Strikes Delay Wanted Goods

CPA Reports on Results of Soft Coal Walkout on Production.

WASHINGTON.—The soft coal strike and other work stoppages set back the output of automobiles and other consumer goods by at least three months, according to a Civilian Production Administrator Small.

Mr. Small also declared that the mine strike, settled a few days ago, was "extremely costly to the stabilization program." He said it had "delayed the time in a number of cases at which price ceilings can be safely removed."

Small estimated that the fossil strike alone had cost the country close to two billion dollars in lost production, "not counting the loss of wages to the million-odd workers" it made idle.

The American economy "will bear the scars of the coal strike for many months to come," the CPA chief predicted in his monthly report on production.

This gloomy note was in contrast to the rest of the report, which told record consumer goods production in April, before the full impact of the coal stoppage was felt.

Cites Purchasing Power.
Small said that for some products—among them tires, men's suits, electric irons, and vacuum cleaners—American industry surpassed peace time records in March or April.

And postwar peaks were reached, he reported, in production of automobiles, trucks, women's hosiery, refrigerators, stoves, radios and sewing machines.

Why are consumer goods still so hard to find despite the fact they are, as Small said, "being produced in greater quantity now than ever before in peace time?" His answer:

"The reason for the shortage of goods lies in the fortunate fact that consumers are in possession of large amounts of purchasing power and that they are determined to use that purchasing power for the immediate satisfaction of their pent-up wants."

Dollar wise, manufacturers' shipments in April were double the 1939 rate, Small said, while in terms of quantity they were at least 50 per cent greater.

Reporting that joblessness declined last month—again before the full impact of the coal strike—for the first time since Japan surrendered, Small said civilian employment rose to a record high of 54,600,000 persons early in April.

Noting that this is close to the 57 million mark "defined in some quarters as full employment," Small predicted the country is likely to face a severe labor shortage in the closing months of this year.

Takes Up Housing.
He said that retail sales in April and since the start of the year had soared in various lines from 30 to 125 per cent over levels for the same period in 1945.

As for housing, Small reported that residential construction increased 25 per cent from March to April.

Surveying some of the effects of the coal strike, Small said industries which are affected most include steel, railroads, utilities, chemicals, non-ferrous metals, automobiles, tires, farm machinery, and building materials.

"Important programs, such as the food program and the veterans' emergency housing program, received serious setbacks," Small declared.

"The production of critical building materials, such as brick, tile, gypsum, boiler heating equipment, and items made from iron castings, was checked by the lack of fuel."

"Perishable crops will be lost due to a shortage of both glass containers and tin cans. The loss of zinc and lead production, because of the power shortage which resulted from the coal strike, will affect a wide range of items from galvanized sheets and brass fittings to high test gasoline."

Steel production, Small reported, declined steadily to less than 50 per cent of capacity by the middle of May.

Skirts Will Be Short Throughout the Summer

WASHINGTON.—Women's style restrictions will continue unchanged through July, August and September, the civilian production administration announced in order to quash rumors that they would be lifted at midyear.

"In particular it should be clearly understood that the existing limitations on length and sweep of skirts and dresses will be maintained," said Herbert Rose.

Army Hangs On to Its G. I. Trucks

Equipment Veterans Wanted Is Not Forthcoming.

WASHINGTON.—Where are all the surplus G. I. cars and trucks that veterans want?

There are two slants to the question, plus considerable uncertainty over just how interested the veterans are in some of the equipment.

War department spokesmen explain the slow movement of automotive surplus to market this way: (a) The army is holding on to all vehicles deemed necessary to its needs until July 1, 1949—more than three years hence.

(b) The army isn't exactly sure how many cars it has.

The War Assets administration, which sells the vehicles, sizes up the situation as follows:

(a) The cars and trucks cannot be offered to veterans until the army declares them surplus. Many have not been so stocked.

(b) WAA hopes to get more soon, including big fleets from Texas, Texas, for example, where the army has 32,000 vehicles at its repair depot.

(c) WAA needs 70 days, on the average, to get a car ready for sale a veteran after it gets the vehicle from the army.

But oddly, veterans aren't buying some vehicles—notably the 2½-ton trucks reserved exclusively for them—in any great numbers.

Some of these trucks are getting begging for buyers.

Body of 'Stranger' at Rest After 30 Years

SAPULPA.—The body of an unidentified man finally has been buried after an undertaker apparently had waited 30 years for someone to claim it.

A Christian funeral service was conducted recently after the body had been discovered in an old funeral parlor which recently changed hands.

Harold Rammpp found the body after purchasing the late Bert Buffington's funeral parlor, which had been closed for several years.

No one in this city of 12,499 could give a clue as to the man's identity, Creek county Attorney G. B. Corryell found in his files the death record of an unidentified man who died, apparently of pneumonia, on a railroad right-of-way in 1916.

