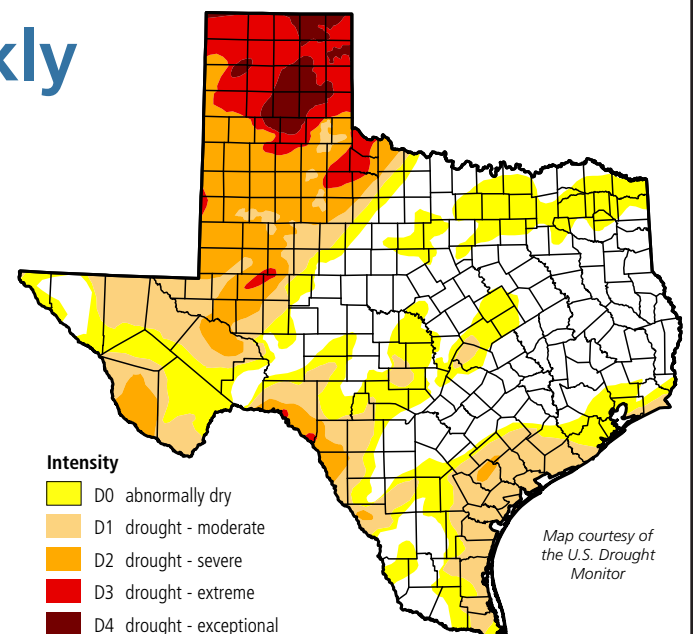

The young scholars gave some good advice to their classmates and I listened intently, occasionally explaining something to my granddaughters. So here you go, young folks. - Some final non-academic lessons from an old teacher and a Biker Dude. Follow the safety rules you have learned all your life. You can't reach your goals if you don't survive. Ask for help when needed, and don't judge people by appearance only. Take responsibility for your mistakes. You will make them - everyone does. If you regret a decision, turn around and make it right. Say Thank you and I'm sorry. And finally, enjoy the road that lies ahead. It's a beautiful one. Commissioner's Court Meeting

The Parmer County Commissioners Court met in Special Session on Tuesday, May 29, 2018, at 10:00 a.m. in the County Courtroom of the Parmer County Courthouse in Farwell, Texas.

The meeting was called to order, a prayer was offered, and the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and Texas Flag was recited.

The first order of business was the discussion and possible action to designate Reinvestment Zone 2018-01, establish the boundaries thereof and provide for an effective date, pursuant to Chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code. The Court approved the designation of the Reinvestment Zone 2018-01.

The Court also discussed and approved the nomination of Cargill Meat Solutions Corporation for the Texas Enterprise Zone Program pursuant to Chapter 2303 of the Texas Government Code.

Next, the minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved. Approval was also given for the payment of the Accounts Payable which were presented by County Auditor Larry Johnston. The Treasurer's Report was given by Altha Herington and the Court approved the calculated payroll and disbursement for all Parmer County employees and elected officials.

The Commissioner's next considered and approved the lease of permanent school land in Gaines County to K&T Energy Partners, LLC. The Court also approved of the selling back of vacation time to a Parmer County employee and approved using the courthouse lawn for Bordertown Days on July 28, 2018.

The Court then considered a Mental Health Equipment Grant from the Texas Jail Commission. Permission was granted to Sheriff Randy Gerles to apply for and implement the 100% grant. Approval was also given to apply for a 50/50 matching bullet-proof vest grant.

All meetings are open to the public and the Commissioner's Court reserves the right to go into Executive Session at any time.

