### Parmer Medical Center Offering Influenza Shots

Parmer Medical Center and Friona Rural Health Clinic are once again going to be offering a Flu Shot Clinic at Friona Senior Citizens. The influenza (flu) vaccinations will be given at the Friona Senior Citizens building located at 1410 Washington on Monday, September 24th from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Two different types of vaccinations are being offered this year. The Quadrivalent vaccine protects against four types of influenza - the same three strains as the standard flu shot, plus an additional B-strain virus. This is the same vaccine we offered last year. We are also offering the Fluzone-HD which is more commonly referred to as the "High Dose" flu vaccine. Information from the CDC website regarding the Fluzone-

HD vaccine will be available. This may assist individuals in determining which vaccination they want to receive.



The charge for the vaccinations will be totally covered if the recipient is a subscriber to traditional Medicare. You will need to present your Medicare card and driver's license at the time of the injection. For all other vaccination recipients, the cost for the Quadrivalent injection is \$29.00 and the Fluzone-HD is \$75.00.

Medicaid will not cover the charge for the vaccinations received at Friona Senior Citizens but will cover the cost for vaccinations received at Friona Rural Health Clinic located at 1307 Cleveland Avenue. For more information, call Rhonda Wilkins at 806-250-2754 or Jeff Proctor at 806-250-2781.

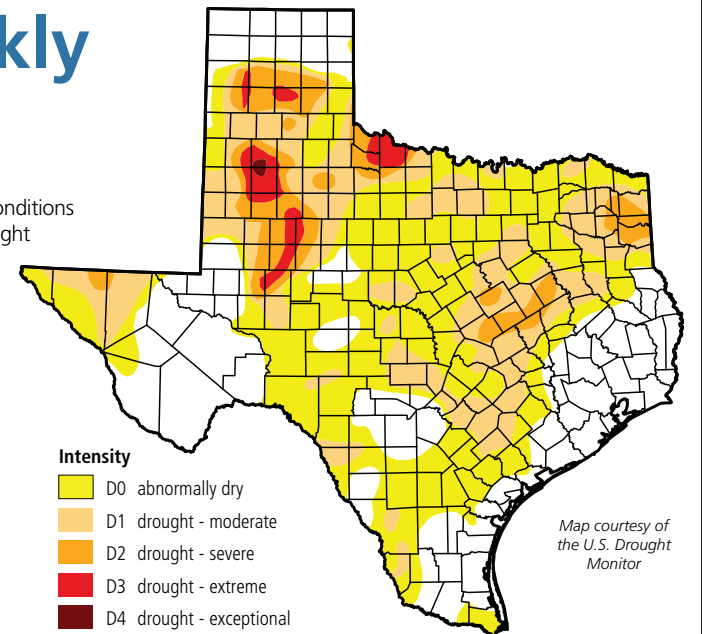

**A Blast from the Past at the Junior High**

Seventh graders in David Gonzales' Texas History classes were treated to a blast from the past in honor of Homecoming and Maize Days last week. Five members of Parmer County Retired Teachers and School Personnel discussed the history of the Junior High building with the students on Sept. 18th.

Mr. Gonzales began the class by encouraging the students to be involved in the community and reminding them to choose a civics project which will count as their first semester test. He emphasized that preventing and reporting vandalism is their civic duty. He introduced the five retired teachers, each one having retired after many years of service to the Friona school system. Each person discussed his/her experience while in the current Junior High building.

Sharon White explained that the Junior High building was once the high school. She graduated from Friona High School in 1963 and then returned to that building to teach from 1967 to 1969 before continuing her career with several other assignments, including Primary principal. She showed pictures of the Junior High faculty her first year of teaching and shared the 1929 yearbook, the year her father, Hadley Reeve, graduated from FHS. She also explained an old Maize Days tradition, the making of class floats.

Harley Merritt taught in the junior high building from 1965 until 1969. He then moved to the high school where he served as biology instructor until retirement. He reminded the kids that they are making their own history and it is up to them to make it a good one.

