Private Higgins Completes Course In Fort Gordon, Ga.

Fort Gordon, Ga. (AHTNC) — Pvt. Robert A. Higgins, son of Mr. and Mrs. Albert J. Higgins of Route 1, Carbon, was graduated March 29 from the lineman's course at the Army's Southwestern Signal School, Fort Gordon, Ga.

The eight-week course trained Higgins to construct and maintain both open and lead covered field communication wires and cables.

Aid Is Available For Dependents Of Servicemen

The Eastland County Chapter of the American Red Cross, with offices located on the third floor of the courthouse, has now received additional information for dependents of active servicemen regarding the dependents' medical care act. This act was signed into law by President Eisenhower last June 7 and provided for a six months delay in effecting the program.

At present, all state hospital associations and societies have accepted participation in the program. However, individual hospitals and physicians have the right to accept or reject such participation. Medical care and hospitalization is now available in Eastland County under this act.

The Red Cross is now in a position to answer such questions as: Who is eligible for care from civilian sources? How to apply for care from civilian sources? What amount of charges are to be paid by dependents? What types of care will be provided dependents from civilian sources? What type of identification is necessary to secure medical and hospital care from local sources?

Generally speaking, care authorized by civilian physicians and hospitals is limited only to wives and children of members of the uniformed services who are on active duty. This includes unmarried legitimate children who are under 21, or over 21 if born prior to when he became incompetent or physically incapacitated and incapable of self support, or under 23, if enrolled in a full-time study in an institution of higher learning.

Hospitalization is authorized for acute medical and surgical conditions, contagious diseases, and obstetrical and maternity care. It is also authorized for any acute emergency that is a threat to the life, health or well-being of the patient.

To families of servicemen who must live on a Class Q allotment the dependents' medical care law will prove a great financial help.

Windbreak Tree Planting Program Open To Farmers

COLLEGE STATION, March 26. — West Texas landowners can get assistance in planting windbreak trees through the Conservation Reserve portion of the Soil Bank Act, according to Don Young, head, Forest Management Department of the Texas Forest Service. The deadline for entering for contracts for the Conservation Reserve in 1957 is April 15.

"Acreage removed from production of soil bank base crops can be planted to windbreak trees and landowners can receive \$8 to \$13 per acre in annual rental payments for the 10 year length of contract," Young said. In addition, the federal government will pay up to 80 per cent of the cost of purchasing and planting the trees.

"In the West Texas region, such tree species as Austrian pine, Chinese elm, honey locust, and red cedar, to name a few, may be planted," Young stated.

3,191 Qualify As Voters In County

Eligible voters in Eastland County total over 3,191 for the special United States Senate election to be held on April 2, it was announced recently by J. C. Allison, county tax assessor-collector. Records show that 3,122 poll taxes were sold in the county and 69 exemptions were issued. The number of eligible voters is about 400 above the normal for an odd-election year in Eastland County, Allison stated. The number is generally very low on years when no regular national elections are being held. The increase this year is probably due to the special Senate election, according to Allison.
