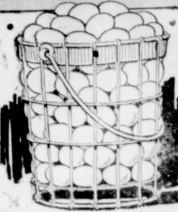

Mrs. Tom Lovelace, chairman, announces that special invitation have been extended to Colonel A. Fred E. Brown, post commander of Camp Lewis, and Maj. Gen. Bruce Magruder, post commander of Camp Walters.
"The purpose of this new independent, non-profit organization of mothers and wives," Mrs. Lovelace explains, "is to bring every aid and comfort to men and women in the United States armed forces by performing such services as may improve the general welfare and bolster the morale of those in military camps. In hospitals, or at the fighting fronts for the duration; and, further, to continue rendering such services as may be deemed helpful after the war is eligible for membership are mothers and wives of men and women in any branch of the United States armed forces within the continental United States or overseas during World War II, same period of service being performed on or after September 16, 1940.
One of the newest, most unique organizations of its kind in this world at war, the American Mothers & Wives Service Society was first organized in Eastland during a special meeting Monday night. The aims, principles and proposed activities of this women's home front service group will be explained during the county-wide meeting in Eastland, Tuesday night.
"It feels certain that Carbon will be one of the first communities in the Nation to form a local chapter of this new society," Mrs. Lovelace says, "and we are looking forward to having many of you mothers, wives of servicemen present during our open meeting next Tuesday evening. You are all most cordially invited to attend."
