## Karkalits Resigns As Tax Collector; Returns To Cisco

Clyde Karkalits, who received the Democratic nomination for county tax collector-assessor of Eastland county at the July 27 primary, has resigned that position, effective September 1 and will become financial secretary for the Cisco school board and Cisco Junior College. He will succeed the late Frank Walker, his brother-in-law.

This information came from Karkalits Tuesday afternoon. Born near Gorman and moving to Cisco with his parents in 1890, Mr. Karkalits was a popular resident of that city until he moved to Eastland to take employment with the county. He is now serving his third term as county tax collector-assessor. The county commissioner's court is expected to appoint some one to fill out Mr. Karkalits' present term, and the procedure, it is said, will then be for the Democratic county executive committee to select a name for the ballot at the general election in November.

Whether the wearer is a Junior miss or matron, she will find a net

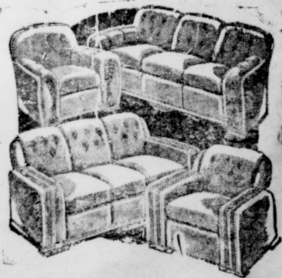
