These allocations are based on sales made in July by businesses that report tax monthly.

Texas Crop and Weather Report

PANHANDLE: Conditions were hot and windy with near-normal temperatures for most of the district. Some moisture was received, but more was needed throughout the district. Crops were under irrigation. Pasture and rangeland were expected to go dormant soon if rainfall does not occur. Extreme temperatures in Hall County zapped moisture from pastures and crops. If high temperatures persist, crops, cattle and pastures will continue to decline. Irrigated cotton was good to excellent. With a timely rain, dry-land cotton would look excellent as well.

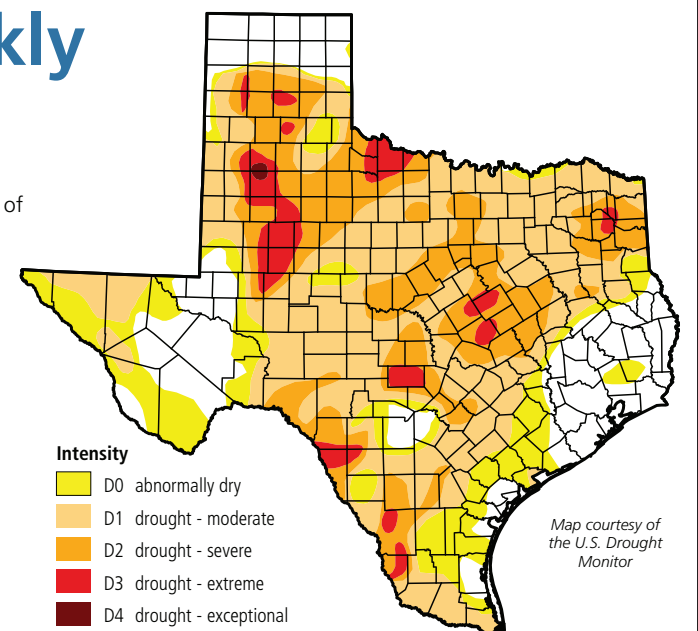

Mayor's Minutes by Ricky White

The City of Friona received an appreciation letter from Coffee Memorial Blood Center, thanking our community for many citizens donating blood that help save lives. On August 23, there were 54 people that signed up to donate and 45 were able to donate. This is another example of how this community gets involved and participates in helping people in need. The letter also singled out Clint Mears, thanking him for his efforts scheduling and organizing this event. We also appreciate and thank the Noon Lions Club for their participation and providing food to the people who donate. Coffee Memorial Blood Center depends upon cities like Friona and value our continued commitment to donate blood and showing compassion for patients in this region. Job well done!!!!

The City of Friona was awarded the Texas Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) in 2017 for the construction of approximately 1900 feet of 10-inch water line and associated appurtenances for a water distribution system improvement project. The construction will began on Walnut Avenue north of Highway 60 to 14th Street and on

14th Street between Walnut and Jackson. The grant and all associated project management has been handled by the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission (PRPC) on behalf of the city of Friona. There were four individual bids received and the winning bid was awarded to Scott Wampler Construction & Services, LLC of Canyon Texas. The construction will begin in October and is to be completed in 180 calendar days.

It's year end for the city and it's once again time to reset the city budget. The city council met on September 6th to participate in a budget workshop. On September 10th the city council voted and approved the new city budget. The city budget totals, \$4,105,770.00 for 2018-2019. Last years budget was \$4,998,750.00, a difference of \$892,980.00. If you would like to look at the city budget in more detail, you can go to the city web site, www.cityoffriona.com. Leander Davila, City Manager, did a very good job preparing this budget

Chief Jimenez and the police officers responded to 164 calls in August. There were 74 stops, 36 warnings, 38 citations and 5 arrests. (2-Possession of Marijuana, 1-public

intoxication and 2-warrant). The officers drove 3688 miles in August patrolling and protecting our city. Chief Jimenez has recently hired two new officers and our police department is fully manned.

Volunteer Fire Department responded to four emergency calls in August. On August 22, seven fire fighters and two trucks responded to a grass fire. On August 27, there were a total of three emergency calls, two grass fires and a truck fire. There were eleven fire fighters and four trucks responding to both grass fires and ten fire fighters and four trucks responding to the truck fire. When there are multiple calls in one day, the volunteers do a great job handling these extreme circumstances. Great job volunteers!!!!

Judge Campbell had 41 new cases in August. Total fines collected totaled \$2,918.78 and court cost equaled \$1,111.75.

Emergency Medical Service made a total of 27 runs in August. There were eight calls for 911, 16 transfers, and 3 calls ended in a "no transport".

Payments collected equaled \$12,653.71 and billing totaled \$39,878.70.

