14,000 License Plates Going On Sale Feb. 1

Texas Legislature amended the Texas Registration Law by changing passenger car license fees and establishing a minimum fee of \$5.30 for all vehicles, including boat trailers.

The new rates for passenger cars are as follows: up to 3,500 pounds, \$12.30; from 3,501 to 4,500 pounds, \$22.30; from 4,501 to 6,000 pounds \$30.30; more than 6,000 pounds 55 cents per 100 pounds, plus 30 cents. Car owners may find the correct weight by checking either the car title or last year's license receipt.

Owners must bring to the Tax Collector's office the certificate of title, the 1967 license receipt, current resident address, and zip code. State law requires each owner to register his vehicle in the county in which he resides and to present his certificate of title as evidence of ownership.

More than 14,000 1968 Texas license plates will go on sale in Eastland County Feb. 1.

Tax Assessor - Collector Edgar Altren said the number includes 9,210 passenger car licenses. Other categories are trucks, 2,700; farm trucks, 1,450; and truck tractors, 100. Trailers are divided into three groups according to weight, with 800 for trailers up to 10,000 pounds; 60 for trailers 10 to 18 thousand; and 100 for trailers 18 to 32 thousand. Some 125 motor

Allotment Sale, Lease To Boost Co. Peanuts

Recent authorization for the sale or lease of peanut allotments within the county could conceivably increase the county's total acreage by as much as 5000 acres it has been announced here.

This could possible bring the county's total planted acreage up to some 36000 acres (up from 31000) and result in maybe about \$425000 in revenue increase.

Conditions by which peanut acreage allotments may be sold or leased during 1968 and 1969 crop years have been listed by R. G. Lyerla chairman Agricultural and Stabilization and Conservation Texas Eastland Committee.

Under new legislation authorizing the Secretary of Agriculture to permit the sale or lease of peanut allotments in the same county the Chairman said a farm owner and the operator acting together may sell or lease an allotment to another farmer in their county or that an owner may transfer all or any part of an allotment from one farm to any other owned or controlled by him in the same county.

The conditions by which the sale or lease of peanut allotments may be made are as follows according to the chairman:

mon:

(1) Leases may not be for longer than 5 years; (2) no more than 5 acres of peanut allotment may be transferred to a farm by sale or lease; (3) ductivity are made down ward if the normal yield for the 10 per cent larger than that for the transferring farm or if the receiving farm establishes an irrigation system within 5 years following the transfer.

(7) The land in the farm from which the entire peanut allotment has been transferred will not be eligible for a new peanut allotment during the 5 years following the year the transfer is made; (8) adjustment will be made in the rate of Conservation Reserve or Cropland Conversion payments to transferring farm covered by such contracts or agreements.

(9) No transfer will be effective until a record of the transfer is filed with the county committee and the committee determines that all conditions of the transfer have been met.

Regarding the closing date for transfers Chairman Lyerla said he did not expect it to be set for earlier than April 1.

Voter Registration Certificates Are Free, But You've Got To Ask for Them

Texas voters are again warned that they must apply for a voter registration certificate by the end of this month if they want to participate in this year's elections.

Application may be made either by mail or by personal appearance at the county tax assessor-collector's office or at a local registration substation.

Texas Secretary of State John L. Hill, who is sponsoring a statewide voter registration drive, has predicted that this year's registrations will show a very substantial increase over former years. The previous high was in 1964, the last presidential election

year, when a total of 2,904,768 registrants were reported by county tax assessor-collectors under the poll tax system then in force.

About 2 p. m. the men boarded the bus for Abilene.