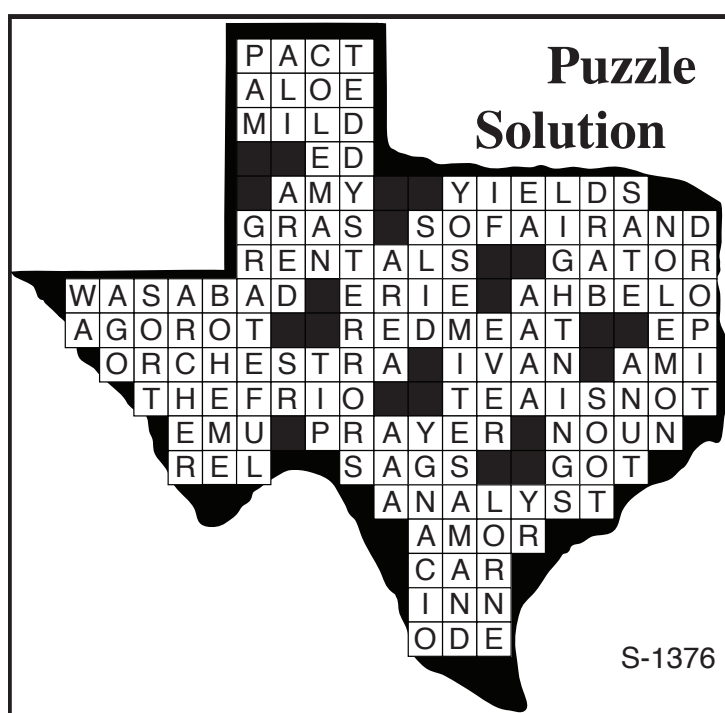

Psalm 77—Down, but not Out

Have you ever felt that your “soul refused to be comforted,” that you are “so troubled that you cannot speak,” or that the Lord “has forgotten to be gracious”? Being down in the doldrums to this extent is painful on so many levels, and this is exactly how the writer of Psalm 77 was feeling. The anguish of depression, the despair of lament and the overwhelming nature of the trials at hand were almost too much as depicted in the first 9 verses.

the deeds of the Lord; yes, I will remember your wonders of old.” The shift was not that the writer’s circumstances magically changed, but that through the tough times, the Psalmist changed his outlook. Instead of looking down and out, he begins to look up at the Lord, and recall God’s mighty wondrous deeds. When you are feeling down, take time to go to the Lord in prayer, with humble confidence that He hears everything we ask according to His will. In fact, focusing on His mighty deeds done in the past, pursuing Him by prayer and standing on His promises in the Word are foundational keys if you will be down, but not out.

Thankfully, Psalm 77 doesn’t end after verse 9, but in verses 10-11 the writer says, “Then I said, ‘I will appeal to this, to the years of the right hand of the Most High.’ I will remember

God is Needed in the Home

Last week I wrote about how we need God everywhere, including schools, communities, and churches. Today, I want to talk about where we need God first and foremost—in our homes.

Many times I have said we have lost a generation of adults. They don’t attend church; God doesn’t seem to be a priority; they are not teaching their children Scripture or taking their children to church. In fact, many use children’s programs at churches as a baby sitting service. No one has ever disagreed with me, so they either agree with me, or they don’t want to challenge me.

Churches here in Friona are trying to reach out to children and youth; trying to introduce them to Jesus and encourage them to have a personal relationship with Him; trying to get them to read Scripture and learn who Jesus is and what He is about. The problem is, churches only have a few hours a week to work with children and teen-agers; then, they go back into homes and situations where God is not talked about or taught. There are 168 hours in a week. If a child is in Sunday school, church, youth, etc., say five hours a week, that leaves 163 hours of

worldly influence on the lives of these young people. That is why it is so important that God be recognizable in our homes.

How do we get God into homes these days? First, we have to be real, authentic, honest Christians who live our lives according to God’s Word. We need to be an example; we need to be willing to tell our story of who God is in our lives and what He means to us. People are watching those of us who profess Jesus as our Lord and Savior.

Second, we need to get out of our comfort zones and invite people to church, Bible studies, church functions, so they can know Jesus. And, we don’t need to quit asking people if we get turned down.

Third, we need to pray and ask God who we need to talk to or invite; we need to ask Him to guide our words; we need to ask Him what we can do to help them want to know Jesus and have a relationship with Him.

Fourth, we need to be willing to spend time with people, discipling them, answering their questions, helping them get to know Jesus.

So what can parents do? I will cover that next week.
