Comptroller Distributes \$843 Million




Water Weekly For the week of 08/06/18


and encouraged me. I couldn't ask for more.

I approached the chair and he promoted me to Co-chair. I was able to lead the meeting with the Parliamentary procedure rules that were taught in FFA. (Thank you Mr. Morris) Calming the chaos and helping lead them smoothly through the process was my favorite part of the entire experience. Working through the organized debates were very entertaining and satisfying.

The finale was the LT. Governor/ governor race. Every time I spoke for this election, I was in front of more than 500 students at a time. Again, I was thanking Mr. Morris (FFA) and Mrs. Goodwin (Communications) for their mentoring in speaking. From this experience I gained a whole new respect for any major politician. From asking people to vote for me, to trying to stick to my gut rather than say what the crowd wanted to hear, to simply not being corrupted by chasing power, fake power might I add. Honestly, I felt like an imposter by making political promises for an office of which I will hold no real power. I did love the speaking and touring of the final elections. I had a front row seat to tons of drama between the boys clawing for power. I witnessed undermining, false accusations, and two-sided politicians on all sides all for a job with no real power. It makes me wonder how close it was to real political races. It was truly an impactful and an entertaining experience.

While I was surprised that discussions did not end up talking about President Trump all week, we did pass several humorous laws in Congress. We talked a lot about gun issues (because it's Texas) and we need to stand firm for our rights to bear arms. Texas will be in good hands with this next generation to come from politicians, to Academy grads, to new informed citizens, keeping their eye on the government. During this weekend's Texas Sales Tax Holiday, Aug. 10 - 12, certain items priced less than \$100 are exempt from state and local sales tax. But did you know shoppers can purchase much more than just school supplies tax-free? Keep the following three things in mind when you hit the stores.

1. Clothing and Footwear

Certain articles of clothing and footwear are tax-free

during the holiday. These include multi-purpose athletic clothing as well as professional and school uniforms that are purchased, not rented.

2. Non-Qualifying Items

Some items don't qualify. Clothing, footwear and protective-use gear specially designed for athletic activities are not included. However, multi-purpose clothing and footwear such as tennis shoes

qualify for the exemption. **3. Lesser-Known Items**

Xcel Energy serving record demand this summer Texas-New Mexico customers gain from recent investments in power systems

AMARILLO, Texas (July 30, 2018) - A July heat wave that baked Texas and New Mexico provided a good test for Xcel Energy's investments in generating capabilities and an improved high-voltage transmission network as demand on the company's regional transmission system reached 6,151 megawatts on July 19 - several weeks ahead of the anticipated summer peak.

A single megawatt is enough electricity to serve up to 500 typical homes in this region.

"Overall, our ability to supply the vast amount of electricity needed to meet this record demand has been largely unhindered, which is a direct result of the investments we've made in power lines, substations and power generating capacity," said David Hudson, president, Xcel Energy - New "This large Mexico, Texas. amount of demand would

have caused serious concerns just a few years ago before we made these critical upgrades."

Xcel Energy has been freeing up power plant capacity that was historically reserved by wholesale customers such as rural electrical cooperatives and municipal utilities, which are increasingly procuring their own power supplies. As power demand grows in Xcel Energy's service area, this capacity has become available to area towns and cities at a cost much lower than the cost of building new power plants. Hudson pointed out that the July peak was 350 megawatts above forecasted demand, and without the extra capacity from area power plants, the company would've had a difficult time meeting customer needs.

Along with power plant capacity, Xcel Energy has greatly

"The investments we're making are designed with the idea that our Texas-New Mexico service region will continue to grow economically, and it is our responsibility to be prepared for this growth," Hudson said.

Xcel Energy's strategy for serving the growing economies in its Texas and New Mexico service area is detailed in an initiative called "Our Energy Future," which focuses on building practical investments for the fu-

ture, delivering affordable and reliable energy, and developing a diverse energy portfolio with environmental foresight. More information can be found at www. xcelenergy.com/ourenergyfuturesw.



expanded its import capabilities through new high-voltage transmission connections that Over the past several years, have opened the region up to a wider power market. And

with new lines such as the recently completed line between Hobbs and the Carlsbad area, the expanded network within the region is better able to move this extra power to growing load centers such as the southeast New Mexico oil fields.

Hudson said the company also is planning more than a dozen new distribution substations to relieve loading on existing facilities that, in the heat of the summer, operate at maximum capacity. A recent expansion in the Bushland, Texas, area is one of several enhancements planned for metro Amarillo, where customer demand has also surged this summer.





Gasoline prices remain steady

Gasoline prices in Texas are unchanged in the past week, averaging \$2.64/g yesterday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 13,114 stations in Texas. This compares with the national average that is unchanged versus last week to \$2.86/g, according to GasBuddy.

Including the change locally during the past week, prices yesterday were 47.6 cents per gallon higher than a year ago and are 1.7 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has dropped 0.7 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 52.1 cents per gallon higher than a year ago.

"The national average price of gasoline jumped to start last week before slowly tapering off during the latter half, but remains very close to their

week ago levels. Oil prices have held under \$70 per barrel, giving promise to gas prices that will continue to hold south of \$3 per gallon and near where they have spent much of the summer so far," said Patrick DeHaan, head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy. "With several bullish and bearish factors weighing on oil prices, you may see gas prices stuck in some sort of late summer blues before motorists see more sizable relief coming after Labor Day. Refiners continue to hum along meeting high demand with few kinks, leading to gas prices that have remained between \$2.80-\$2.89 per gallon the entire summer thus far."






