County Commissioners discuss investments and renovation

The Parmer County Commissioners Court met in regular session on Monday, February 26th at 10 a.m. in the County Courtroom of the Parmer County Courthouse in Farwell, Texas. All commissioners were present.

The first item of business on the agenda was the consideration of additional construction of the Extension Office in Bovina. The Commissioners took no action on the matter.

After the reading and approval of the minutes from the previous meeting, the Court approved the payment of the Accounts Payables presented to them by County Auditor Larry Johnston.

Altha Herington then presented the Treasurer's Report and the Commissioners approved the report and the calculated payroll and disbursements for all county employees and elected officials.

The Commissioners next considered an Order Adopting an Investment Policy and Designating an Investment Officer. A Policy was adopted and the

County Treasurer, Altha Herington, was elected to serve as the Investment Officer.

The Court then voted to participate in the Affordable Care Act Reporting & Tracking Service (ARTS).

Next, the Commissioners voted to spend additional funds to update the Computer Room. The amount of \$8,500 was the original estimate but after further inspection it was deemed that there was more renovation that needed to be made so the County could meet its obligations of maintaining, preserving, and distributing information to the public. The costs included \$1,976.59 to Plateau and \$1,000.00 to Southwest Business Solutions.

The last agenda item was consideration of Any and All Matters concerning the Parmer County Law Enforcement Center. No pertinent matters were presented. The Court then adjourned.

The next Commissioners Court meeting is scheduled for Monday, March 12th.

Water conditions

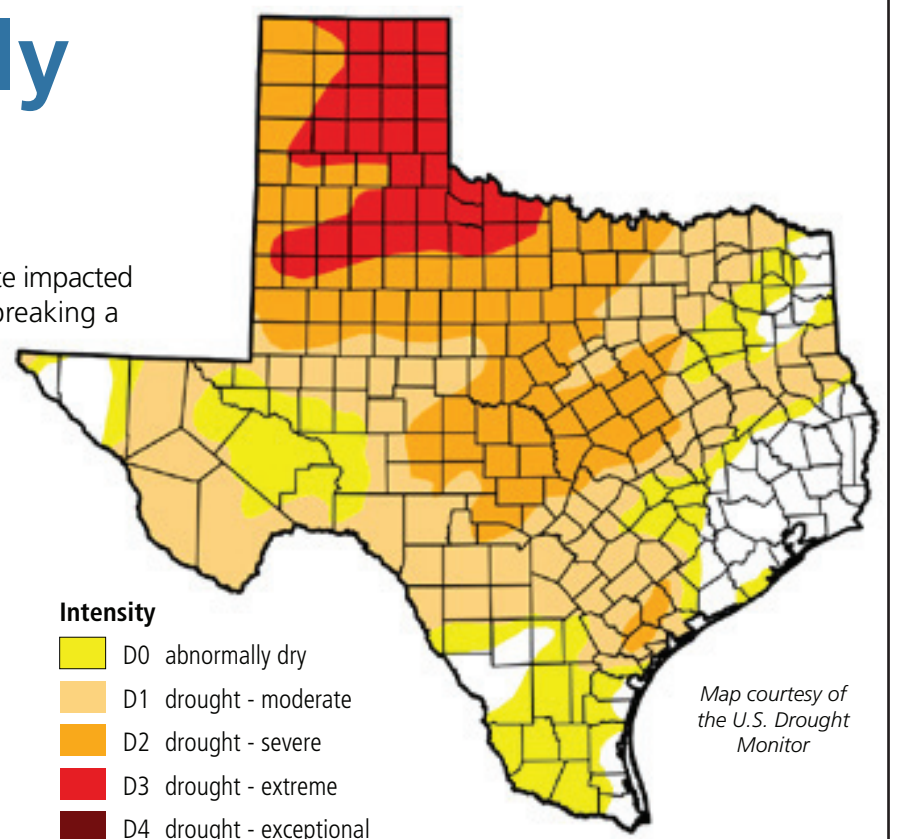

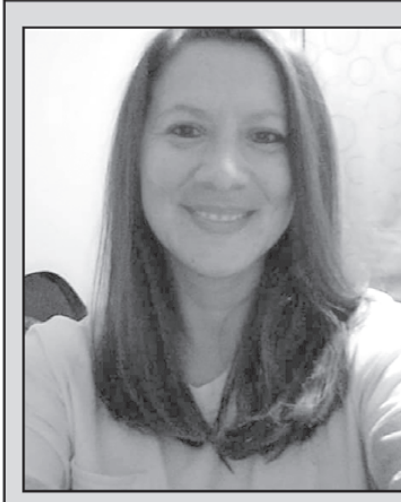
Texas Master Naturalist event with special guest speaker

JANUARY 21 – Mark Achor, owner of Pappy Jack's Donuts, hands over the keys to the new owners, Bobby Broyles and Machele Hunt. Bobby and Machele will rename the business Big Red Donuts.

