Judge Blanton Enters Race For Congress

William W. Blanton, County Judge of Shackelford County, recently a staff sergeant in the Army, has announced his candidacy for Congress from the 17th District, subject to the Democratic primaries. His father, Thomas L. Blanton, represented this district in Congress for 20 years.

Judge Blanton lives in Albany, is married, and is 35 years old. He graduated at Princeton University with high honors in 1932, attended law school at the University of Texas, and practiced law in Albany.

He was elected County Judge of Shackelford County in 1940, and was reelected without opposition in 1942 but waived his Judge's exemption from the draft, and was inducted as a private, resigning his office.

Following basic training, he was transferred to the Central Postal Directory, Camp, the arm of G-2 which combats enemy espionage and sabotage. He served as an Agent in Florida, and later for 18 months as Special Agent in Burns and India.

He received his honorable discharge on November 11, 1945, as a staff sergeant with two battle stars. On his return to Albany, County Judge G. McKing resigned and Judge Blanton was appointed by the State Board of Commissioners.

In his present race for Congress he has taken a strong stand on unions. "There are going to be a lot of us G.I.'s in the next Congress," he said, "and there are going to be some changes made in this labor union situation." He believes that the Case Bill before Congress is inadequate because it does nothing to protect the rank and file of union members from the tyranny of the union leaders.

"As long as professional union officials can take a man's job away from him by taking away his union card, or can have him fined, abused or bent up, and as long as he is helpless before such oppression, they can control his speech, actions and vote, and can tax his pocketbook at will," Judge Blanton stated. "They can silence all organized opposition within the union and dispose of all trouble makers," he added. "So that a strike vote or any other vote within the union is only a deceptive farce, like a vote in Germany under Hitler." Judge Blanton expects opposition, perhaps camouflaged, from the Political Action Committee of the CIO. He will make a vigorous campaign.

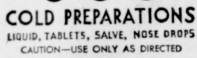

War Veterans Jam Colleges

Returning Servicemen Are Eager to Study; 600,000 Expected by Fall.

WASHINGTON. — The greatest educational jam in history is headed for the United States as hundreds of returning war veterans swamp colleges and universities with applications for enrollment, according to the Associated Press.

Already 125 thousand veterans, financed under the G. I. Bill of Rights, are in college classes and 207 thousand others have applied for entrance.

More than 600 thousand will be in colleges and universities by fall, is the prediction of Dr. Francis J. Brown, staff associate of the American council of education.

30 Per Cent are Married.

"This is creating a university crisis," said Dr. Brown. "Thirty per cent of veterans are married. Ten per cent have children. This is in sharp contrast to the situation before the war, when the great majority of students were single."

"The housing problem is the greatest problem at present, but we hope legislation pending in congress will be approved and will help the situation. It provides 167 million dollars for moving temporary war and defense housing to regions of greatest need."

Dr. Brown said "big name" universities, and those in large urban areas, were the first to be filled by returning G.I.s, who are entitled to \$50 a month if single and \$75 if married while enrolled in schools or in training programs.

Increase Allotments.

Congress has passed a bill to raise these allotments to \$65 and \$90. In addition to his subsistence allowance, the veteran is given his tuition and certain other expenses.

Such institutions as Harvard, Yale, Dartmouth and Brown are nearing the limit of their normal capacity, but if additional housing becomes available normal capacities can be increased substantially.

Yale joined with Columbia in letting them have no capacity limits where G.I.s are concerned.

While some of the smaller colleges have not been affected by the rush of students, and report sub-normal enrollment, all probably will be filled this fall, educators agreed.

They expect the previous record of American college enrollment of 1.4 million students in 1930-40 to be exceeded by at least 20 per cent.

At the veterans' administration it was reported 9,591 veterans are taking on-the-job training, under terms of the G. I. bill, in addition to those enrolled in school classes. The percentage of on-the-job trainees is expected to increase, a trend that followed the World War.

U. S. and Canada Join in Survey of Polar Lands

WASHINGTON.—Mindful of atomic age possibilities, the United States and Canada are beginning to work out joint plans to defend North America against any attack from Asia or Europe across the north polar regions.

