Eastland Leads In Poll Taxes

Eastland leads in the number of poll taxes paid this year in Eastland County, according to a tabulation made by the tax collector's office. According to the count Eastland leads the entire county with 1,343 poll taxes paid, Ranger is second with 1,316 and Cisco is in third place with a total of only 1,240.