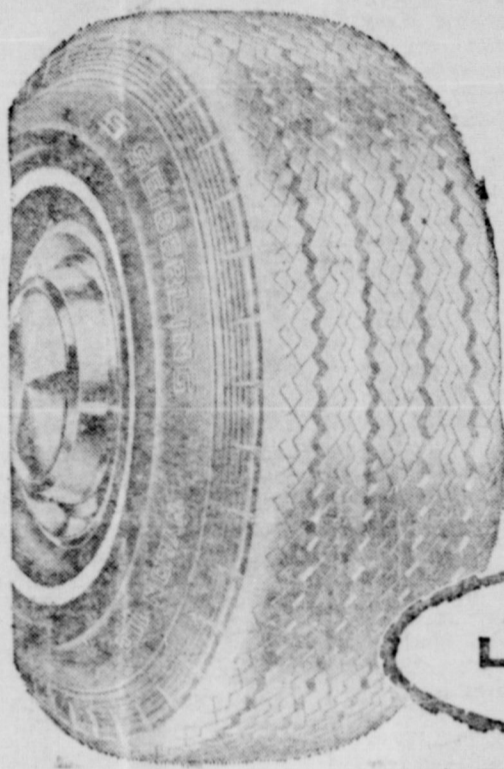
Mrs. Jewell Reaves, of the Selective Service office in Eastland, said it was the first time since the Korean War that the local draft office had been required to issue meal tickets.

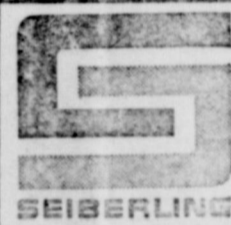

New Practices Will Be Studied In Peanut Crops

An important meeting for
those producers interested in
the latest cultural practices
for profitable peanut produc-
tion will be held at Stephen-
ville on Jan. 29 & 30, reports
Eastland County Agent De
Gordon. Speakers will cover
such subjects as oil man-
agement, water requirement,
irrigation system manage-
ment, herbicide functions and
principles of use, diseases
nematode control, and they
will include the latest infor-
mation on varieties, seedling ra-
tes and planting methods.
There will be a panel on the
safe use of pesticide and Mr.
Ross Wilson of the Southwes-
tern Peanut Grower's Associ-
ation will discuss the market-
ing and production outlook.

The program will feature
research scientists of Texas
A&M University and from the
Agricultural Experiment Sta-
tion at Yukon and Stephen-
ville, Gordon said. It will in-
clude Extension Specialist dis-
cussing irrigation, insect con-
trol and other subjects.

producing peanuts or working
with peanut producers as an
allied industry is welcome to

At Agriculture

Several residents of Eastland County have asked about new bermuda grass that they have heard about. The grass is Coastercross-1 Bermudagrass, but is not yet available except to certified growers.

Coastercross-1 bermudagrass is a hybrid between coastal bermudagrass and a bermudagrass from Kenya. It was developed by Dr. Glenn W. Burton at the Coastal Plain Experiment Station, Tifton, Georgia. This hybrid grows taller and has broader, softer leaves than coastal. It is highly resistant to foliar diseases and sting nematodes. Unlike common and coastal bermudagrasses, it develops very few underground runners or rhizomes, but spreads rapidly by above ground runners or stolons. Tests in Georgia indicate it is about 12 percent more digestible than coastal, although it may produce less total forage than coastal. In preliminary hay feeding trials in Georgia, dairy heifers receiving coastercross-1 hay gained 30 percent faster than those on coastal.

Veterans Land Program Explained by Wright

James Wright of Eastland County Veterans Service Office, has issued the following statement regarding the new Veterans Land Program:

On Nov. 11, 1967, the people of Texas voted in favor of a Constitutional Amendment which authorizes the reopening of the Veterans Land Program.

This program will, as in the past, be administered by the Veterans Land Board, a division of the General Land Office, in Austin. The Board announced that they would make a bond sale sometime during mid-December, 1967, and they expect to have money to commence processing applications for land loans by Jan. 15, 1968.

The Board does not propose to have any numbering or other type of waiting list for this program. They expect to be able to process the loan applications as they are received. Because of this, veterans should be advised to find the property they wish to buy before asking the Board for the loan application papers. The Board has stated that they will accept letters, telephone calls, telegrams, or any other type of communication on and after Jan. 15 and will by return mail send the loan application papers to the veteran who asks for them. There will be no time deadline placed on the return of the papers, as each veteran's application will be processed according to the date they are received in Austin by the Board, Wright said.

We have no information as yet indicating the interest rate which will be charged for these loans. However, the

Board is hopeful that they will be able to sell the bonds at a rate which will permit them to make loans at 5 per cent or less.

This new amendment to the Veterans Land Program will enable any veteran with 90 days or more honorable service at any time since Sept. 16, 1940, to qualify for a land loan. Even those who entered service from some state other than Texas may now be
