AUSTIN, Aug. 16 .- Pledging the complete cooperation of the State government of Texas in the United States government's cam paign to lower the high cost of living, Governor Hobby this afternoon telegraphed President Wison, tendering the use of all the State Department needed to assist the government's work.

Mr. Hobby also wired United States Attorney General Pal-

mer offering aid and asking for federal investigation in Texas.

DETROIT-Butter and eggs valued at more than four hundred thousand dollars were seized by federal agents here today. It is alleged that the eggs and butter have been stored since April 1st.