Disclosing this, allied diplomatic officials said one of the first specific steps taken by this country was the assignment of six observers to accompany a Canadian scientific air force expedition on an 81-day arctic exploration.

Assigned the task of gathering military and scientific information, this expedition has been designated officially "Exercise Muskox" by the Canadian government. It will cover 2,100 miles through territory which heretofore has been considered an impenetrable barrier against attack.

Now diplomats say, the wasteland area is regarded as one of the potential approaches to some of America's greatest cities.

In two segments, the expedition is scheduled to start from Churchill, Manitoba, in mid-February, and from Edmonton, Alberta, in early May.

Own Gun Kills Motorist While Chasing His Tire

CHICAGO. — Edwin Cowan, 32, of 2157 W. 114th street, an estimating engineer, shot and killed himself recently while changing a tire on his automobile in front of 3420 S. State street.

Detective William Doyle of the Stanton avenue police said that apparently Cowan's 32 caliber pistol fell from his pocket and discharged as he was returning the wheel with the flat tire to the trunk compartment.

Cowan's wife, Patricia, 20, and a sister-in-law, Mrs. Bertha Cowan, were in the automobile at the time. He is survived also by a daughter, Patricia Ann, five months old.

Wonder Heart Drug Latest Big Find

Proves Highly Efficient in Experimental Stage.

SAN FRANCISCO. — A new synthetic drug which promises to become as useful in the treatment of heart diseases as penicillin and sulfa drugs are in their fields was described at the 16th annual symposium on heart disease in San Francisco.

The new drug, called dicumarol, was said to producing remarkable results in the treatment of coronary thrombosis, apoplexy, pulmonary embolism and phlebitis.

Written in the experimental stage, dicumarol must be administered only by specially trained practitioners, under careful supervision.

Dicumarol's existence was revealed by Col. Irving S. Wright of the army medical corps, clinical professor of medicine at Columbia university college of physicians and surgeons.

Development of the drug began more than 20 years ago, when two midwestern veterinarians went to Prof. Karl Paul Link, a biochemist of the University of Wisconsin, with the problem of why cows were bleeding to death.

Dr. Link learned the cows had fed on spoiled clover. Experimenting, he found that their blood would not clot or coagulate.

He further learned that one constituent of clover — "coumarin," found in all green plants—underwent a chemical change when clover spoiled becoming "dicoumarin."

He suggested that this substance acted on the clotting agent of blood to prevent coagulation.

When his suggestion was printed in a technical journal, medical researchers at the University of Wisconsin, the Mayo clinic and at the Columbia post-graduate school of medicine went to work.

Dicoumarin was isolated, synthesized and under the name "dicumarol," used clinically in all three institutions.

Wright said development of the substance marked a step in the effort to find a drug which will prevent blood-clotting, such as takes place in stroke, coronary thrombosis and other heart ailments.

Lower Food Prices in 1940, Official Predicts

NEW YORK.—Retail food prices may well drop 5 per cent below the 1945 average during the coming year, Paul S. Willis, president of the Grocery Manufacturers of America, said.

In a statement before a public hearing of the New York state joint legislative committee on nutrition, Willis said: "The over-all cost of food has increased 40 per cent since 1939. . . . mainly in such classifications as fresh fruits and vegetables, poultry, dairy products and sea foods."

Basing his predictions on government figures, he estimated that civilian food supplies would be sufficient in 1940 to feed each man, woman and child 11 per cent more food than in the five prewar years.

"Undoubtedly supplies of some foods will be short during the early part of the year, but by summer it is believed only sugar and some fats and oils will be in short supply to an appreciable degree," he added.

Indo-China Port Ravaged by Cholera Epidemic

HONG KONG. — An American medical team told of a cholera epidemic in Haiphong, Indo-China, where about a dozen United States transports are waiting to take 30,000 Chinese troops to north China.

