The USDA Counity Civil Defense Board will be working on a Civil Defense exercise within the next few days. This organization set up by law several years ago consists of the County ASCS Office Maneiger, Work Unit Conservationist. Soil Conservation Service, County Agricultural Agent and Farmers Home Administration Supervisor. This organization is active in each county and is required to meet at least once each month. Definite civil defense responsibilities are assigned to each board member. The exercise currently under consideration deals with what neucular attack would do to residents, agriculture and current food supplies in the County.
