## New Frazer Car To Be Displayed Next Saturday

The new Frazer automobile embodies 1947 styling and engineering features designed to provide utmost passenger safety as well as comfort and "roadability", will be on display for the first time at Chamberlain Motor Co. in Eastland next Saturday.

Among its safety features are wide, five-inch wheel rims which provide greater steering safety and stability on turns at high speeds. Increased visibility is provided by the two-piece 765-square-inch windshield, which is approximately 100 square inches larger than the windshield areas of competitive models. The pillar posts have been moved back, increasing the angle of the windshield and providing greater side vision for the driver.

Other interior appointments include a smartly designed instrument panel and attractive two-tone upholstery. Seat cushions are of air-foam rubber, providing unexcelled riding comfort and enabling the driver to maintain more perfect control at high speeds.

Test models of the Frazer have been on road and laboratory "break-downs" 24 hours a day for several months. Special tests included an extended trial run in the Great Smoky Mountains in Tennessee and North Carolina where hill climbing, braking, acceleration and other performance factors were checked under extremely rugged driving conditions.

The new civilian jeep and station wagon will be shown at the new location, formerly the Lamb Motor Company building.

## G. I. Bill To Terminate

Public Law 190, the famous GI Bill of Rights, which provides education, loans, and many other privileges to discharged veterans, terminates October 5th this year, M-Sgt. Ernest E. Elmore, Eastland U. S. Army Recruiting Sub-Station Commander, announced today. Men taken into the Army after October 5 will not receive full GI benefits extended to veterans of world War II; many thousands of whom will go to college and into business this year under one of the Bill's provisions.

Men enlisting in the Army on or before October 5 will still be entitled to full benefits of the bill, however, including a college education, on-the-job training, loans, reenlistment bonuses, free mail, and many other privileges.

The Army Recruiting Campaign which has enlisted nearly 1,000,000 men in the Regular Army, will be intensified during September in order to give men who desire to enlist or reenlist an opportunity to get the most out of their service.

Federal Building Program Halted

Three-Way Moratorium Is Ordered Until Spring By Director.

WASHINGTON. — The government's \$1,600,000,000 public works program has come to a virtual halt. Federal agencies, under presidential edict, have set about choosing \$700,000,000 worth of construction to defer at least until spring. Calling the step necessary to "comply with the President's anti-inflation budget," Reconversion Director John R. Steelman clamped on a three-way moratorium that: 1. Prevents any agency from letting contracts for any new construction during the next 56 days without his express permission. 2. Provides that either Civilian Production Administrator John D. Small or Housing Expediter Wilson W. Wyatt must recommend and the reconversion director approve, non-deferrable federal construction to be started between October 1, 1946, and April 1, 1947, and 3. Requires the agencies to put on the deferred list at least \$300,000,000 worth of construction of which may be eliminated entirely.

No Projects Selected. An official familiar with the moratorium plans said that the agencies for deferrable projects most likely would turn first to such military construction as warehouses and officers' clubs, some airports, and certain agricultural conservation and reclamation projects. Another predicted that careful study also would be given to flood control projects and to public highways. These officials emphasized, however, that no specific projects to be postponed have yet been chosen. They pointed out that agencies have more than three weeks to review their programs and submit revised estimates to Steelman. The reconversion director made it clear that the moratorium does not affect contracts already awarded or funds which have been committed for work scheduled to start before October 1.

Also exempted under the order are projects costing no more than \$3,000, and veterans housing and hospitals, overseas military projects, the Manhattan atomic energy project and construction of access roads to timber lands.

Asks State Co-operation. As an example of the drain the federal program might impose on supplies if it were carried out in full, a CPA official said it would take about 27 per cent of the entire supply of cement and about 10 per cent of the total lumber output. In calling for postponement or cancellation of projects, Steelman urged federal agencies making loans or grants to state and local groups "to seek their co-operation in postponing public works construction wherever this can be done without jeopardizing health, safety or essential services."

Among these federal agencies are the public roads administration, which makes dollar for dollar grants for public highways, and the civil aeronautics administration, which makes similar grants for airport construction. Whether these projects will be included among those affected must await agency reports due to go to Steelman by September 30.

