Final Report Cover Crop

It is now time to report your winter cover crops. All cover crops seeded on your farm in the Fall of 1944 must be reported before it is turned under and must be reported to the AAA Office in Eastland before the final date of May 15, 1945, in order to receive payment for the practice. If you have oats, barley or rye seeded in the Fall of 1944 and not harvested for grain, these must be measured and the acreage reported. If you seeded peas or vetch bring sales receipts to show the pounds, unless the peas were secured through the Agricultural Adjustment Agency.

Carbon Responds To Drive For Clothing

The way in which Carbon responded to the drive for clothing to be sent to refugees of the war-torn European countries was very gratifying. P. L. Medford carried a load of 22 large pasteboard boxes of clean, wearable clothing to the City Hall in Eastland Tuesday morning to be shipped to these countries. Slaughtering For Use In Home Is Permitted

OPA wants every farm family to know that no slaughter permit is necessary for farmers who dress meat, or have it dressed for them, exclusively for consumption in their own household. Farm families who are able to raise animals for their own use are asked to destroy all their unused red ration points when they come out of date. Meat resulting from slaughter of farmer's livestock for consumption in his own household is point free.

Farmers who sell home slaughtered rationed meats will be anxious to secure the new meat point value charts for May from their War Price and Rationing boards. The point values listed on the table will tell them exactly how many points to collect and turn into the board for the various cuts and pieces they sell.

Expectant Dad Now Gets News

Red Cross Solves Problem of Getting Tidings to War Prisoners.

By BARBARA CALLAHAN. Released by Western Newspaper Union. ST. LOUIS, Sept. 17.—A man who has ever experienced the somewhat dubious thrill of pacing hospital corridors during the long, grey hours before the birth of his offspring will appreciate the plight of the expectant father interned in prisoner-of-war camps overseas.

He Gets the News. Now the gratifying job of sending the long-awaited news of the birth of a son or daughter to the prisoner is accomplished quickly by the American service of the International Red Cross central agency for prisoners of war at Geneva, Switzerland.

Camp leaders, or men of confidence, who are elected by the prisoners in conjunction with the approval of the German high command as the representative of the prisoners on all matters of camp conduct, report that the inclusion of "Baby Statistics" in the agency's service has done much to lift the morale of the interned men.

Not even the most depressed prisoner of war can continue that way long when he learns that he is the father of a "red-headed beauty" or a son "with a foot like yours."

Waiting for Triplets. Marghurita Strahler, head of the American section of the international agency, says 400 internations were handled in 1945 through "baby statistics."

Besides performing a needed service to the prisoners, Miss Strahler says the "baby department" serves as a morale-builder for the women in her department.

For the most part, the women in the American section love their work, Miss Strahler reports. They develop a maternal interest in the men in the section of the alphabet upon which they work.

Keeping up with the neighbors is not always a desirable thing, but both men and nations do it. When the last judge, Samuel, had become old, Israel began to demand a king like the nations round about them. Saul, their first king, was evidently selected for his appearance and his physical superiority. He began well, in dependence upon God, but came to a tragic end because of sin. David, who followed Saul, had his failings, but was essentially a man after God's own heart. He wanted to build a temple for God, but because he was a man of war, God decreed that his son, Solomon, who succeeded him, was to build it. Our lesson opens after the remarkable fine prayer with which Solomon dedicated the temple. **I. Dedication Accepted (9:1-3).** David was pleased with Solomon's intelligent and spiritual prayer and the act of dedication, and he allowed the house of the Lord by putting His name on it and assuring them of His continual presence. It is a delightful thing that God is willing to accept at the hands of a man the dedication of either himself or his possessions for God's glory. The Lord is Maker of heaven and earth and surely has no need of what we have. And yet He does have need of it, and is ready to use it as we present it to Him. Our act of dedication results in His act of acceptance and consecration of our talents, our time, our money, or our goods for His glorious service. But God expects His people to continue in devotion to Him if they are to have His continued presence and blessing.

II. Consecration Expected (9:4-7). The throne of David was to remain in the lineage of Solomon as long as he and the people of Israel walked uprightly before God. He expects obedience to His commandments, and apart from it He cannot give His blessing. Note the faithfulness of God. No man would ever have introduced such a note of solemn portent and of warning into an occasion which seemed all gladness and light. Prosperity was at its height. The king was in favor with both God and man. Into that picture of success and grandeur God paints with bold strokes a great and striking "IF."

It is a presumption to think that we can coast along on past attainments or former piety. If we are to be used and blessed of God tomorrow and the day after, we must look to our consecration to Him. **III. Possessions Glorified (9:26; 10:25-23).** We read in 10:23 that "King Solomon exceeded all kings of the earth in riches and wisdom." He had reached the pinnacle. The Chinese have a proverb, "The man who stands on the pinnacle has nowhere to step but off." It need not have been a snare for Solomon to be rich if he had maintained his simple faith in God, but the temptations brought in by heathen wives whom he foolishly married, coupled with the deceitfulness of riches (Matt. 13:22), soon led him into the downward path.

The almost unbelievable riches of Solomon could have been used for the glory of God, but instead they were an end in themselves. Solomon was soon led into the folly of turning to the worship of heathen gods. Little wonder that we find **IV. Judgment Decreed (11:4, 11).** It would seem that in a man who knows the Lord should grow in grace and become even more intimate with God as he grows older. He might expect that the pasture ground should grow wider and wider to say, "I will give up and go to my rest," he went on. "When Solomon was old, his eyes failed, and he could not see. He went to his rest as his fathers had done. He was buried in Jerusalem." The prophet Isaiah, in a beautiful prayer, constantly asks that God should "show his greatness, and his power, and his glory, and his majesty, and his dominion, and his righteousness, from one generation to another." "O God, be not silent, for the earth is full of thy greatness. Let the sea and the land be full of thy greatness. Let the mountains be glad because of thy greatness. Let the hills be glad because of thy greatness. Let the trees and the plants be glad because of thy greatness. Let the beasts of the field be glad because of thy greatness. Let the birds of the air be glad because of thy greatness. Let the fish of the sea be glad because of thy greatness. Let the angels of heaven be glad because of thy greatness. Let the saints in glory be glad because of thy greatness. Let the redeemed of the Lord be glad because of thy greatness. Let the Lord be glorified forever and ever. Amen."

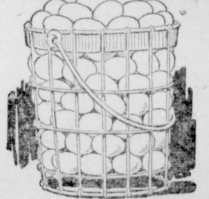
