Weeds are already a problem around the home and farm this spring. The good supply of moisture in the soil is causing more weeds and causing the weeds to grow faster than usual.

Even though we have chemicals to control most weeds there is no easy way to control weeds. There is no miracle chemical that will kill all undesirable weeds and grasses

than three inches. If taller, they should be mowed closely and the chemical applied after three to four days regrowth.

A weed killer containing 24-D is most commonly used to kill broad leaf weeds. It is very effective, but the user must be very cautious since the chemical will also damage flowers and other ornamen tals. A wax bar containing 24-D may be used to kill broadleaf weeds in the lawn. This is much safer since there is no danger of the chemical drifting to the trees and ornamentals. The wax bar is simply dragged over the weeds.

Laws Regarding Homes for Child Care Explained

Persons who regularly keep o th er people's children for hire are reminded of existing laws regarding licensing by Area Supervisor Leo Thames of Eastland, of the State Department of Public Welfare. Mr. Thames, who may be contacted at 629-1530, has issued the following statement: "Every community is concerned about the children in its midst, especially so when some tragedy happens to a child, either due to accident or to the failure of the adult, on whom he depends, to protect him.

"The parents who m work or who, for other rea cannot care for their children at home, need to be sure that their children are receiving the kind of care which offers a safe, whole some and growing experience away from home. The responsibility is great when one considers the number of hours in a day that the child is away from his home and parents. Licensing of homes, day care centers, convalescent and institutions for child care is the result of community concern for the child away from his home. It provides protection to the people who


to communities, and foremost. to the children. The Texas licensing law places the responsibility for obtaining a li-cense on the individual who plans to care for a child or children. The State Department of Public Welfare is responsible for setting up minimum standards of care to be met to qualify for a license and to give the licensing service. There is no charge for the license or for the service. "The licensing service includes helping applicants to meet minimum standards in such areas as staffing the program, behavior problems in children, activities and equipment suitable to different age levels and interests of children, health' and nutritional protection and financial management and administration of the total program. The specialized services of other agencies such as Health De-pariments, fire departments, and specialists in child development are included in the licensing study. Offering counsel in these areas is a continuing responsibility of the licensing service. Once a program of child care is licensed, a revalidation study is made annually to determine if minimum standards are being maintained. The license is in effect until the person goes out of business or the license is suspended or revoked because minimum standards are not maintained.

of ammonium nitrate fertilizer. Dissolve one pound of ammonium nitrate per gallon of water. Allow the solution to settle a few minutes and strain it, if-it is to be applied with a sprayer. Apply the solution broadcast with a sprinkler can or sprayer at the rate of four gallons per 1,000 square feet. The solution is very corrosive and sprayers or prinkler cans used to apply it should be rinsed thoroughly.

Dry ammonium nitrate may also be used, although it is not as effective because coverage is not as good. The lawn should be mowed three to four days before treatment. Wet the plants thoroughly and apply 10 to 12 pounds of

ammonium nitrate per 1,000 square feet while the leaves are wet. The fertilizer will help the grass in your lawn at the same time. For this reason spot treatment should be avoided since the nitrogen will cause green spots that are difficult to eliminate,

Spring And Tarnadoes

Spring brings with it the threat of tornadoes, and we are again turning our attention to these destructive and sometimes deadly storms. To know what to do when a tornado is approaching may mean the difference between life and death.

Here are six "Safety Rules" you should remember about tornadoes!

1. If you are near a tornado cellar: When time permits, go to a tornado cellar, cave or underground excavation which should have an air outlet to help equalize the air pressure. It should be kept fit for use, free from water, gas or debris; and preferably equipped with pick and shovel. 2. If you are in open country: Move at a right angles to the tornado's path. Tornadoes usually move ahead at about 25 to 40 miles per hour. If there is not time to escape lie flat in the nearest depression such as a ditch or rav-

ine.

inside shelter, prefer ably in a strongly reinforced building. STAY AWAY FROM WINDOWS! In homes: The corner of the basement toward the tornado usually offers greatest safety, particularly in frame houses.

4. If in schools: In city areas: If school building is of strongly reinforced construction, stay inside, away from windows, remain near an inside wall on the lower floors when possible. In rural schools that do not have strongly reinforced construction, remove children and teachers to a ravine or ditch if storm shelter is not available. 5. If in factories and indus-

trial plants: On receiving a tornado warning, a lookout should be posted to keep safety officials advised of the tornado's approach. Adv a n ce preparation should be made for moving workers to sec. tions of the plant offering the greatest protection.

6. Keep calm. It will not help to get excited. People have been killed by running out into the streets and by

twrning back into the path of the tornado. Even though a warning is issued, chances of a tornado striking one's home or location are very slight. Tornado's cover such a small zone, that relatively only a few places in a warned area are directly affected. You should know about tornadoes though, "just in case."