Victim Says Improper

Care Curbs Leprosy War CARVILLE, LA. — The country's most widely publicized victim of leprosy, Mrs. Gertrude Hornbostel, declares public health authorities are hampering conquest of the disease by segregating its sufferers. The policy of segregation, she charges, tends to "keep alive the fear and horror" associated with the name of leprosy, and frightens many victims from submission to proper treatment. Her views are expressed in a signed article in the current issue of the Star, monthly magazine published by the patients of the U. S. Marine hospital here, where she is receiving treatment.

Masters of Jap Torture

Ships Are Under Arrest TOKYO.—Masters of two alleged Japanese torture ships and the former chief of staff of Japan's Formosan army have been arrested as war-crimes suspects. Allied headquarters reported. Charges against Lt. Gen. Keiichiro Higuchi, the former chief of staff, were not announced. Ship's captain held was Kozo Ozaki, master of the Nagano Maru on which 500 Allied military personnel reportedly were mistreated, and Ryotchi Tsubokura, master of the Buryo Maru, also allegedly a torture ship.

Germans Get Food Under New Setup

Match Parcel for Relative With One for Native.

NEW YORK. — Each food package sent through CARE (Co-Operative for American Remittances to Europe) from a person in this country to a specific friend or relative in Europe is matched by a similar CARE package for a person on a "general relief list in Germany," in accordance with agreements made by CARE and the British and American authorities in the occupied zones, it became known here.

"Many German-Americans have sent CARE food packages to their friends and relatives in Germany," said E. G. Burland, CARE's executive director of CARE at headquarters of the organization. "But the vast majority of the German people do not have such friends in this country." Under agreements made with Gen. Lucius D. Clay for the American zone and with Gen. F. A. Robertson for the British zone and the corresponding sector of Berlin, half of the CARE packages entering Germany must be deliverable to hungry families, selected by German welfare authorities on the basis of need.

"In practical operations, the agreement means that, for every CARE package ordered in America for delivery to a specific friend or relative, these must also be a CARE package ordered for general relief. The military authorities want this balance maintained in order to insure absolute fairness in the quantity of food available to all of Germany's hungry families."

Burland emphasized that this does not mean that an individual who sends a package to relatives in Germany is required also to purchase an equal amount for general relief. The "general relief" packages are paid for by agencies in this country, who send relief to Germany. He assured Americans of German descent that their individual gifts to friends or relatives will be delivered promptly.

Valuable Sea Turtle

Nearly Lands in Soup EASTON, MD. — Fishermen complained recently that something was getting their bait near the waterfront home of James N. Bennett, Easton. Mrs. Bennett and Mr. and Mrs. Richard Perklar of Pittsburgh decided to do something about it. They set out and after several hours of angling, hooked a large sea turtle. The 25-pound turtle was sent to a Washington restaurant for stew, but zoo officials learned that it was an unusual specimen of the chelonina family group. They sent around a zoo limousine, and the turtle has a new home.

Find Body of Mussolini

Hidden in Monastery MILAN, ITALY. — The body of Benito Mussolini, stolen April 22 from an unmarked grave in a potter's field here by, self-styled "Democratic Fascists," has been found in a trunk at a Pavia monastery. The police said two monks had been taken into custody in the investigation in addition to three laymen already held. The body was being guarded at a local police station pending the receipt of further instructions from Rome. The Milan newspaper Corriere Della Sera said the civil police chief had received instructions from the national capital to bury the body "in sacred ground and in a place unknown to the public." However, this report was not confirmed by official sources here. The body was found in the Carthusian monastery of Certosa at Pavia, where police said it had been taken from the Monastery of St. Angelo, its first hiding place after being exhumed at the potter's field.

U. S. Population Now in Excess of 141 Million

WASHINGTON.—The nation has now passed the 141,000,000 mark in population, official figures disclosed. The cross-over was effected during July, it was shown by the census estimate included in a treasury report on the amount of money in circulation at the start of the month. The report showed that although circulating money increased \$802,670 during July to a total of \$28,245,792, the even faster growth of population by 120,000 to a total of 141,104,000—reduced the average amount in circulation for each man, woman or child 17 cents to a total of \$200.17.

