PREPARING TO FIGHT OIL FIRE WITH STEAM

(By Associated Press)

CORSICANA, May 11. - The huge Hughes-McKie wildeat gusher, which has been burning wild since Wednesday afternoon, will be placed under control soon, it is believed and predicted by J. K. Hughes, president of the Hughes Development Company which brought in the well Tuesday night.

Twenty boilers have been brought to the scene of the fire and a complete battery of steam will be turned on the belching gusher in an effort to smother out the flames. The monster flame is fed by a constant flow of gas and oil and the flames can be seen for a distance of fifty miles.






