The inside row next to the house is of Chinese elms, the tallest of the trees, then a row of osage oranges, a row of desert willows, and last a row of tamarix, a shrub which grows close to the ground.

The windbreak will thus have the contour of an earth dam and will not be easily penetrated by wind. The orchard is planted inside the windbreak for protection.

"Windbreaks are a farm asset in more ways than one," says Mrs. Dennis. "They tend to protect the soil from mechanical injury by wind, and a belt of trees by the farm buildings protects them from extreme winter cold and summer heat and makes the home a pleasanter place in which to live.







#### **Club Girls Report** Splendid Results In Major Projects

Home demonstration club work and 4-H girls' club work are going forward in Runnels county at this time as the busy season is on for canning vegetables. All the clubs are active this year and the reports coming to the office of Miss Myra Tankersley, county home demonstration agent, are very gratifying. One report on a garden project is indicative of the success the girls are attaining:

By carefully planning her garden work, Mary Lehman, of the Dale 4-H club, has some kind of vegetable from her garden the year 'round. At the present she has 9,284 feet of vegetables in her garden, comprising 51 arieties She gives her expenses to date as \$7.56 and the estimated value of the vegetables produced at \$46.60, thus making a profit of \$39.04.

She is busy canning so as to have at least ten containers for each member of the family and gives the following report on canned products: 40 pints beets 6 quarts carrots, 28 pints English peas, 20 pints kraut and 6 pints of sour cucumber pickles. She has dried several pounds of English peas, her onions and garlic are about ready to harvest and the tomato crop is ready to be put up.

In addition to her garden work, Mary has improved her bedroom by cleaning the walls, rearranging the furniture, adding attractive curtains, rehanging pictures with invisible hangings, and adding two tufted bedspreads.


