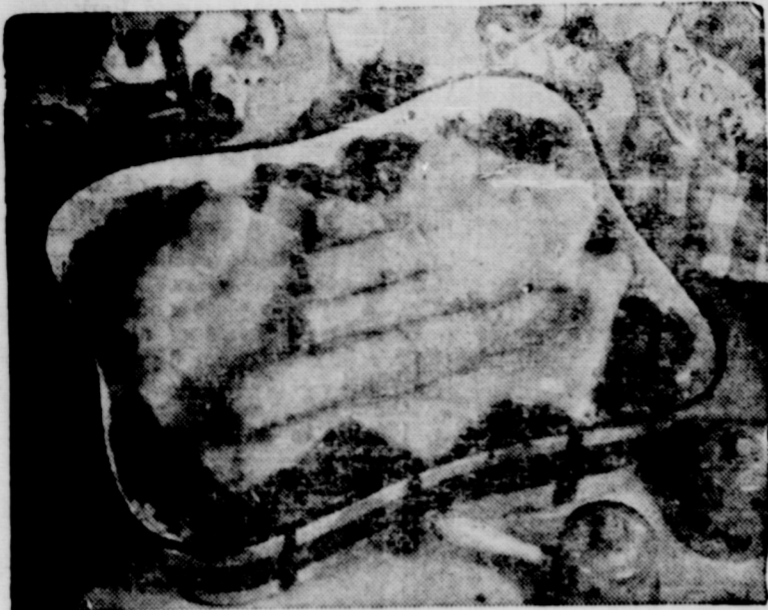

Sombrero Tamales— Quick and Flavorful Oven Dish

Really fine eating, partner, is this wonderfully delicious casserole of satisfying food which all the "cow punchers" in your family will praise and praise.

This quick oven dish is put together in a matter of minutes. It is almost an "out-of-the-can affair" because the rice cooks while you get out the cheese, the tamales and chili con carne and light the oven. This "savior favorite" from the southwest is different enough to make a big hit with company, too, and you'll find you won't need to "lasso" any compliments for it.

INGREDIENTS:

- 1— 15 ounce can or jar of tamales and sauce
- 3 cups cooked rice
- 1— 15 1/2 ounce can chili con carne with beans
- 3/4 cup water
- 3/4 lb. American cheese, sliced

PREPARING THE PLUFFY WHITE RICE: To make 3 heaping cups of white, fluffy, perfectly cooked rice:

1. Put 1 cup uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt into a 2-quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil.
2. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover the saucepan with a lid. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking.
3. Leave saucepan over this low heat for 14 minutes. Remove from the heat. The rice is now ready to use.

For extra fluffy, tender, separate grains allow the rice to steam for an additional 10 minutes— with heat off, but without removing lid.

For extra convenience and economy of time and effort, cook 2 cups of rice, 4 cups of water and 2 teaspoons of salt— keeping the extra cups of unused ready-cooked rice in the refrigerator in a covered container.

METHOD: Place the tamales and sauce in the bottom of a greased 2-quart baking dish. Top with the cooked rice. Pour the chili con carne over the rice.

Add the water. Place the cheese slices over the top of the chili con carne. Place in a 350°F. oven for 30 minutes or until the cheese has melted and the tamales, rice and chili con carne mixture is heated through.

If desired, save out three of the tamales and arrange them on the top of the cheese in the shape of a sombrero. Do this about 10 minutes before the cooking time is over in order that these tamales may become hot.

This recipe makes 8 servings.