The city pumped 19,241,700 gallons of water in August and sold 17,363,000 gallons of water. Total billing equaled \$84,404.33 on 1430 accounts. The city has been spraying for mosquitoes and will continue for a couple more weeks.

Friona Public Library had 910 patron visits in August an average of 41 visits per day and was open for 22 days. There were a total of 781 items circulated and 42 new items added to inventory.

Accounts payable totaled \$183,543.73 for the month of August. There were two large expenditures, \$30,450.00 for the Texas

Community Development Block Grant for engineering expenses and \$14,113.75 to Bank of New York for the last interest payment on a \$1,000,000 dollar loan back in 2008. The city will write a check for \$672,770.54 payable to Prosperity Bank and will be free of this loan. This is a great accomplishment for the city. Your Mayor, Ricky White

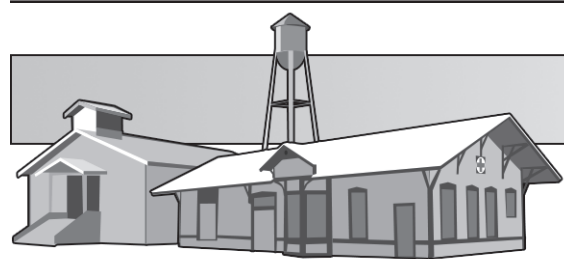

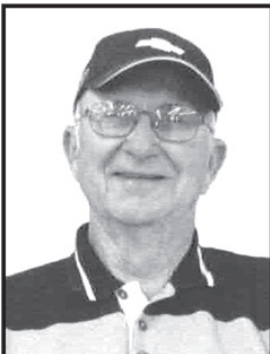

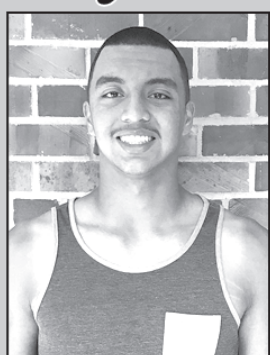

FRIONA FLASHBACKS

From the Friona Star Archives

September 11, 1993

Sr. Citizen of Friona will be hosting a stew and chili supper on September 22 from 5-7 p.m. in conjunction with Maize Days. The price will be \$5 for adults and \$2.50 for children under ten. The menu includes chili of stew with cornbread, cobbler, and ice cream. Everyone is cordially invited to attend the supper and then go to City Park for gospel singing.

September 14, 1980

The Parmer county Commissioners approved the county's budget for 1980-81 during a hearing on Monday in the County Courtroom in Farwell. The new budget is in the amount of \$1,067,334, which is an increase of just \$18,883 over the current year's budget. Bernie Gowens, the county auditor, went over the proposed budget line by line and explained various funds, how they are arrived at; what the expenses are expected to be for 1981 versus the income. The ad valorem taxes will be increased some 66 2/3 per cent, due to inflation which has snowballed in recent years. County Judge Porter Roberts explained that the county had been allowing for inflation in recent years by using from the county's surplus funds in recent years. Now, these funds have been depleted and in addition, the county has lost an annual payment from the lateral road program, and may not receive revenue sharing funds this year. Despite the raise in the tax ratio (from 15 per cent of fair market value to 25 per cent), the county will still have transfer some \$180,000 out of its right of way funds in order to have a balanced budget. The 1981 budget provides for very few capital improvements, but does provide for salary raises of approximately 15 per cent for county employees, whose salaries have been sadly lagging behind comparable counties.

September 3, 1970

Field day offers a trip to Acapulco. An expense-paid vacation trip for two to Acapulco Mexico plus \$500 in cash will be awarded to the lucky High Plains Research Foundation member who wins the door prize drawing during the opening activities of the 14th Annual Field Day September 10. Sponsors making the trip available are Plainview Co-op Compress, City National Bank. The drawing will be made during the program. Merchandise door prizes also will be awarded. The Annual Field Day will feature three field stops on the guided tour of foundation reaserch plots. As an added feature, Dr. Tom Longnecker has announced that Dennis Money, Foundation agronomist, will conduct the Foundation's popular slide program of minimum tillage studies. The slide presentation has been acclaimed by farmers who have viewed the program as stimulating and informative.

September 12, 1968

People who sign up for social security only to gain Medicare coverage are often amazed to learn that they will also be drawing some checks for the year, according to Wayne Klipping, social security Field Representative for this area. For instance, a person entitled to a monthly benefit of \$122.90 who expects to earn \$3,000 in 1968 would draw a check of \$17.40 for June 1968 and full checks for the rest of the year." This is possible because of the liberalized retirement test under the present social security law" Klipping said. "A social security beneficiary can earn \$1680 per year and draw his checks every month. If his earnings are \$2880 is subtracted from the total benefits payable for the year. If earnings are over \$2880, an additional one dollar for every \$2880 is subtracted from benefits payable. Anyone wishing to make an application for benefits should see Klipping in the Council Room at the Friona City Hall from 9 a.m. until noon on the third Tuesday of each month.