Mickey Griffin taught in the junior high from 1966 until 2003. He discussed physical changes in the building such as the heating and air conditioning system, the improvement of the playground area, and the demise of the tennis court. He was also the chief

room painter for many years, stating that he and his crew had painted each classroom in the school system four or five times over the years.

Dale Mann discussed changes in technology and in teacher and classroom resources during her time as an ELA and ESL teacher. She served students in the junior high from 1992 until 2007. She was also Student Council sponsor and encouraged the kids to be involved in student government and extracurricular activities.

Connie Slagle discussed changes in the science department between 1974 and 2013. She told the kids that the building housed fifth through eighth grade and was extremely crowded her first years. When the fifth grade moved to the elementary school in 1982, there was space for a designated lab room. It underwent modernization, making it TEA compliant, in 1995. The \$75,000 renovation was facilitated by funds from the Canadian school system through the Robin Hood program.

Several of the presenters

mentioned the old red school building and fondly remembered former co-workers. Each one emphasized that teachers, their co-workers, and students often form lasting friendships. Many current faculty members who were

former students of the retired teachers joined the classes throughout the day. The students were very polite and receptive, and Parmer County RTSP thanks Mr. Gonzales and Mr. Galdean for this opportunity.

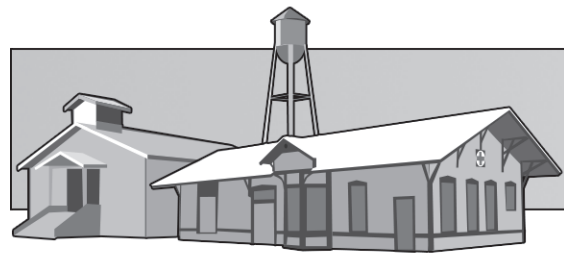

### September 20, 2012

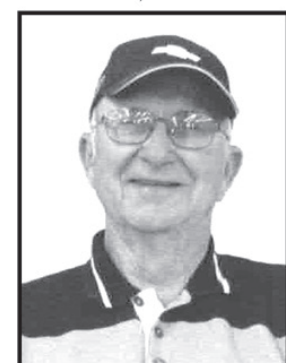

# Three P's of God

You may have heard that early last Wednesday morning, Feller got a helicopter ride to Lubbock UMC. What he thought/hoped was a muscle pull, turned out to be two blood clots in his lower right lung.

What amazed me was how God had prepared us for this. I am usually behind on everything when something like this happens. When my dad passed away, we had just gotten home from Ruidoso, and I had to wash clothes to go to his funeral. This time, all of my washing was done; my house was straight; I had a full tank of gas; all of my bills were paid; and, I had bubblegum. I never buy bubblegum to have around the house; I buy it when I go on trips by myself, and I know I am leaving tired and will probably get sleepy. # Texas Weekly Fuel Update and Outlook

Gasoline prices in Texas have fallen 0.6 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$2.60/g yesterday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 13,114 stations in Texas. This compares with the national average that has increased 0.5 cents per gallon versus last week at \$2.84/g, according to GasBuddy. Including the change locally during the past week, prices yesterday were 13.0 cents per gallon higher than a year ago and are 0.8 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has increased 0.5 cents per gallon dur-

ing the last month and stands 23.8 cents per gallon higher than a year ago.

"With several areas of tropical weather moving away from the U.S. comes some breathing room for energy markets, with oil prices under pressure as the risk premium subsides, setting the stage for some relief at the gas pump as we progress through the week," said Patrick DeHaan, head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy. "Despite the tremendous blow and flooding of the Carolinas, Florence's impact on oil delivery and refinery opera-

tions was next to nothing. Florence may make an impact on local pipelines in Florence's path with power loss and flooding possible issues, but problems will be worked around as life pauses in these areas and where we see considerable demand destruction taking place as floods keep motorists from moving. In addition, this week marks the first full week of cheaper winter gasoline across most of the country as EPA regulations see their seasonal ease. This, coupled with lower demand in the weeks ahead, will push retail gasoline prices lower."
