E. W. [Bubba] Everett Killed On Vietnam Duty

Word was received in Olden Friday that Navyman Everett White (Bubba) Everett, 22, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jim Everett of Olden was killed in action Tuesday in Vietnam.

Navy personnel who were in Olden to inform the Everetts of their son's death stated that it would be approximately ten days to two weeks before the body could be returned for burial.

Young Everett is the second Eastland Countian to be killed in the Vietnam conflict. Sgt. Don Tyrone was killed about two years ago.

A 1963 graduate of Olden High School, Everett had attained his junior year at East

Texas State University at Commerce before enlisting in the Navy about two years ago, and had been in Vietnam less than two months at the time of his death.

His father, a longtime Olden businessman and Eastland store clerk, is presently employed by Southern Airways at Mineral Wells, and Mrs. Everett is a postal clerk at the post office in Olden.

Other survivors in addition to the parents are an older brother, Jimmy, a student at the University of Texas Medical School at Galveston; his grandmother, Mrs. Myrtle Everett of Olden; and his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Wade White of Carbon.

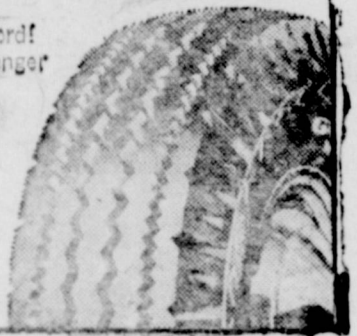