That means that not only is there not much, if any Christian presence in those people groups, but that many of those people have never heard the gospel of Jesus Christ! This staggering information should burden and motivate the church to reach out intentionally and passionately with the gospel.

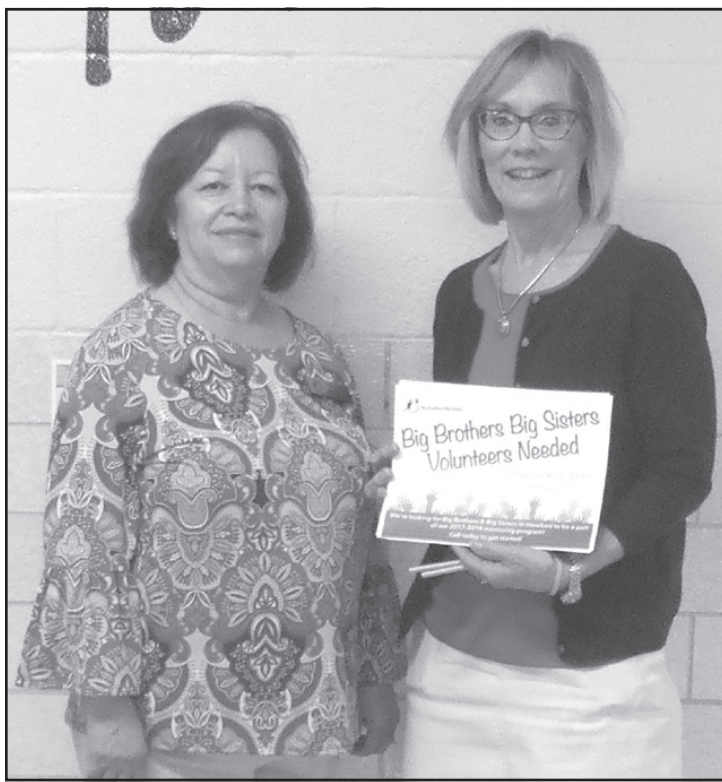

County Commissioners discuss contracts

The Parmer County Commissioners Court met in regular session on Monday, September 10th at 10:00 a.m. in the County Courtroom of the Parmer County Courthouse in Farwell, Texas. All commissioners were present. The meeting began with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and the Texas Flag.

The Minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved. Approval was also given for the payment of the accounts payables as presented by County Auditor Larry Johnston. The Commissioners also reviewed the Treasurer's Report presented by Altha Herington and approved the calculated payroll and disbursement for all county employees and elected officials.

Next, the Court renewed the Conduent contract. This contract involves the computer software that allows the county to store and back-up all county transactions that are mandated by the State of Texas to be recorded and maintained.

The next item of business was the transfer of funds from the Contingency Fund to the 4 precincts in Parmer County. Each precinct will receive \$50,000 from the fund.

The Commissioners then discussed the contract with Indigent Health Care Solution Services. This \$1,200 per month service helps the county spend its money effectively when providing health care for inmates at the Law Enforcement Center. The contract expires in December. No action was taken.

Sheriff Randy Geries reported that there are currently 37 inmates in the Law Enforcement Center including 6 being detained for Deaf Smith County.

