



CENSORING PRAYER

The country has learned all the details of an incident occurring a few days ago in the National House of Representatives. But in order to refresh the memory of Bulletin readers, it is recounted that the blind chaplain of the House, who has held his position for a long period of years, was severely censured by the Republican Speaker, when he inclined in his daily invocation a plea for Divine blessing on the League of Nations. 

Hammond, Ind., Sept. 10.—Five trikers were killed and fifteen vounded yesterday in a battle beween 1.000 former employees of e Standard Steel Car company


