Taxpayers Of Co. May Save 2 Per Cent.

Since October 1, the date for the beginning of payment of 1946 taxes, Eastland County taxpayers have paid \$125,306.93 of their \$178,091.39 state and county tax bill, or 72.39 per cent, according to County Tax Assessor-Collector Neil Day. Those who paid their taxes during the month of October received a 3 per cent discount.

On the balance of \$47,784.46 of the 1946 taxes, if paid in November of this year, the taxpayer will receive a discount of 2 per cent, while those paid in December will receive a discount of 1 per cent.

County Tax Assessor-Collector Day urges the taxpayers of the county to take advantage of the 2 per cent discount by paying their taxes during this month.

S. S. Representative To Be In Eastland November 21

A representative of the Abilene Social Security Administration will be at the U. S. Employment Service office in Eastland on Thursday, November 21, at 1:00 p. m.

All persons wishing to file retirement or death claims under the Social Security Act should call to see the representative at that time. When a worker becomes 65 years of age he should contact the Social Security Administration and discuss his status. When a worker dies, some member of his family should get in touch with the Social Security Administration and find out what payments may be due.

It is particularly important that the survivors of all World War II veterans who died after discharge get in touch with the Social Security Administration as soon as possible. This should be done whether or not the veteran worked under Social Security and whether or not a claim was previously filed.

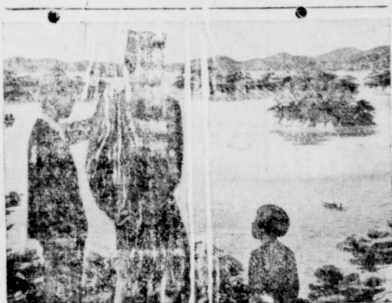

Crown Fruit Salad Is 'Fit for a King'

"Fit for a king" is what home makers say about crown shaped fruit salad, according to the Cooking editor of Capper's Food, a nationally-circulated farm magazine.

"Studded with jewel-colored pieces of fruit, it makes a lovely picture on your prettiest glass plate," she writes in the magazine read by 1,250,000 farm families. "Cool and tartly sweet it offers flavor contrast to the meat-and-potato



part of a meal. It's a delightful afternoon snack with a cup of hot coffee."

Crown Fruit Salad
1 cup, undavored light cream
1/2 cup, cold water
1/2 cup, fruit, sliced
1/2 cup, cranberry, sliced
1/2 cup, orange, sliced
1/2 cup, pineapple, sliced
1/2 cup, maraschino cherries

Soak gelatin in cold water. Heat fruit juice or juices to boiling; remove from heat and dissolve gelatin in hot juice. Cool. Add the light cream and mayonnaise and stir until mixture is smooth. Unfold on glass plate or platter. Arrange lettuce leaves around the edge of the salad. Garnish with clusters of grapes, halves of bananas or slices of canned fruit. Serves six. This molded fruit salad is lovely to serve at a buffet supper.
