Crippled Children Living in Palace

Prince Umberto Provides Home for Stricken.

ROME.—Thirty children—once healthy and normal, but today blind or crippled refugees from Cassino and other Italian towns where the Allies fought the Germans—have found a home in Rome's royal palace.

Boys and girls, 4 to 12 years old, some without legs or arms, others with faces marked by powder burns from mines and bombs...

More than a year ago the prince assigned the children a building facing the principal garden of the Quirinal.

The children are wards of the Italian Chapter of the Sovereign Order of Malta, organized in 1099 to take part in the Crusades.

Found by American, British and Brazilian soldiers in the battle area during the fighting for Central Italy, they were given first aid and hospitalization and later brought to Rome.

"The greatest difficulty," said Prince Umberto recently, "was to remove the traces of nervous shock from which they were suffering."

The prince described how the attentions and care of five Sisters of Charity, members of the blue-garbed order of hospital nurses, founded by St. Vincent de Paul, had helped the children.

Because of their frequent visits, the prince and his children are well known to most of the children.

When, during a recent visit, seven-year-old blind Vittorio called him over to show him a toy, the prince explained that Vittorio was in his mother's arms when a German bullet killed her, grazed the child's temple and cut an optic nerve.

Umberto picked up little Italo, aged 10, who lost not only his sight but also both arms below the elbow.

"While most of the children who have lost their sight are learning to read with their hands," the prince said, "Italo is doubly handicapped because he is unable to write."

Umberto said he was glad to see the children and to see that they were being cared for.

Uses Electronics. The machine cost \$400,000 and including all research and development work...

While Eniac does its figuring through the magic of modern electronics—actually counting on "electronic fingers"—it employs, basically, the principle of a primitive counting machine known since ancient times.

In effect, Eniac is an electronic big-brother of the "Abacus," an apparatus which utilizes bead-like counters strung on parallel rods or wires as a means of counting, still in use in the Orient.

Eniac begins computing when punched cards, containing holes corresponding to arithmetical numbers, are fed into the machine.

Inside the machine are thousands of tiny neon light bulbs—arranged in rows of 10, and as the problem is being worked, these lights flash on and off in the proper combinations. Answers come out on other punched cards.

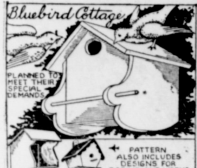
Accidental cuts in garments usually tear threads both ways and should be mended at once. Otherwise the cut will stretch and lose its shape making mending the more difficult.

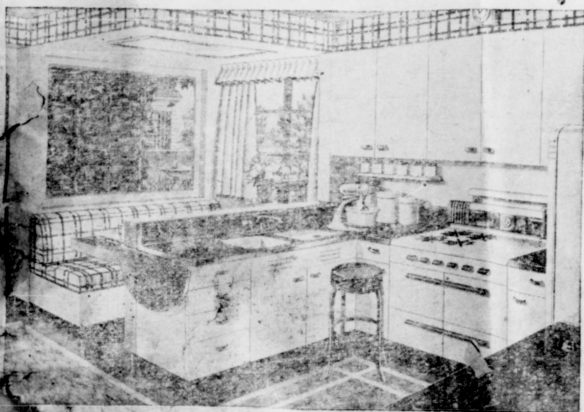

### New Columbia Sheep Made-to-Order Breed

#### Developed for Dual-Purpose Requirements

The need for a breed of sheep that would produce both wool and meat efficiently resulted in work being undertaken by the USDA about 1912 to find such a breed.

The result of years of extensive work was the introduction of the Columbia sheep, which combined the most desirable characteristics of the Lincoln and Rambouillet. The breed was more than a quarter of a century in being developed.

The breed has been developed to such a point that it has its own registry organization, the Columbia Sheep Breeders' association. It is primarily a range sheep but is being used to a moderate extent in farming areas.