MARCH 17 – A former Friona resident, Charlene Seale, has been involved with Amarillo's Lifestar helicopter, which had a tragic crash last Friday morning, killing three young medical professionals as well as their four-month-old patient. Charlene, a graduate of Friona High School, is coordinator of Northwest Texas Hospital's Lifestar and Trauma Services program. She was especially close to flight nurse Lauren Stone, 30, among those killed when the medical helicopter went down south of Boise City, Oklahoma, last Friday. Another former Frionan, pilot Doug Carthel of Dalhart, flew one of the planes which found the crash site. Doug is the son of Bill and Ann Carthel.

APRIL 21 – Ron Carr, Managing Editor of the Friona Star/Bovina Blade, was honored for his column "Out Here" at the

annual Panhandle Press Association convention last weekend at Amarillo's Ambassador Hotel. Carr's entries in the "humorous columns" division won him a third-place plaque.

My senior year in college, I broke my leg in two places. I was in a cast until the first of December. One of the things I missed (besides a good shower for six weeks) was running. I enjoyed running, roughly five miles a day. So when I got my cast off, finished my finals, I headed to Friona. My folks lived out on Cemetery Road. I was still wearing a little brace but could not wait to take a run down to the cemetery and back. It was dusk and a bit cold, but it was a short run. As I ran, I heard a coyote in the near distance. He was yelping a little and was staying in the Wells corn patch just south of Cemetery Road. I was thankful the dogs had stayed home, but it was a little unnerving, knowing he was just out of sight. I entered the cemetery and the whole area sort of came alive with a much larger coyote chorus. It was enough to make me stop and consider a few options as to how to get back down the mile I had just run. It was at about that time, I saw a car come strolling into the cemetery. It was my mother. She had been outside, heard the commotion down the road and decided to come check on me. I rode back home in the safety of an old Grand Marque.

Fear often begins with just a little thought of doubt, a single coyote pacing you in the cornfield. I have been around long enough to know that one coyote would likely not attempt anything, but now the thought is there. That lonely little thought that says, "You can't" or "what if..." If left without confrontation, other voices chime in with a very similar tune. Fear has gained a footing and now you begin to question things, once solid. Doubt grows, fear yells louder until you are frozen, no longer moving forward, just wanting it all to go away.

It is at this point you have a choice, give into fear or face it in faith. Facing it in faith means not only trusting God, but also others that God sends into our lives to help us move beyond the doubt. Thus, God not only gave us His Son for our salvation, but each other to remind us we are not in this life alone. Sometimes that is just what I need to face the things I fear.

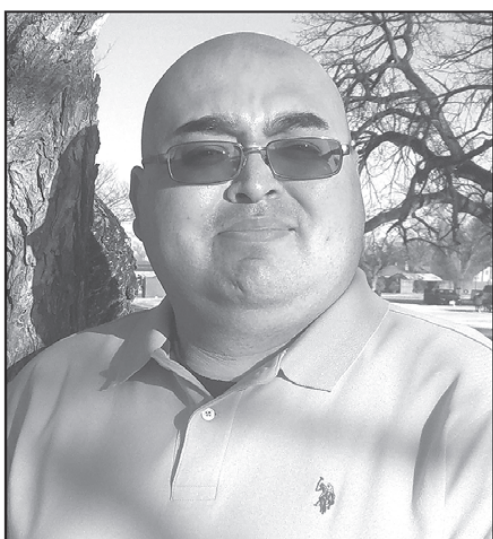

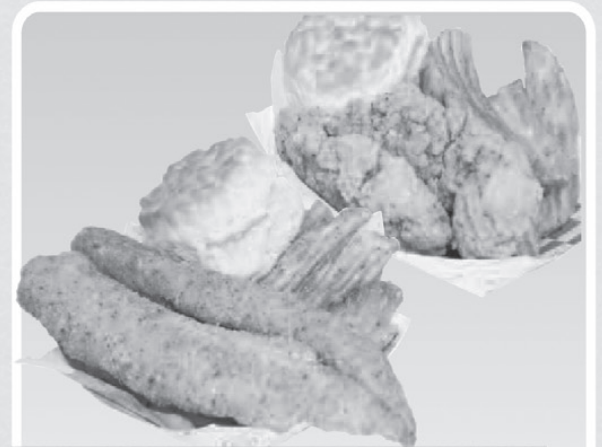
