## Survey of County's Soil Is One-Fourth Completed

On schedule and about a fourth complete is the Standard Soil Survey being made of Eastland County through the Soil Conservation Service, USDA, in cooperation with Texas Agricultural Experiment Station, reports Survey Chief Joe Moore.

Started about three years ago by the late Ed Harris, the survey of this county's soil is scheduled to be completed by the end of 1971, Moore says. About 50 per cent of the counties in Texas are currently working on soil surveys and approximately 20 per cent have been completed, he said.

Assisting with the local project is Freddy Coburn, who has been on the job here for the past three years. Moore, a Comanche County native who has been with SCS for nine years, came to Eastland in October of 1966, when Mr. Harris, who was in charge of the survey, became ill.

Demand for the survey will be extensive: (A Texas Tech student was in the Eastland SCS office Friday, where the soil project is headquartered, and requested a copy of the county's soil survey. "Sor-ry," he was told, "it'll be a while before ours is ready." "Sor -

The survey will be inval uable to farmers, those who work with farmers, game managers, sportsman and others concerned with wild life, ranchers, engineers and builders, scientists, students, teachers, newcomers, and all others who may have a need or an interest in what makes up the terra firma of East land County.

in one field may be deep, fertl an highly productive while that just across the fence may be shallow, eroded or too steep for cultivaton. These differences, along with others such as texture, structure, pH and color, are being recorded on aerial photographs by soil scientists with the Soil Con-servation Service preparing Standard Soil Survey of Elastland County.

Soils that are similar in characteristics are called soil series. These soil series are named and fit into a national classification system. From these soil series comperhensive information about these soils can be given such as how they react, recommended conservation treatment of the soils, estimated yields, engineering interpretations, irrigation recommendations. rangelend, pastureland and wildlife interpretations.

There is approximately 50 different soil series in Eastland County. Of these, about 12 are adapted to the production of peanuts. Of these 12 soils, the two most dominant soils are Chaney loamy sand and Patilo - Arenosa fine sand. The Chaney soils have a loamy sand surface layer up to 20 inches thick over a reddish heavy sandy clay subsoil with gray mottles. It is a good peanut soil except where erosion has removed practically all of the surface Continued on last page

## **New Drivers License** *`Little' Changed*

We cannot renew a license more than 90 days before it expires, but anytime within 90 days of the expiration date, the driver may come for renewal without a card of notice."

When the renewal applicant reaches the office, he is asked to take a visual test\_simply stand a given distance from a wall chart, read letters on the chart, first with one eye and then the other, with glasses and without glasses. Then he is photographed—he stands with toes on the yellow line and looks directly at the camera and he is not allowed to wear a hat.

Then he is given a receipt which will serve as a license until the license itself arrives by mail within 30 days.

This is all there is to it, unless the applicant has already been instructed by mail that he will be given other tests. "No one will be tested in a surprise fashion or sudden decision", Petty emphasized. "The decision to give a written or driving test will be made carefully and the applicant will receive a letter from Austin, telling him of the de-cision. No one will be given a written or driving test who does not know before he comes in that the the tests will be given.'

The process of renewing a license is the same for everyone, regardless of age. Petty said. "The only thing that age has to do with a driver's license is the mimimum age required for getting one. A young person must be 18 without a driver's education course in school or 16 with the course . A 15-year-old may get a beginner's license if he has completed the first half of the course.

There is nothing else based on age. We give the same visual test, written test, and driving test to everyone.'

Referring to charges that the laws and driving examiners are tougher on older peo-

er's job is to determine the applicant's skill, alertness and the sharpness of his senses.

It is true that the years sometimes take their toll of vision, coordination, and the ability to sort out key elements in critical traffic situuations. But if this is true, the blame goes to time itself and not to the examiner.'

County drivers seeking renewal to the Driver's License Office on West Main Street in Eastland any week, day between 8 and 5. The office is closed Saturday and Sunday. The complete testing program will be conducted in Eastland on Mondays only. Patrolman Pelty will be in Cisco on first, third and fifth Tuesdays and in Ranger on the second and fourth Tuesdays. County residents are urged to use the Eastland office for renewal they possible can, in order, to speed the process for them-

Actually, any Texan who is a licensed driver may use the Eastland office, however, if and several out-of-county residents have already done so. including a number from Clessa and Midland.

What can a licensed driver do to help himself and the department? Cooperate and understand. Petty said, "If an applicant understands that the law and its application are for his own safety and well-being, cooperation will follow."



The loamy sand surface tends to form a surface crust and does not blow as bad as soils with a fine sand surface.
However, the wind erosion hazard for both soils are severe.

The Patilo - Arenosa fine sand soils are deep "sugar sands." The sandy surface ranges from 40 to more than 72 inches thick over a gray mottled yellowish sandy clay subsoil. These soils a redroughty. Water and fertilizer rapidly leach below plant root depth.

The Chaney and Patilio-Arenosa are distinctly contrasting coils. Others are more implay but still have different capabilities and limitations.

When the soil survey is completed over all of Eastland County it will be published in book form giving an inventory of the different soils and their locations in the county. Each soil will be described, giving its capabilitities and limitations.

Cooperators with the upper Leon Soil and Water Conservation District have soils information as a part of their Conservation Plan.
