Crawford Murder Trial Jury Hung

The murder trial of George Crawford, Eastland Negro, ended Saturday afternoon with a "hung jury" after deliberations lasting more than one day; seconding to a report here. Crawford was tried in the 91st District Court in Eastland on a charge of murdering his wife, Lilly Pearl, last September 19.

Auto Inspection Stations Report Col. Homer Garrison, Jr., di-