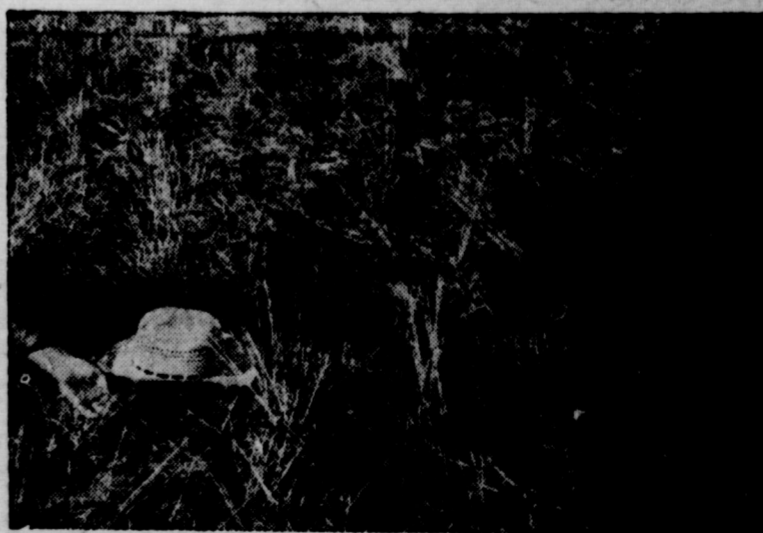

NUMBER ONE ON THE BALLOT

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 5, 1957.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 37 proposing an amendment to Subsection (a) of Section 62, Article XVI of the Constitution of Texas, relating to establishment of a retirement, disability and death compensation fund for officers and employees of the State.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Subsection (a) of Section 62, Article XVI of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended so as to read hereafter as follows:

"Section 62. (a) The Legislature shall have the authority to levy taxes to provide a State Retirement, Disability and Death Compensation Fund for the officers and employees of the State, and may make such reasonable inclusions, exclusions, or classifications of officers and employees of this State as it deems advisable. The Legislature may also include officers and employees of judicial districts of the State who are or have been compensated in whole or in part directly or indirectly by the State, and may make such other reasonable inclusions, exclusions, or classifications of officers and employees of judicial districts of this State as it deems advisable. Persons participating in a retirement system created pursuant to Section 1a of Article V of this Constitution shall not be eligible to participate in the Fund authorized in this Subsection, and persons participating in a retirement system created pursuant to Section 48-a of Article III of this Constitution shall not be eligible to participate in the Fund authorized in this Subsection except as permitted by Section 63 of Article XVI of this Constitution. Provided, however, any officer or employee of a county as provided for in Article XVI, Section 62, Subsection (b) of this Constitution, shall not be eligible to participate in the Fund authorized in this Subsection, except as otherwise provided herein. The amount contributed by the State to such Fund shall equal the amount paid for the same purpose from the income of each such person, and shall not exceed at any time five per centum (5%) of the compensation paid to each such person by the State.

"All funds provided from the compensation of such person by the State of Texas for such Retirement, Disability and Death Compensation Fund, as are received by the Treasury of the State of Texas, shall be invested in bonds of the United States, or in bonds issued by any agency of the United States Government, the payment of the principal of and interest on which is guaranteed by the United States; or in such other securities as are now or hereafter may be permitted by law as investments for the Permanent University Fund or for the Permanent School Fund of this State, under the same limitations and restrictions imposed by the Constitution for investment of those funds and subject to such regulations as the Legislature may provide. However, a sufficient amount of said Fund shall be kept on hand to meet the immediate payment of the amount likely to become due each year out of said Fund, such amount of funds to be kept on hand to be determined by the agency which may be provided by law to administer said Fund.

"Should the Legislature enact enabling laws in anticipation of the adoption of this Amendment, such legislation shall not be invalid by reason of its anticipatory character."

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this State at a special election to be held throughout the State on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1957, at which election all ballots shall have printed thereon the following:

"FOR the Constitutional Amendment amending Subsection (a) of Section 62, Article XVI of the State Constitution, relating to establishment of a retirement, disability and death compensation fund for officers and employees of the State."

"AGAINST the Constitutional Amendment amending Subsection (a) of Section 62, Article XVI of the State Constitution, relating to establishment of a retirement, disability and death compensation fund for officers and employees of the State."

Sec. 3. The Governor of the State of Texas is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for said special election and this Amendment shall be published and the election held as required by the Constitution and laws of this State.

Household Maids Must Pay Social Security Taxes

Maids and other household workers working here in private homes and earning as much as \$50 in cash wages in a calendar quarter were reminded today that they are protected by social security.

According to R. R. Tuley, Jr., Social Security Administration district manager in Abilene and A. E. Fogle, Jr., administrative office, Abilene district revenue service, housewives employing such workers earning the \$50 minimum figure are required to withhold 2 1/4 per cent as social security tax. The employer then matches this amount and forwards the total to his director of Internal Revenue using the greatly simplified Form 942. Previous to January 1957 the tax was two per cent.

"Revenue's easy-to-use Form 942 must be filed with us within one month after the end of a calendar quarter. For example, April 30 is the final date to pay tax for the January-March quarter," Fogle said.

Tuley of Social Security explained that "women household employees can now choose to retire any time after reaching age 62. Like other insured women workers, their old-age benefit payments will be permanently reduced if they elect to apply for them before reaching age 65.

"Household employees," he explained, "include maids, cooks, waiters, butlers, housekeepers, governesses, valets, baby sitters, janitors, laundresses, furnace men, gardeners, and chauffeurs of private cars."