Lt. Comdr. Elmer W. Rebbick, commanding a member of a medical evacuation group, said 50 cases were arriving daily at the hospital and that half were dying. Other officers said they saw wagons coursing the streets picking up dead.

The city of 65,000 is virtually without sanitary facilities and hospital accommodations were described as woefully inadequate.

Engineer Tells of New Plastic; It's Part Glass

CHICAGO. — A new kind of plastic, reinforced with glass and said to be strong enough for fabrication into parts large enough to make a railroad car top or the hull of a boat, was described recently at the 36th annual meeting of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers.

In a scientific paper prepared by the W. Collins, research director of the Owens Corning Fiberglas corporation, and Games Slayter, Fiberglas vice president, the war born product was said to possess greater strength than structural metals and to be immune to corrosion.

AROUND THE HOUSE

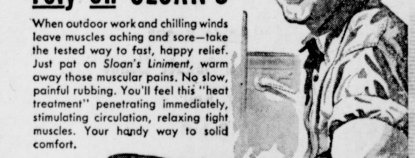

The picture of the shocked passengers on the deck of the Vestris, taken a few minutes before they were rescued from the sinking Atlantic liner in 1921, made at least \$9,000; snapshots of the Lindbergh plane, as it capsize and threw its occupants into the Yangtze river in 1931, sold outright for \$9,000.

A "bird's-eye view" of San Francisco, made shortly after its great fire in 1906 with a camera elevated 600 feet by kites, produced a profit of \$15,000.

EXALTING CHRIST IN THE LIFE OF THE NATION

LESSON TEXT: Isaiah 9:2, 3, 5, 7, Luke 1:26-33.

GOLDEN TEXT: For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given, and the government shall be upon His shoulder; and His name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, the Mighty God, the Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace—Isaiah 9:6.

Christmas is coming! It should be a blessed and delightful time this year. But do not fail to ask yourself, What is its true meaning? Why did Christ come? So that we could feast and celebrate? Surely not. He came first of all to be a Saviour; but do not forget that the Saviour is also the King of kings.

When Jesus came, His people Israel were practically without a government. They were a subject people under the rule of Rome. Their national life was in ruins; darkness had settled over their land, and there was both national and spiritual darkness. Christ came as their King, as well as the Light of the world.

I. Darkness—but the Light is Coming! (Isa. 9:2, 3).
When Jesus came there was deep darkness in Israel; there was no National honor and glory were at low ebb. Religious leaders had lost their spiritual vision and zeal. They were going through the form of godliness but denying its power. Read the book of Malachi for a picture of their desolation.

Then Jesus came, and the great Light of all time shone forth in the darkness. He was and is "the light of the world" (John 8:12). They that followed Him did not stumble in darkness (John 9:9, 11:9). How sad that they received Him not (John 1:11)! The reason? They loved darkness rather than light (John 3:19, 21).

II. Chaos—but a King Is Coming (Isa. 9:5, 7).
We have already suggested that Isaiah's prophecy came at a time of chaos in the affairs of the nation. Would they ever have the order and dignity of a nation again? Who was to be their King? What kind of leader would He be? Our verses give the answer.

Seven hundred years before Christ came, the prophet presented a glorious, detailed picture of the coming One. He was to be born as a Babe—a Son—but the "government shall be upon his shoulder."

What kind of King is He? His names reveal Him. "Wonderful"—that word has been so misused that it means comparatively little to us. It really fulfills its true meaning in Christ. He is unique, remarkable, yes, truly wonderful. "Counsellor"—in every detail of life great or small, an infallible Guide. "Mighty God"—not just like God, or representing God; Christ is God. "Everlasting Father"—the tender and loving, unchanging One to whom time brings no change, for He is the "Father of eternity." "Prince of Peace"—He is not yet the Ruler of the nations of the world, hence we hear the cry of wars but of rumors of wars. Mark it well that there will be no enduring peace until He comes to reign whose right it is to reign, the divine Prince of Peace.

III. Jesus Christ—the Light and the King (Luke 1:26-33).
If Christ is to be honored in the life of any nation, yes, of our nation, He must first be recognized as the Son of God, the Lord of glory, the everlasting King of kings.

