Foard County voters are expected to turn out in large numbers next Tuesday, November 5, to cast ballots in the general election and will vote on offices all the way from the President of the United States to county commissioner. In addition, fourteen proposed amendments to the Constitution of the State of Texas will appear on the ballot.

In previous elections voters have been called on to use either the scratch method or the checking of a square by the name of the candidate of their choice. This year the check method is to be used. If the voter desires to vote a straight ticket, a square at the top by the name of each party will simplify voting.

#### Voting Places

Voting will be from 8 a. m. until 7 p. m. in the following locations:

Precinct 1: county clerk's office; Mrs. Betty Tamplen, presiding judge; Mrs. Bernice Huskey, assistant.

Precinct No. 2: county judge's office. L. A. Andrews will be the presiding judge with Ray Hysinger as his assistant.

Precinct No. 3: sheriff's office. Mr. and Mrs. Bob Thomas will serve as presiding judge and assistant, respectively.

Precinct No. 4: county attorney's office; Otis Gafford, presiding judge; Herbert Fish, assistant.

Precinct No. 5: community center in Margaret; J. S. Owens, Sr., presiding judge; Mrs. Lillie Bledsoe, assistant.

Precinct No. 6: Thalia Gin with T. H. Matthews presiding judge, and Mrs. Sim V. Gamble, assistant.

Precinct No. 7: Thalia school. T. R. Cates, Jr. will be presiding judge, and Mrs. Maggie Capps will be assistant.

Precinct No. 8: Foard City Church with Jack Welch serving as presiding judge, and Clyde Owens assistant.

Precinct No. 11: Rayland Gin with Mr. and Mrs. Tom Lawson serving as presiding judge and assistant, respectively.

#### Ballot

In the presidential race, the Democratic ticket is headed by Hubert Humphrey with Edmund Muskie as his running mate; the Republican candidates are Richard M. Nixon and Spiro Agnew, and the American Party's standard-bearer is George C. Wallace, with General Curtis LeMay as his running mate.

In ten of the state and national races, the Republican Party has candidates listed.

In a race drawing much interest, in addition to the presidential race, is that of U. S. Representative from the 13th District where Republican Frank Crowley is trying to unseat the veteran Congressman, Democrat Graham B. Purcell.

Preston Smith, Democrat, is opposed by Republican Paul Eggers in the race for governor; and Democrat Ben Barnes in his race for lieutenant governor is opposed by Republican Doug DeCluit. Crawford C. Martin, Democratic nominee for attorney general, is pitted against Republican Sproesser Wynn in that race, while Robert S. Calvert, Democratic nominee for Comptroller of Public Accounts, has drawn Republican John M. Bennett, Jr., as his opponent.

In the race for state treasurer, Democrat Jesse James is opposed by Republican Manuel Sanchez; and for Commissioner of General Land Office, Republican Millard K. Neptune is challenging Democrat Jerry Sadler. John C. White, Commissioner of Agriculture, has drawn E. G. Schuhart, II, as his Republican opponent; and in the only other challenged race, Democrat Jim C. Langdon is pitted against Republican Jim Segrest for Railroad Commissioner.

Sears McGee, Tom Reavley and Zolite Steakley are unopposed in their bids for places on the Supreme Court, and W. A. Morrison and Leon Douglas are without Republican opponents in their quest for places as judges in the courts of criminal appeals.

W. S. Healy is running unopposed as State Representative, as is James Joy for the court of civil appeals, District 7. Bill Neal is unopposed in the district attorney's race, and in county-wide races, Foster Davis is unopposed.