All meetings are open to the public. The Commissioners Court reserves the right to go into Executive session at any time. Meeting agendas can be found on the Parmer County website. 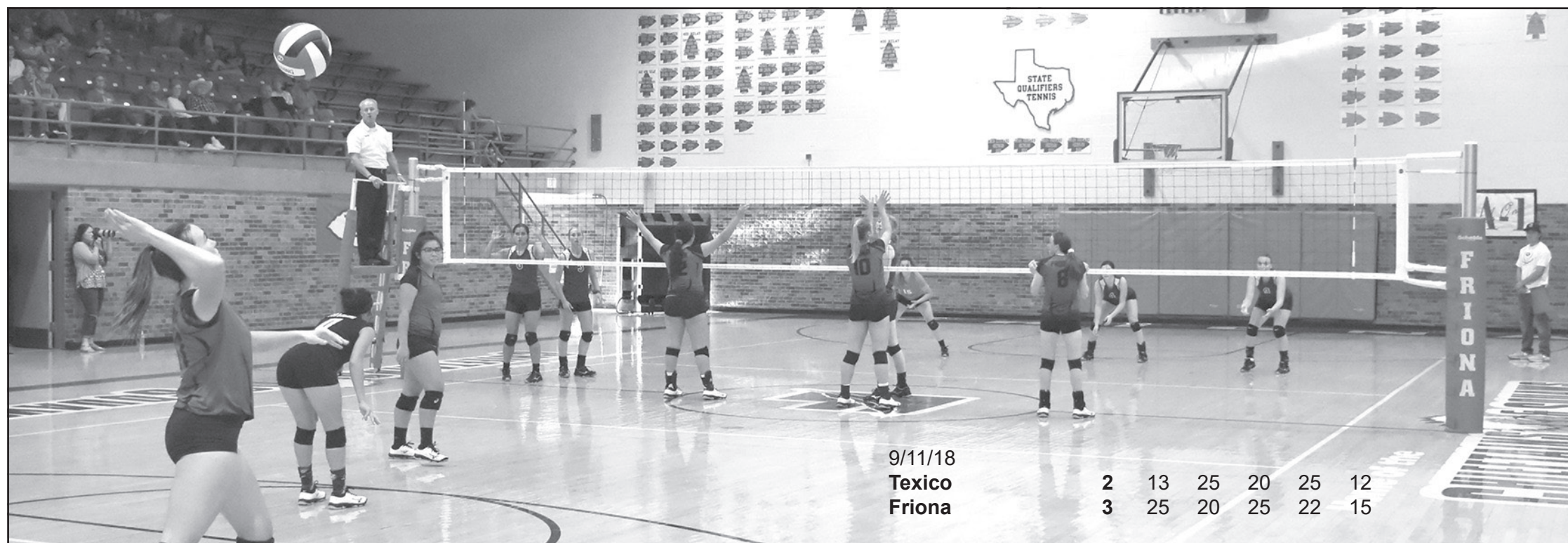

Texas Weekly Fuel Update and Outlook

Gasoline prices in Texas have risen 0.8 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$2.60/g yesterday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 13,114 stations in Texas. This compares with the national average that has increased 1.6 cents per gallon versus last week to \$2.84/g, according to GasBuddy.

Including the change locally during the past week, prices yesterday were 9.8 cents per gallon higher than a year ago and are 2.8 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has dropped 2.4 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 18.1 cents per gallon higher than a year ago.

"Last week saw a brief and fairly tame rise in the national average, brought on mainly by a select few states where gas prices tend to be volatile. Overall, it was a mostly stable week with some up and down movement state-by-state, but now we await the changeover to winter gasoline that happens this Saturday for some relief at the pump," said Patrick DeHaan, head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy. "While Hurricane Florence may pose fuel-related challenges for areas of the East Coast, there is little to no threat to refineries at this time and is thus unlikely to bring measurable impact to the national average price of gasoline, but could bring supply challenges to several states, depending on levels of evacuations and timing of them. Hurricane season aside, gasoline demand will likely drift lower nearly nationwide, putting some additional downward impact on prices in most communities over the next few weeks."

Friona has a phishing problem

There has been an outbreak of computer scammers in Friona recently. Marca Herring at Friona Interbank called and told us that several people have had to close their accounts because of the problem. While viruses can be bad, phishing is the larger issue.

Modern computers aren't as susceptible to viruses as they used to be. Operating systems like Windows have had years to learn what viruses look like. Most web browsers and email programs are great about blocking harmful content.

To gain access to people's computers, scammers usually require help from the victims themselves. It is a process called phishing, and it is very common.

The way it works is:

1.) You click on an email or visit a web page that looks like

a legitimate windows message. The message might say something like, "Your computer has a virus! Call this number to fix the problem!"

2.) You call the number and the person on the other end says, "No problem, visit this other website and tell me the code it shows you."

3.) You give them the code, and they say thank you. Now your mouse pointer is moving by itself and the scammer has full control of your computer.

Once a scammer has access to your computer, there are many things they can do to extort money from you. Remember that if your computer ever tells you to call a phone number, it is probably a scam. Be careful about what you download, and don't install anything unless you know for sure what it is.

DO NOT open any email attachments that end with: .exe, .scr, .bat, .com, or other executable files you do not recognize.

DO NOT ever click embedded links in messages without hovering your mouse over them first to check the URL.

DO NOT "unsubscribe" - it is easier to delete the e-mail than to deal with the security risks.

DO NOT respond or reply to spam in any way. Use the delete button.



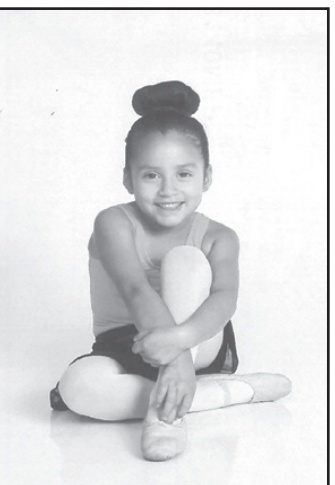
