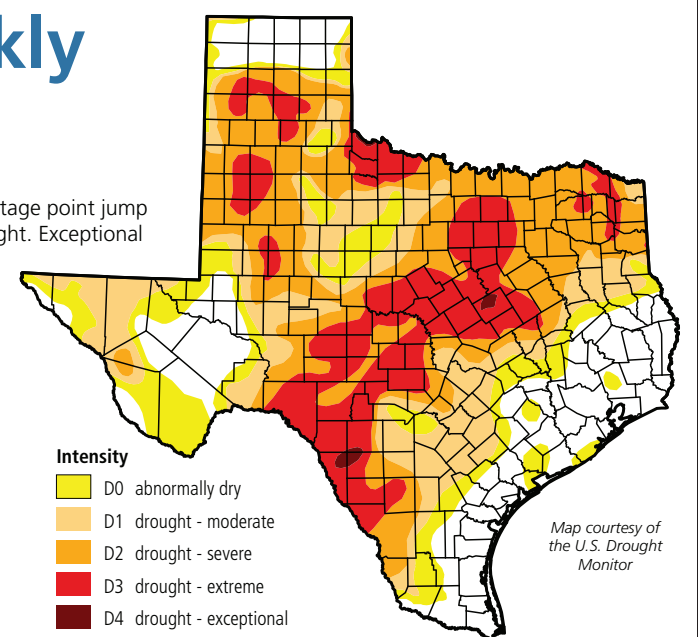

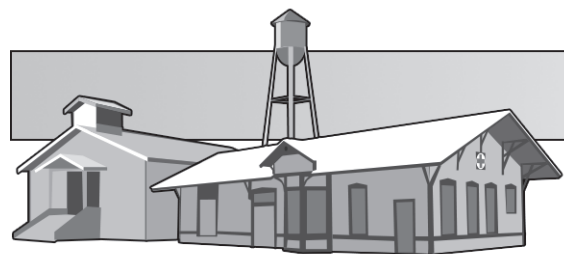

## FRIONA FLASHBACKS

From the Friona Star Archives

**August 19 2010:** Gene Zachary a 1959 FHS graduate makes crosses for a hobby. During his tenure with the district, Zachary recovered some wood from the 1950 old gym floor and the original high school football field bleachers. Zachary has turned the wood into historical crosses in various sizes and now selling them out on the park during Maize Days.

**August 18 1990:** Friona area receives some nice rainfall for three consecutive days. On Tuesday, we received an inch, on Wednesday .38 in, and .17 in on Thursday. Jim Dixon explained that they received 7 or 8 inches through out the year. The rainy weather brought the

cool temperatures down to 80s and 70s.

**August 24 1980:** Sports fans have a chance this weekend to see the Houston Astros, leaders of the division play on television on cable Channel 9, since they are playing the Chicago Cubs. In this area we have been virtually deprived of even a radio broadcast of their games.

Therefore, it will be a treat to get to see two or three of their games, particularly since the team is making a bid for the division of championship. If it had not been for the bad luck of J.R. Richard, their leading pitcher, who suffered the blood clot and a stroke and is out of season, the Astros would be favored

to probably get into their first World Series. Now they have to fight harder.

**August 20 1970:** The Friona Chamber of Commerce has accepted an invitation extended by Governor Preston Smith to participate in the 3rd annual Governors conference on industrial expansion to be held on Tuesday, October 13, 1970. More than a thousand people are expected to attend the day-long conference from through out the state. The program will allow Texas to honor expanding industries and reveal for the first time the result of the inter-state study plant location incentives being offered by the nations leading industrial states.

Blake Shoppe sales will start before the parade at 9:00 a.m. Adult raffle, adult bingo and Cow Patty Bingo begin after the parade. A Roast Beef Lunch with all the trimmings will be served from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. in the Community

Hall at 104 First Street. \$10.00 for adults; \$5.00 for those ten and younger. Children's Games and water vents run from 12:00 noon-4:00 p.m., as well as the Children's Raffle and Children's Bingo. There will be "all day pass" armband prices; ages 8 and up-\$10.00; 7 and under- \$5.00. livestock donated by local ranchers and parishioners and goods donated by area business, will be auctioned, beginning at 1:00 p.m. Due to large attendance at the auction, you are invited

to bring lawn chairs for your comfort. A Hamburger Supper may be enjoyed from 5:00-8:00 p.m. in the Community Hall. Prices on a regular hamburger would be \$7.00 and \$9.00 for a double meat, soft drinks and waters for \$1.00. Live music under the awning after the auction is over. All proceeds from the day will benefit Holy Family Catholic Church. Nazareth is 18 miles west of Interstate 27 on Route 86, where it intersects with Farm to market 168.

## Tommie Mercer Remembers

Tommie's memories of nursing in Parmer County Community Hospital began Labor Day Weekend in 1953. She and Sue Smith stepped off a bus in down town Friona to begin their nursing careers. They were recent graduates of the Methodist Hospital School of Nursing in Dallas, Texas. They read about the hospital in the "American Journal of Nursing", and James M. Baxter, administrator, sent a letter to the nursing school advertising for nurses. The Parmer County Community Hospital was paying a top wage of \$250 which was more than the Dallas hospital paid.

Tommie and Sue left Dallas with three other nursing graduates one of whom was Helen Enochs Lowe, a cousin of Deke Kendrick. (Helen's home was in Amarillo.) Af-

ter catching the bus to Friona, they found their way to lodging and then to the hospital which was made from barracks purchased from the prisoner of war camp at Hereford, Texas. The hospital was located at the northwest corner of highway 60 and Cleveland Avenue.

Tommie remembers nurses Thelma Jones and Mable Hartwell who "taught them everything".

The chair in the photo, donated to the Parmer County Museum by the Parmer County Community Hospital, is one used by Dr. Shackelford, a dentist whose office was also in the hospital. Tommie remembers Dr. Lee told her many tonsils were removed as patients sat in the chair, so obviously the chair had many uses.



The Parmer County Pioneer Heritage Museum is open from 11:00 a.m. until 4 p.m. on Monday and Friday every week. It is full of awesome exhibits, has air conditioning, and makes a great field trip. It is located at 218 W. 6th in Friona.

## Texas Economy Adds 23,500 Positions in July

AUSTIN - The Texas economy added 23,500 seasonally adjusted non-farm jobs in July, which marked 25 consecutive months of employment growth. Over the year, Texas added 377,100 jobs for an annual employment growth rate of 3.1 percent. Private-sector employers added 25,900 positions over the month. Texas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained at 4.0 percent in July, unchanged from June 2018.

"Private-sector employers continue to boost the Texas economy adding another 25,900 jobs in July and 372,700 jobs over the year, said Texas Workforce Com-

mission (TWC) Chair Ruth Ruggiero Hughs. "Thanks to the innovation and expansion by employers in a wide range of industries, Texans continue to be offered more opportunities to demonstrate their first-class skills and start a career in the nation's #1 state for business."

July's annual growth in the state's Goods Producing industries was strong at 6.2 percent. Over the month, Construction led all major industries, adding 10,500 jobs.

In Texas' Service Providing sector, Trade, Transportation and Utilities added 7,500 positions over the month. Also within this sector, Education and Health Services added

6,400 jobs, followed by Leisure and Hospitality with a gain of 5,700 positions.

"The Texas labor force continues to provide employers with the skills and expertise needed to keep the Texas economy growing," said TWC Commissioner Representing Labor Julian Alvarez. "TWC is continually committed to developing innovative workforce programs and supporting Texas businesses with a skilled talent pipeline that is unmatched throughout the nation."
