History Of The 1938 Study Club

Cisco Area Clubs Win Honors At County HD Achievement Day

Accidents Show Decline During October In Area

A reduction in traffic accidents was recorded in October, as compared with October 1955," said Captain G. L. Morahan today, after tallying the record for the Abilene Highway Patrol District.

Five people died in the 13-County District in October, 1956, as compared to 14 who died in October, 1955, and 101 accidents occurred in October, 1956, as compared to 136 in October, 1955.

Motorists died in Callahan, Haskell, Shackelford, and Taylor Counties in October, 1956.

Captain Morahan cautioned that the next two months of 1956 will probably be the most hazardous, due to weather conditions, more night driving, and the holidays in November and December.

To date through October the district total for 1956 shows that 54 people have died in traffic accidents - as compared with 70 the first 10 months of 1955 - but

Special Election Costly To County

The special constitutional amendment election held last Tuesday, November 13, cost the taxpayers of Eastland county a little over \$1 a vote, it was reported Monday. In Eastland County 809 votes were cast in the election, with the costs of holding the voting totalling \$908. The amendment was not voted on in the general election because of a mistake by the legislature in setting the date of the election. The Cisco West Side box reported 150 votes cast with a cost of \$35.00, while Pleasant Hill only reported five votes with a total cost of \$26.75.

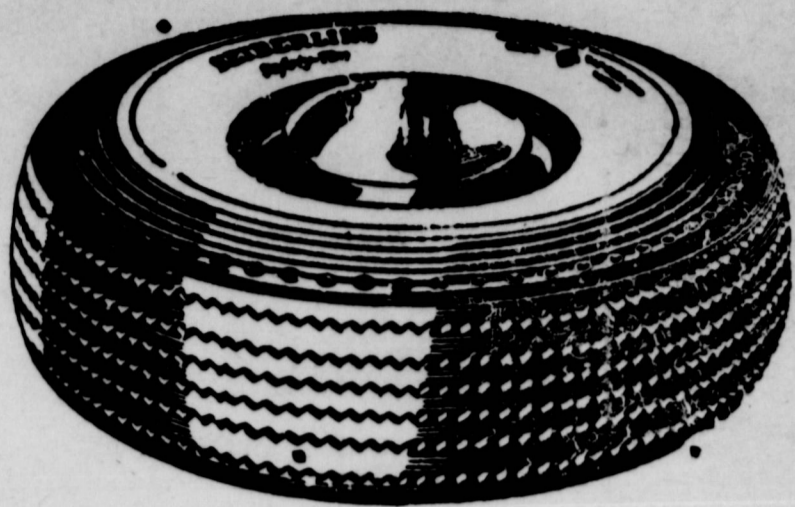

Civil Service To Hold Job Exams

The U. S. Civil Service Commission has announced examinations for Educational Therapist and Manual Arts Therapist for filling positions paying from \$3,670 to \$5,440 a year in Veterans Administration hospitals throughout the United States.

Optional fields for Educational Therapist include academic, commercial, fine arts, science, and general. For Manual Arts Therapist, the optional fields are metalworking, woodwork-

ing, electricity, graphic or applied arts, agriculture, hospital industry, and general.

No written test is required. To qualify, applicants must have had appropriate education and experience. For positions paying \$3,670 and \$4,525, college study alone may be qualifying.

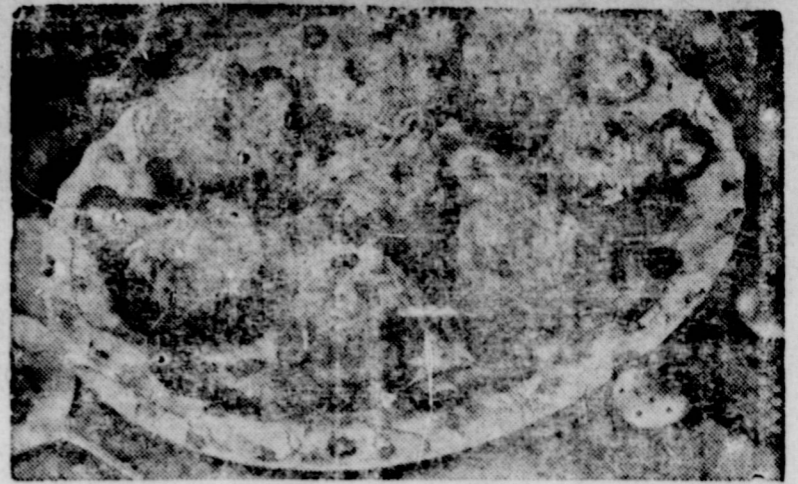

Curried Rice and Tuna Make a Tasty and Thrifty Filling for Luscious Tomatoes

Rice brings together the deep sea goodness of tuna fish and the Oriental excitement of curry in this versatile main dish. The curry powder contributes exotic flavor and intriguing color en-hanced by the bits of green pep-per and the brilliant red of the tomatoes. Served piping hot from the oven or cold and refreshing on a bed of greens, this "something special" for the family is also some-thing quick and easy for Mom to fix.

- INGREDIENTS:**
6 medium sized ripe tomatoes
4 tablespoons minced onion
2 tablespoons minced green pepper
4 tablespoons butter or margarine
1 7-ounce can tuna fish
2 cups cooked rice
1 teaspoon curry powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1/2 cup water

PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE: To make 3 lib-eral cups of fluffy rice, put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt into a 2 quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover saucepan with a lid and leave over this

low heat for 14 minutes. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. Turn off the heat. Use exact measurements of un-cooked rice and water. Time the cooking accurately. For real convenience and econ-omy of time and effort, keep un-used rice in the refrigerator in a covered container at all times. Use it for many quick, delicious and inexpensive soups, salads, casserole dishes, hot breads and desserts.

METHOD: Peel tomatoes easily by scalding, plunging into cold water and then peeling. Slice off stem end of tomatoes. Carefully scoop out pulp. Cook onion and green pepper in the butter or margarine until tender. Add the tuna fish, rice, curry powder, salt, pepper and water. Mix thoroughly. Fill the tomatoes with the tuna and rice mixture and bake at 350° F. about 15 minutes or until the tomatoes are tender. Serve hot. Garnish with green pepper rings if de-sired.

For a cool and refreshing salad, chill the tomatoes after they are stuffed and serve on salad greens. This recipe makes 8 servings or 2 cups of the curried tuna and rice mixture.