Columbia sheep are free from wool-bledness and skinfolds. The body is long, but is symmetrically proportioned with a good balance between width and depth. In 12

months a typical Columbia ewe grows a fleece weighing about 12 pounds, which contains approximately 50 per cent clean wool about 3 1/2 inches long.

### New Corn Ear Recommended

WORTH on sweet corn and hybrid seed corn, as a substitute for pre-liquid.

The spray is a liquid solution of styrena dibromide and a mineral oil and is applied to the corn silks as soon as their ends appear brown. ### Feather Fabric Will Add to Farm Income

America's poultry industry can produce 35 million men's suits annually. A new feather fabric that looks like wool but is warmer, softer and lighter, has been developed by USDA specialists.

Feather protein is converted into fiber by treating the feathers with a reducing agent and a special type of wetting agent, or detergent, in salting spinning solution, or "dope."

It is not expected that feather fabrics, due to small volume availability, will prove a serious economic threat to cotton or wool, nevertheless feathers do offer an additional revenue for the poultryman, and will compete more with higher priced fabrics.

### IMPROVED UNIFORM INTERNATIONAL SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

#### TWO BROTHERS LEARN TOLERANCE

LESSON TEXT—Mark 3:14-17; Luke 9:46-50; 1 John 4:7, 8. GOLDEN TEXT—And this commandment have we from our Father, that he who loveth God love his brother also.—1 John 4:21.

Intolerance is soundly condemned in our day, and we agree that the spirit which hates or hinders a man because he is of a certain race or creed is definitely wrong. A word of caution is needed, however, lest we come to extend our tolerance to that which is sinful, wicked or destructive. One should never tolerate poison in a child's food, or in his textbooks. One does not tolerate a fire while it destroys one's house. Nor should one be tolerant of false teaching which breaks down faith in the Bible as the Word of God.

James and John were outstanding in their places of leadership for God.

#### I. God Wants Powerful Men (Mark 3:14-17).

There seems to be an impression current in some places that being a Christian is practically synonymous with being a weak, frightened, negative person without either personality or power.

The fact is that the gospel of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ rightly interpreted, and fully received into the heart and life of a man, brings such a tremendously enriching and transforming experience that it appeals to all, including the vital, dynamic type.

These two men were "the sons of thunder"; that is, they had that flashing alertness and power of personality which made them quick to detect and decisive in action. True, it showed itself in an impatience which was wrong and a desire to bring down judgment, when they should have been in a position, but that was not the con-

#### II. God Wants Dynamic Men

Power does not rest on a man's head, and he needs the assistance of God to keep strong men have intense loyalties and are not afraid to assert them, and are prone to condemn all who do not conform.

John was here exhibiting that dreadfully sectarian viewpoint which persists even in our day. To him it was not enough that a man was doing the Lord's work; he must also join their particular circle or quit. For him; but he wants them to be unpoised and balanced in their dealing with others, especially with the brethren.

#### III. God Wants Patient Men (Luke 9:51-56).

The friction between the Jews and the Samaritans dated from the time when the latter—a half-Gentile people—were denied the right to help in building the temple. That bitter strife, which showed up in such a discourteous act as to refuse a night's lodging to travelers because their destination was the hated city of Jerusalem.

Their offense viewed from another angle was far more than a bitter lack of courtesy, for they were turning from their door the Son of God, the Lord of glory.

Stubborn prejudice combined with spiritual ignorance to make this tense and explosive situation. The sons of thunder had an answer ready—let's blow them off the earth.

Simple, wasn't it? Yes, but neither right nor kind. These poor people should have drawn forth their compassion, not their hatred or a desire for revenge.

#### IV. God Wants Loving Men (1 John 4:7, 8).

Love is not merely something that God shows toward men or inspires in their hearts. God is love. Being God, he is love, and that love is not a passive quality but an active one. He loves.

Because he is love, those who profess to belong to him are also to love one another, to love a world lost in sin, yes, to love even the utterly unlovely.

Volumes have been written on this subject, but here we must be satisfied just to state the fact and to ask ourselves the direct question, Do I manifest the love of God in my life? Well, do you?
