## \$3 1/4 Million Contract Let For Int. 20 Ranger By-Pass

Ruby International and H. D. York of Houston is apparent low bidder at about three and a quarter million dollars for the Interstate 20 Ranger by-pass contract, according to the Texas Highway Department.

A work order hasn't been written, but work is expected to begin within about a week, T. P. Magness of the local office reported Friday.

The winner is a consolidation of Cecil Ruby Construction Co. which has work underway in the area, and the H. D. York Co.

Construction of the 5.7 miles of highway as a "turn key" job will mean a big step toward the completion of the highway all the way across Eastland County. Since IH 20 has been completed all the way across Dist. 8 its completion in this county a few months hence will mean that IH 20 will have been completed all the way from the Eastland-Erath County line to the Howard-Martin County line.

A March contract letting is expected for the sector of IH 20 from a point 0.6 miles east of State 6 to the present four-lane divided U. S. 80, a distance of 3.4 miles. Completion of that stretch will be an important accomplishment because it will tie in with an uncompleted sector of the highway that begins at a point one

mile west of Cisco and extend to 0.6 miles east of State 6.

Part of the uncompleted section, from one mile west of Cisco to a point 2.5 miles east of Cisco has been partially completed. Construction of grading and structures only, has been completed on the 3.6 miles. In the meantime, Cecil Ruby, Inc. is rushing to completion work on that part of the highway that extends from a point 2.6 miles east of Cisco to a point 0.6 miles east of State 6, which runs north and south through Eastland. Ruby's contract was for \$1,731,161.03.

Sometime this summer, Unit Two (flexible base and two courses of surface treatment) contracts are expected on the two projects near Cisco — from one mile west of Cisco to 0.6 miles east of State 6, or a distance of 3.974 miles.

IH 20 is complete from the Callahan-Eastland County line to one mile west of Cisco and is complete from .5 miles east of Ranger to the Eastland-Erath County line, a distance of 8 miles.

Other than the Ranger by-pass, the two projects near Cisco, and the connection of IH 20 with U. S. 80 from a point near SH 6 to U. S. 80, only the present four-lane divided U. S. 80 will have to be brought up to IH 20 standards to complete the work in Eastland County. That distance is about 6 miles and although the Brownwood district office has been making plans for the improvement of that sector it is not definitely known just when work will begin on that project.

## Community Property Law May Offer Tax Advantages To You

COLLEGE STATION—Community property can affect taxpayers in a community property state, such as Texas. Texas taxpayers may find it advantageous to file separate returns under some conditions, advises James Mallett, farm management specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

In Texas, all income received by married taxpayers is considered to be community income and each taxpayer is responsible for one-half of the total.

Taxpayers who are divorced during the tax year must

report one-half of the community property income acquired prior to the divorce and all the separate income received after the divorce. Taxpayers who married during the tax year may elect to file joint or separate returns, as can those married in a prior year.

Capital loss deductions are limited to the smaller of \$1,000 or the combined taxable income on joint returns in a community property state. However, a husband and wife living in a community property state may file separate returns and both claim a capital loss deduction up to \$1,000 or their taxable income, whichever is smaller.

Income in a community property state may work against the taxpayer in some cases and animals. such as retirement income credit. If one spouse is over 65 he is eligible for retirement income credit. If the other spouse is still earning income, half the earned income is taxable to each taxpayer and thus the earned income may cancel any retirement income credit.

If you have circumstances that may be affected by the Community Property laws, write the District Director of the Internal Revenue Service for an explanation or for a copy of IRS Document 5192, Community Property, suggests Mallett.

## GORDON SPOT

We received an announce-  
ment recently in the county  
office made by Secretary of  
Agriculture, Orville Freeman,  
that a 1968 voluntary feed  
grain program covering corn  
and grain sorghum would ap-  
ply to encourage reduction in  
total supply and strengthen  
farm feed grain prices. The  
program was announced after  
public hearings all over the  
feed grain producing areas.  
Two of the public hearings  
were held in Texas.

We have had numerous in-  
quiries at the Eastland County  
Office on what kind of pro-  
gram would apply in 1968. Ac-  
cording to the announcement  
the program will be similar to  
the 1967 program and sign-up  
will be held for interested  
participants in February and  
March of 1968.

Eastland County has about  
1,000 farmers who grow feed  
grain and in 1967 about 300  
farms signed up in the pro-  
gram. Many small farms did  
not participate as they only  
produced small quantities for  
home consumption. The base  
acreage for Eastland County  
farmers is about 27,000 acres.

The program for 1968 pro-  
vides that voluntary partici-  
pants must reduce their base  
acreage at least 20 percent in  
order to qualify for price sup-  
port. No diversion payment

would apply on the 20 percent.  
The farm could divert up to  
the larger of 50 percent of his  
base or 25 acres and receive  
a diversion payment. Small  
farms with 25 acres or less  
could divert his entire base  
and farms with more than 25  
acres could reduce his base  
voluntarily for 1 year to 25  
acres and divert the 25 acres.

The question concerning  
most Eastland County farms  
with wheat allotments and  
feed grain bases is the provi-  
sion of substitution of these  
crops. The law for 1968 pro-  
vides that substitution will  
apply as it did in 1967. In  
other words a farm could di-  
vert the 20 percent minimum  
of his feed grain base and  
could plant his wheat allot-  
ment and the balance of his  
feed grain base to wheat or  
feed grain and be eligible for  
price support on his commod-  
ity.

### Certain Proofs Will Be Needed For SS Forms

"What should I bring with me when I file my application for social security retirement benefits?"

That's a question Mrs. Fay Cran, social security field representative, hears often.

Mrs. Grant states that proof of age will be needed. The best evidence, she says, is an original birth certificate or baptismal certificate is sued

before the claimant was five years old. Many people have neither but should bring with them the oldest evidence they may have relative to their age or date of birth.

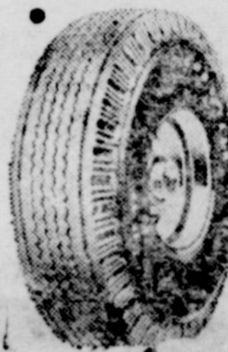