25-Pound Glove Worn by Ecuadorians During Game

The heaviest "glove" in the field of sports is worn by the Indians of Ecuador to play their game called pelota de guante in which two six-man teams bat an eight-pound solid rubber ball between them, says Collier's. In order to strike this heavy ball with enough force to send it down the 50-yard court, each player wears a round wooden paddle—studded with giant steel knobs—which is 18 inches in diameter and weighs approximately 25 pounds. 4. A furlough for men who re-enlist within 20 days. Full details of other furlough privileges can be obtained from Recruiting Officers.
5. Mastering-out pay (based upon length of service) to all men who are discharged to enlist or re-enlist.
6. Option to retire at half pay for the rest of your life after 20 years' service—increasing to three-quarters pay after 30 years' service. All previous active federal military service counts toward retirement.
7. Choice of branch of service and overseas transfer of those still open on 3-year enlistments.

### PUDDING ICE CREAM

1 cup undiluted gelatin  
1 cup milk  
1 cup vanilla pudding mix  
1/2 cup cream  
1/2 cup vanilla  
1/2 cup black walnuts

Soften gelatin in the 1/4 cup of milk. Add remaining milk to pudding mix; place over low heat and stir until it boils and thickens. Stir softened gelatin into pudding to dissolve it. Remove at once from heat. Add syrup, cream and vanilla. Pour into refrigerator trays, freeze until slightly firm. Then scrape from tray into bowl; beat with rotary beater till smooth but not melted. Stir in chopped nuts. Return to tray and freeze. Serves 6.

JESUS AND THE LAW OF LOVE

LESSON TEXT—Paul's 119:33-38; Matthew 5:43-48. MEMORY SELECTION—Love works out all its neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.—Romans 13:10.

Love fulfilled the law—in Christ. God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son (John 3:16). The law of love is therefore appropriate as the subject of our closing lesson on the general theme, "Jesus Interprets Old Testament Laws."

Love is the heavenly gift of God, who is love, to man who so much needs the grace and power for his own life and for his living with others.

I. The Mind of Love (Ps. 119:33-35). Eight times in this psalm there is found the cry of verse 33 for instruction in the laws of God. Man not only must know them, but he must know how they operate.

II. The Manner of Love (Ps. 119:36-38). Love operates not from necessity, but from a desire to please God.

Love has a technique, if you will, a manner of operation. It avoids certain things which would hinder or prevent its full function and seeks out those attitudes and experiences which will encourage and enlarge.

Love turns away from vanity. The vain things of this world are usually presented in such attractive dress that to look at them is to be tempted.

The positive side of the matter is also clear. The man's life is the love best expresses itself in the fear of God, in the established order of a life according to the law of God (v. 38). By being inclined to his testimonies it finds the right way—God's way (v. 37).

III. The Measure of Love (Matt. 5:43-48). How far does love go? Does it have a limit? Does it choose those toward whom it will express itself, loving the lovely and ignoring or hating the rest?

But an enemy—what can you gain from kindness to him? Hate him, and treat him like an enemy. Christianity knows nothing of such a spirit. Even though it be necessary to oppose wicked men in order to hinder their evil plans, we need not lose our love for them. Even those who desperately use us may be loved for Christ's sake.

"Consider him that endured such contradiction of sinners against himself (and went right on loving them) lest ye be wearied" in your own love for those who bear the sad name of enemies (see Heb. 12:3).

It is admittedly a high standard, but it is not too high for those who know the love of Christ.

AROUND THE HOUSE

If your window screens need a little mending to be practically perfect, place a piece of mosquito netting over the hole and coat with shellac. After that dries, give it another coat and perhaps a third.

To pick wild greens, use a large moisture-proof vegetable bag such as those used in the refrigerator to keep the greens fresh.

To prevent cake frosting from breaking when cut, beat a teaspoonful of vinegar into it when the flavoring is added.

Delicate fabrics, such as organza and fine voiles, can be restored to their original crispness with gelatin. To do this, dissolve a teaspoon of plain gelatin in a quart of boiling water. Strain the solution and use as you would boiled starch.

Get more servings from your meat roast by cooking slowly at a low temperature.

Add a little salt when cooking dried fruits and it will help bring out the fruit's natural sweetness.

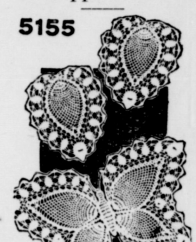
