CONSERVATION IS NECESSITY FOR AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION

"Efficient conservation of our land is necessary if we are to have continuous abundant agricultural production," according to a statement by E. E. McAlister of the Upper Leon Soil Conservation District. He pointed out that only productive land will keep the people on family size farms.

One big factor in conservation is intelligent and efficient land and water management, McAlister, stated. This may mean terracing the soil to conserve rainfall, proper use of native grasses, or a crop improving crop to the crop rotation, according to the soil conservation authority. He cited other ways of land and wa-

ter management as leaving crop residues at the soil's surface to lessen crusting, increase water intake, and lessen moisture evaporation and seeding a cover of permanent grass so that the land may be used for grazing.

Conservation programs that are efficient must be applied over a period of several years, it was pointed out. Such programs must have a plan showing what needs to be done on each field and pasture. Technical assistance in farm planning and conservation may be obtained from local Soil Conservation Service technicians, as well as cost sharing for many conservation practices.

Camp Billy Gibbons Is Ready For Boy Scouts This Summer

Boy Scouts and Explorers throughout the eight-county Comanche Trail Council will camp at Camp Billy Gibbons this summer.

Camp Billy Gibbons will begin its twenty-sixth season June 3 and continue for three weeks, closing June 23. The permanent camp is on Brady Creek in San Saba County, 14 miles south of Richland Springs. Scouts and Explorers will camp under the direction of their Scoutmasters and Advisors on a Troop and Post Basis. Each camping period will accommodate about 200 campers.

The program includes swimming, life saving, canoeing, boating, fishing, hiking, horseback riding, marksmanship, archery, Indian Lore, Scout crafts, nature and campfire activities. Each period begins with the noon meal on Monday and closes following the noon meal and court of honor on Sunday.

"We expect to have a capacity camp each period. Reservations are being made through Scoutmasters at the Scout Office and we are counting on another wonderful season of camping for boys," according to Lowell Poyce of Brownwood, Camping Activities Chairman.

ARCHIVES OF LAND OFFICE OVER TEN MILLION DOCUMENTS

AUSTIN — Ten million documents.

There are that many individual records in the archives of the General Land Office, explains David Reeves, whose job is the care and preservation of those records.

"The history of Texas is the story of her land," Reeves says, "and that fascinating story is told in detail by documents in Land Office archives."

Nearly eight million individual documents in the Land Office have historical significance, Reeves points out.

"For example, we have the muster rolls of the Army of the Republic of Texas and original titles to almost every tract of land in the State, including about 5000 granted by Spain and Mexico," Reeves said.

The Land Office even has one document that is dated in 1745, the Land Office records custodian points out.

Also in the archives are original maps of the 38 old land districts of the Republic of Texas and original county maps, including some done by O'Henry when he worked as a draftsman at the Land Office about 1890.

The Land Office also has an original working copy of the Texas Constitution and some papers signed by Nathaniel Hawthorne, celebrated American author, while he was on consular duty in Liverpool, England.

"While all of these documents are available to students of Texas history," Reeves says, "they also serve a more practical purpose, being used daily in administration of Land Office duties."

**VA Offices Gives
Information On
War Orphans Act**

Information concerning the War Orphans Assistance Act of 1956 has been released by the Veterans Administration Regional Office in Dallas. This act provides funds for the education or vocational training of the children of deceased war veterans (men or women) who were killed in service, or who were not dis-

honorably discharged from service and who died later of disabilities incurred in or aggravated by wartime military service.

Children of such veterans are eligible, after leaving or graduating from high school, after age 16 but generally between the ages of 18 and 22, for a maximum of 36 months' schooling with an allowance of \$110 per month, according to the information.

Summer Classes To Begin At Cisco Junior College June 4

County Farmers Are Constructing Terraces, Ponds

Wet weather has interrupted the construction of ponds and terraces in this area but work has been resumed in many places, it was reported today by E. E. McAlister of the Upper Leon Soil Conservation District. Ponds are being constructed by Owen Hamilton of Ranger, B. H. Courtney, northwest of Eastland, and Raymond Penn, south of Cisco.

Terracing projects in progress are by J. H. Taylor of Cisco and W. I. Brooks, south of Nimrod. Other farmers plan to begin terracing after small grain is harvested.

McAlister reported that now is a good time to plan Blue Panic and weeping love grasses. Several farmers are now planting and have good prospects for their crops, he stated. Grass planted before the recent rains is showing good emergence, McAlister added.

The first summer session will end on July 12, with registration for the second session on July 15. Classes in the second session will begin on July 16 and end August 23. Tuition in the summer semester is eight dollars per semester hour, Mr. Mince stated.

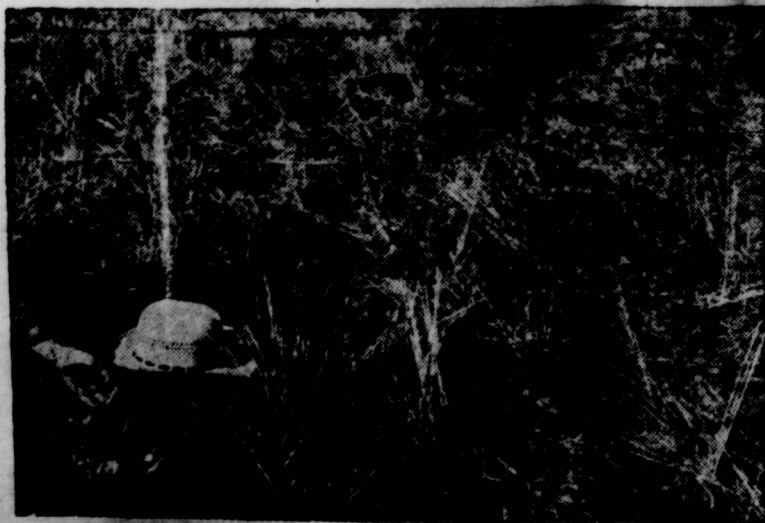