We need to emphasize that fact now when both military and political leaders are talking about the need of spiritual revival to save the world. Let us be sure that they mean more than just to pay formal recognition to a great man and a distinguished moral teacher. He is the Saviour, and there is none other (Acts 4:12).

Note the marvelous fulfillment of prophecy which actually took place in the coming of Jesus. Isaiah (7:14) said He was to be born of a virgin. He was (p. 27). He was to be the Son of God (Ps. 2:7). He was to be the everlasting King of kings. We celebrate the fulfillment of these prophecies at Christmas time.

Fingernails are a menace to rubber gloves. To prevent their cutting through the rubber, insert wads of cotton in the finger tips of the gloves.

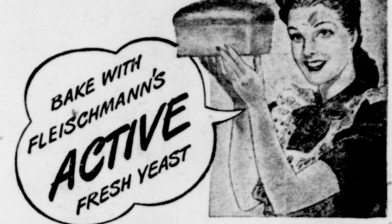

LESSON TEXT: Numbers 14:11-34. MEMORY SELECTION: For whom the Lord loveth correcteth, even as a father the son in whom he delighteth.—Proverbs 3:12.

Our lesson tells of God's plan for the discipline of the people of Israel in preparation for their entry into the Promised Land. They were not ready when God first brought them up to it, but through hard and trying experiences they learned. They did not believe God, so they had to learn the hard way. One wonders whether we will be in preparation for their entry into the Promised Land. They were not ready when God first brought them up to it, but through hard and trying experiences they learned. There is a Limit to God's Patience (vv. 11, 12).

The background of our lesson is the report of the spies who were sent up into the land. All agreed that it was a good land, but 10 of them were afraid of its inhabitants. Two of them, Joshua and Caleb, urged the people to take God at his word and go up to possess the land. But the people rebelled and wanted to turn back to the fleshpots of Egypt.

God had been patient with the people, but the time had come when further patience ceased to be a virtue and would only be indulgence. Then judgment came—and fast!

There is a limit to God's patience with a sinful people. It is almost startling to think of the possibility that America may all too soon press its downward course to the point where God says, "It is enough."

II. There is Power in Intercessory Prayer (vv. 13-19).

Moses stepped into the breach and made a mighty and moving plea for his people. He knew the power of intercession and called on God for mercy upon the people. He pointed out that one of the reasons the Lord was involved in bringing His people into the land. He recognized the guilt of the older members of the nation, but asked for another chance for the children. He based his prayer on the known qualities of God, His justice and, above all, His mercy.

Does not this strongly suggest the importance of Christian people making their influence count in the nation of social problems? Prayer accomplishes more than this world has ever conceived to be possible.

More Christian people ought to be deeply concerned about our country's liquor problem, and all the physical, moral, social, political and spiritual ills which are caused by drink.

III. There is Punishment for Unbelief (vv. 20-23).

The pardon of God for the people as a whole did not overlook or wink at the awful unbelief of those who had rebelled against God.

He had not left them without a promise of blessing for faith in Him. And again he had made known his might in miraculous deliverances during their days of travel from Egypt. But they simply hardened their hearts in unbelief.

Lack of faith in God is no little offense against Him. He has a right to our unquestioning belief and immediate obedience. Somehow we have come to regard it as a special favor toward God if we believe Him, when the fact is that unbelief in such a God is definitely and obviously sin.

IV. There is a Reward for Courageous Living (v. 24).

God is looking for men of faith. All through Scripture we find the Lord coming magnificently to the help and blessing of the one who will believe Him.

Caleb and Joshua were brought into the land, preserved through all vicissitudes of wandering, and kept in vigor even to old age in order to enjoy the promised possession (see Josh. 1:6-9; 14:10-12). Caleb is an example of what courage faith, self-control—yes, discipline, can do for a man. We need men and women—yes, young men and women with the spirit of Caleb, who are not content with old age encourage self-indulgence. Drinking is on the increase. Moral standards are waning and seem to be getting lower.
