14,000 License Plates Going On Sale Feb.

Texas Legislature amended the Texas Registration Law by changing passenger car license fees and establishing a minimum fee of \$5.30 for all vehicles, including boat trai-

The new rates for passenger cars are as follows: up to 3,500 pounds, \$12.30; from 3,501 to 4,500 pounds, \$22.30; from 4,501 to 6,000 pounds \$30.30; more than 6,000 pounds 55 cents per 100 pounds, plus 30 cents. (Car owners may find the correct weight by checking either the car title or last year's license re-

Owners must bring to the Tax Collector's office the certificate of title, the 1967 liceuse receipt, current resident address, and zip code. State law requires each owner to register his vehicle in the county in which he resides and to present his certificate of title as evidence of owner-

More than 14,000 1968 Texas license plates will go on sale in Eastland County Feb.

Tax Assessor - Collector Edgar Altom said the num-ber includes 9,210 passenger car licenses. Other catagories are trucks, 2,700; farm trucks, 1,450; and truck tractos, 100. Allotment Sale, Lease To Boost Co. Peanuts

Recent authorization for the sale or lease of peanut allotments within the county could conceivable increase the county's total acreage by as much as 5000 acres it has been announced here.

This could possible bring the county's total planted acreage up to some 36000 acres (up from 31000) and result in maybe about \$425000 in revenue increase.

Conditions by which peanut acreage allotments may be sold or leased during 1968 and 1969 crop years have been listed by R. G. Lyerala chair man Agricultural and Stabilization and Conservation Texas Eastland Committee.

Under new legislation authorizing the Secretary of Agricultue to permit the sale or lease of peanut allotments in the same county the Chair man said a farm owner and the operator acting together may sell or lease an allotment to another farmer in their county or that an owner may allotment from one farm to

by him in the same county. The conditions by which the sale or lease of peanut allot ments may be made are as

follows according to the chair

any other owned or controlled

(1) Leases may not be for longer than 5 years; (2) no more than 5 acres of peanut allotment may be transferred to a form by sale or lease; ductivity are made down ward if the normal yield for the 10 per cent larger than that for the transferring farm or if the receiving farm estabishes an irrigation system with in 5 years following the trans-

(7) The land in the farm from which the entire peanut allotment has been transfer red will not be eligible for a new peanut allotment during the 5 years following the year the transfer is made; (8) adjustment will be made in the rate of Conservation Re-serve or Cropland Conversion payments to transferring farm coveed by such contracts or

(9) No tansfer will be effective until a record of the transfer is filed with the county committee and the coministee determines that all conditions of the transfer have



New Practices Will Be Studied In Peanut Crops

An important meeting for those producers interested in the latest cultural practices for profitable peanut production will be held at Stephenville on Jan. 29 & 30, reports Eastland County Agent De Gordon. Speakers will cover such subjects as oil man-agement, water requirement, irrigation system management, herbicide functions and principles of use, diseases nematode control, and they will include the latest information on varieties, seedling rates and planting methods There will be a panel on the safe use of pesticide and Mr. Ross Wilsos of the Southwestern Peanut Grower's Association will dicuss the marketing and production outlook.

The program will feature research scientists of Texas A&M University and from the Agricultural Experiment Station at Yoakum and Stephenville, Gordon aid. It will include Extension Specialist discussing irrigation, insect control and other subjects.

Veterans Land Program

James Wright of Eastland, County Veterans Service Officer, has issued the following statement regarding the new Veterans Land Program:

On Nov. 11, 1967, the people of Texas voted in favor of a Constitutional Amend ment which authorizes the reopening of the Veterans Land Program.

This program will, as in the past, be administered by the Veterans Land Board, a division of the General Land Office, in Austin. The Board announced that they would make a bond sale sometime during mid - December, 1967, and they they expect to have money to commence processing applications for land loans by Jan. 15, 1968.

Th'Board does not propose to have any numbering or other type of waiting list for this program. They expect to be able to process the loan applications as they are received. Because of this, veterans should be advised to find the property they wish to buy before asking the Board for the loan application papers. The Board has stated that they will accept letters, telephone calls telegrams, or any other type of communication on and later Jan. 15 and will by return mail send the loan application papers to the veteran who asks for them. There will be no time deadline placed on the return of the papers, as each veteran's application will be processed according to the date they are received in Austin by the Board, Wright said.

At Agriculture By GILBERT MEREDITH

Several residents of Eastland County have asked about new bermuda grass that they have heard about. The grass is Coastcross-1 Bermudagrass, but is not yet available except to certified growers.

Coasteross-1 bermudagras s is a hybrid crossed between coastal bermudagrass and a bermudagrass from Kenya. It was developed by Dr. Glenn W. Burton at the Coastal Plain Experiment Station, Tifton, Georgia. This hybrid grows taller and has broader, softer leaves than coastal. It is highly resistant to foliar diseases and sting nama todes. Unlike common and coastal bermudag rasses, it develops very few underground runners or rhizomes, ground runners or stolons. Tests in Georgia indicate it is about 12 percent more digestible than coastal, although it may produce less total forage than coastal. In preliminary hay feeding trials in Georgia, dairy heifers receiving coastcross-1 hay gained 30 percent faster than those on coastal.