Rammpp said Buffington had been noted for his skillful embalming technique, which accounted for the "good condition" of the body. He said he believed Buffington had received legal permission to keep the body for study and to instruct student embalmers.

3,000 Miles of Trails Planned in California

SAN FRANCISCO.—Without dissent, the California legislature has authorized spending \$300,000 to start work on a 3,000-mile system of horseback and hiking trails extending in a huge loop from the Mexican border to Oregon and back, via the Sierra foothills and the shores of the Pacific.

The ambitious project will take some 10 years and \$2,000,000 to complete. It will lead riders through giant redwood forest, semi-desert and flowered plain, beside trout streams, over foothills of historic gold-rush days, along coastal ridges and sandy beaches.

But for all its modern wrinkles such as automatically closing gates to woo the goodwill of cattlemen and a system of rustic hostels every 20 to 30 miles, principal sponsors of the project contemplate the job with the leisurely air of sportsmen.

Operations for Stomach Removal Good 89 Times

BOSTON, MASS.—Dr. Frank H. Lahey, director of the Lahey clinic, recently reported 89 successful operations in which the patients' stomachs were removed completely.

Addressing the Massachusetts medical society, Dr. Lahey said the gastroscopies were done to remove cancerous or other growths.

One patient, whose stomach was removed eight years and seven months ago now is alive and well, Dr. Lahey added. He said a "substitute stomach" is provided for these patients through a loop in the intestines.

Dr. Lahey also advised people past middle-age who had indigestion that last year he advised them to submit to x-ray examinations because "they may be suffering from ulcers or cancer."

Short Existence

Although some May flies require three years to develop in the larval stage, they experience the shortest adult existence of any living creature. Upon emerging fully matured from the film encasing them, they mate, lay their eggs and usually die within 12 hours.

IF YOU need a fold-away serving table or if you like to load a tray and carry meals to some cool spot, here is the combination with the special features you have been looking for.

The folding stand is the right height to use with comfortable chairs and the plywood tray with a gallery around three sides and hand-hold openings, its security over this base. The construction of both is so strong that you will want to make a number of them.

Household Hints

When the edges joined in a seam rip on the bias, it is helpful to baste a piece of paper in with the two edges of fabric. After the seam is stitched tear away the paper. This little trick keeps the bias edges from stretching.

Use the cuffs from dad's worn-out shirts for making shoulder pads. They're firm and generally give you all the padding you need.

Here's a way to hang your crisp curtains so you won't have to use a double rod. Takes a little sewing on your part, but in the end none of the rod will show. Simply baste the top curtain to the lower one over the curtain's top rod of stitching. Run the curtain rod through the heading on the under curtain. Top one gathers with it.

In patching underwear, use small cross stitches around the edge of the patch, say the experts. This makes for elasticity.

On any small apron sew numerous pockets. Into these slip your toilet articles. Fold the apron and put it in your suitcase. Then when you need a freshening up, toilet articles are where you need them.

To remove scratches on woodwork and floors, rub with a little lard, then rub off with a clean cloth.

Coins Must Pass 8 Tests Through Vending Machines

Then comes misuse of electricity 10.28 per cent, followed by lightning, stove flues, petroleum products, etc. During the past 10 years fires have burned up three billion dollars worth of property in the United States, and the figures are increasing despite advanced methods of fire fighting and fire control. Now that we know what causes most destructive fires let each individual lend a hand in helping prevent them.

Education

There are many serious problems before our American democracy. The problems of education are of particular importance and should be of vital concern to every citizen and every home. I heartily favor Senate Bill 181, which provides for Federal Aid to schools, with such funds under state control.

The Veteran

To those boys who served in our armed forces, we owe a debt of gratitude we cannot repay, but we can meet their problems fairly and justly, endeavoring to compensate them for the time lost by their years in military service. I favor legislation to strengthen the GI Bill of Rights to give more efficient and greater assistance in providing homes and in making up lost educational opportunities. More flexible insurance benefits should be provided. Medical care should be extended and greatly improved.

Agriculture

Issues of far-reaching importance and concern to the farmer and stockman are pressing hard for solution. I am familiar with the problems which confront these industries, having lived for over 20 years on a West Texas farm. I recognize the need for better farm-to-market roads and the need for expansion of the rural electrification program.

I shall insist on Federal aid to assist the farmer and rancher in the eradication of poison weeds which have been so destructive to livestock, and for the eradication of certain weeds which threaten to possess our farmlands in many sections of the district.

Old Age Pensions

Experience is a good teacher. I say with no hesitancy that no candidate in this race for Congress has had more experience with old age groups than have I. I am serving my fourth year as a member of the board of directors of a home for the aged. Out of these years of service has come the conviction that we should stop thinking of an old age pension as a dole which we grant to the needy. I believe in an old age pension as a matter of right—as something we earn in our productive years by our contributions to the upbuilding of the community. I shall do my best to see that just principles are embodied in our pension laws. We have had far too much political hypocrisy in connection with this issue in recent years.
