How Many Cups in A Can?



TRANSLATING cans into cups is a thrifty measure, and a great convenience, if you dislike to have a little bit of this and a little bit of that left over. For example, if your recipe calls for one and one-third cups of tomatoes, it is thrifty to buy a No. 1 can which contains this exact amount, or if the recipe calls for two and one-third cups of tomatoes, you can open a No. 2 can confident that there will not be a spoonful left over.

It is inside the cover of your favorite recipe book for reference.

No. 2	1 lb. 3 oz.	2 1/3

No. 10	6 lbs. 7 oz.	13

It is helpful, also, to know that a No. 2 1/2 can of peaches or pears contains from 12 to 15 halves. Apples vary widely in the number of halves; a Fancy can may contain 21 small halves; a Standard can usually contains 19 smaller halves.

LINDBERGH TOURS TO RESEARCH WORK

Colonel Keeps Nature of Experiments Secret.

New York.—Col. Charles A. Lindbergh has plunged into his research work with renewed vigor in an effort to forget the past.

He goes almost daily to an extensive laboratory reserved for his personal use in the Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research, in New York city, but exactly what he does there is hidden behind a barrier of secrecy.

A few months ago it became known that Colonel Lindbergh, then the happy father of a curly-haired son, had been working on a centrifugal apparatus designed to separate serum from the blood.

Observers, however, are disinclined to believe his whole attention is riveted on such a procedure as a centrifuge. Curiosity has been whetted by instructions prohibiting employees from approaching the Lindbergh laboratory or attempting to engage the famous flyer in conversation.

When Lindbergh sits among co-workers for luncheon in the restaurant on the grounds he is not disturbed. Some speak of the dire events which the colonel is trying to forget.

They have been cautioned, too, against talking abroad about the colonel's return to his laboratories, so that he may enter and leave without being subjected to the gaze of curious outsiders.

Lindbergh, who was known as "Slim" long before his son was kidnapped, obviously has lost weight, but his countenance is cheerful.

There is much speculation as to the nature of his work in connection with the serum experiment. It was recalled that Lindbergh's first association with the institute was when he flew to Quebec with some anti-pneumonia serum provided by it for the stricken Floyd Bennett. It is thought he might be interested in developing a serum to be carried on polar flights, but that is only one of the many guesses and rumors.

TEXAS RAILROADS PAY SUBSTANTIAL PART OF STATE'S TAX BURDEN

● Taxes is one of the large fixed charges connected with the operation of Texas railroads. From the standpoint of the welfare of state, counties and communities, railroad taxes are of much importance. This annual obligation must be met from the earning capacity of the rail carriers.

In 1931 the railroads of Texas paid a total of \$8,303,108.47 in federal, state, county, municipal and miscellaneous taxes. The distribution of this amount to the various tax funds is shown below:

It can thus be seen that railroad taxes represent an important and indispensable factor in the economic life of our state. They help in a large measure to pay the expense of our state, county and municipal government, build and maintain highways, pay the cost of drainage and other improvements, and support our schools and educational institutions.

It is the desire of Texas railroads to extend this helpfulness to Texas counties and communities in carrying this heavy burden. However, their ability to meet these obligations as they become due depends upon their ability to earn sufficient revenue with which to pay this and other heavy expenses connected with their operation.

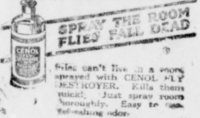

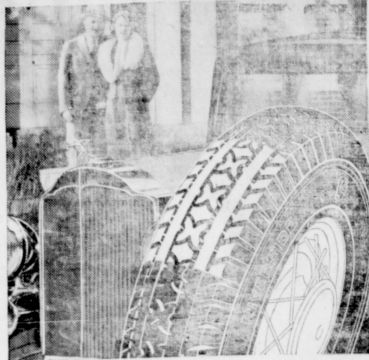

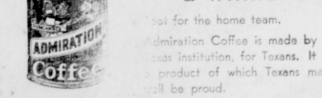
