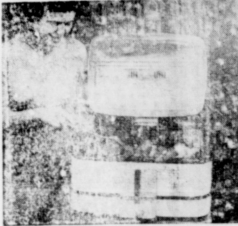

Electric Roaster Is Kitchen Handyman

A large chicken, vegetables and dessert may be cooked at once in a roaster. The lid of this model has a glass panel in the top. When roaster is being filled lid may be hooked into handle at end to be out of way.



Whether it's hot dogs, steaks or chops, they can be broiled to a turn in a roaster with a broiler attachment. Lid of this roaster has sliding-cover vents to control the air circulation for broiling fowls, roast and broiling other meats.

AN ELECTRIC roaster is a "little range" in itself, according to the Rural Home Builder of nationally-circulated Country's Farmer. In it, with the use of attachments, food may be steamed, roasted, baked, pan-broiled, boiled or fried.

"A whole meal may be prepared in a roaster," he writes in the magazine read by 1,500,000 farm families. "This might include a roast, vegetables and a hot dessert. Cakes, pies, rolls and bread may be baked the same as in a range oven. Or a large quantity of food such as baked beans to be served to a group may be prepared at one time. It is also useful for cooking when using the stilling-water bath method."

"Since the roaster may be used on any ordinary electric outlet, but not with drop cords and extension cords, it is convenient to use in any home supplied with electricity. For the woman who generally cooks with coal or wood it is especially handy in summertime."

Sound construction is as important in the roaster as in a range. A strong body, heatproof handles, perfect-fitting joints, heavy plating and enameling, all indicate good construction. Insulation on sides and at bottom should be thick enough to retain heat as well as to protect surface on which roaster is placed. A thermostatic control on a roaster makes it possible to hold temperature at point desired. A timer clock to start and stop cooking is an additional feature with some models.

IMPROVED UNIFORM INTERNATIONAL SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

THE GOD SHEPHERD

LESSON TEXT—John 10:1-18. MEMORY SELECTION—I am the good shepherd; the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep—(John 10:11).

An open door! How inviting! Jesus had just been going to the man once blind (John 9) who had seen the temple door closed against him. It shut him out from all the sacred traditions of his people, but it turned him to Jesus, who presents himself in our lesson as "the door of the sheep."

I. The Door of the Sheep (vv. 7-10).

The preceding verses of chapter 10 are important, for they identify Jesus as the true Shepherd. He speaks of his people as he turned him to Jesus, who presents himself in our lesson as "the door of the sheep."

Flocks were sometimes kept in the field at night, as was the case on the night when Jesus was born in Bethlehem. But ordinarily they were brought into a sheepfold, where many flocks gathered for protection. A shepherd was on guard at the door. This was a high post, the wall to steal sheep, but the true shepherds, when they came in the morning to lead forth their flocks, entered by the door. They called out their own flock by name.

It is said that only sick sheep will follow a stranger, which may explain why so many false shepherds of our day appeal to the sick and lead them away from the God Shepherd.

Do you know his blessed voice? Have you responded to his call? Will you follow him? Decide now.

Consider the beautiful figure of the shepherd as the door of the sheepfold. When the sheep enter the fold to rest, he is the door. When they are ready to go out to feed in green pastures again, he is the door. Note that they go in and out. Belonging to Christ is not bondage. If any man enter in by Christ, the Door, he is free to go in and out, to find pasture, to live for and to serve him.

"The Door"—what a striking figure! It is a true entry, it is the only way in. Every door has two sides and the side we are on determines whether we are inside or outside—saved or lost. Children often sing:

"One Door and only one, And yet its sides are two— Inside and outside, On which side are you?"

Then repeating the two first lines comes the direct testimony and question:

"I am on the inside; On which side are you?"

II. The Keeper of the Sheep (vv. 11-13).

We think of sheep as peacefully grazing on the hillside—an idyllic picture in the summer sunshine. But there were dangers to meet. It was inside and outside. It was on which side are you?

There repeating the two first lines comes the direct testimony and question:

"I am on the inside; On which side are you?"

He laid down his life for the sheep. Ah, yes, it is all too true that evil men laid wicked hands on him and crucified him. Their guilt is awful. But it is clear from Scripture that until the hour had come for Jesus to be made sin for the redemption of man, they could not touch him (see Luke 4:29; 30; John 8:59).

When the time came, Christ laid down his life in accord with "the determination of our Father and Father of God" (Acts 2:23). He died for us, not as a martyr to a cause, or the victim of an accident or miscarriage of justice, but willingly, and for the glory of God.

Yes, he died for us, but he also died for every lost soul who will hear his voice. There are "other sheeps" about whom the Lord is deeply concerned. Are we?
