Gholson, Texan

In 1857, Texas was little more than a vast wilderness. There was a fringe of civilization along the Gulf Coast, around San Antonio in South Texas, and along the Texas border, with a few isolated settlements as far west as the central part of the State. But as for the remainder—a vast, vast wilderness.—Texas Almanac, 1925.

The foregoing paragraph, taken from the Texas Almanac, shows clearly what the condition of the State of Texas was during the period from 1842 to 1860. To travel over and look at Central and West Texas today one could hardly believe that that vast, vast wilderness had been conquered and handed over to civilization in so short a time.

But such was really done. A peaceful and enlightened population now carry on in peace, happiness and prosperity where a half century ago there was a "vast, vast wilderness".

Most of that generation of men—the Texas pioneers—whom most of the credit is due for this wonderful accomplishment, have passed on to the Great Beyond, while we, the younger generation, become (and I fear without fully appreciating) the beneficiaries of their toils and struggles.

Approximately 125,000 people were living in Texas when she became a member of the Union in 1846. Only a scattered remnant of those citizens of the Lone Star Republic are living today to bear witness to its glorious existence.

Benjamin Franklin Gholson, of Evans County, is one of those few survivors. He is one of the few living who had personal acquaintance with those great Texans, Gen. Sam Houston, Gen. Ed. Burleson and Thomas Ross.

This hardy old frontiersman and his wife live just on the edge of Lampasas County about three miles south of Abilene. They have been married sixty-two years and have lived on the same place for the last fifty-five years, where they have reared their family of nine children.

This couple, still alert, genial, hospitable and apparently free from any bitterness of past struggles, are interesting in their present life, but due to his long and eventful career, Mr. Gholson has long been known far and wide as an outstanding example of the Texas pioneer.

Equally well known is he for his fairmindedness and good citizenship. Being a man of good, natural intellect and wonderful memory, he has stored in his mind much valuable historical data. Not only can he give exact dates of important events of his life, but can usually give a detailed description of the weather on that date also.

It was a little over seventy years ago that Mr. Gholson, then a lad of 13, first passed through the gap in the Lampasas Mountains, near where his house now stands, and since known as Gholson's Gap.

He had made that immediate section his home ever since, although much of the first twenty years of that time was spent in the ranger service and the Civil War.

Besides his Civil War service and many minor rubs with the Indians, he took part in several major expeditions against the savages of West Texas. Notable among these was the campaign in which Cynthia Ann Parker was captured and her husband,

Chief Noco, was killed. Gholson's Gap has a history still its own which, for lack of space, is left out of this article.

One thing, though, in regard to it I wish to make mention of. During my visit to Mr. Gholson, my attention was called to an article published recently in one of the leading newspapers of Texas, in which the writer described Gholson's Gap as a rugged cleft through a mountain, shrouded in heavy timber with a mad torrent flowing through it, and so gloomy and dismal that only ghosts and evil spirits would approach it.

As a matter of fact the only timber about the gap is what is known as mountain brush. It is some distance to water of any kind. Large boulders and cliffs abound near it, but a State highway passes through it, and the view one gets from the top of the gap is decidedly one of the most peaceful and beautiful to be found in Texas.

Spraying
Date Soon

At the present time, it looks like the spray date for the pecan nut case-bearer will be some time between May 20-25, 1977. The exact date has not yet been determined. Field checks will be made this week to determine the optimum date. Also, we will try to put the date on the public announcement board by the courthouse.

Recommended sprays for the homeowner include Sev-in, Malathion and Zolone. Malathion may not be as effective as some of the other chemicals unless applied at the optimum time.

These chemicals plus Guthion, Thiodan and others are recommended for commercial growers.

City Sales Tax
Rebate Checks
Report

State Comptroller, Bob Bullock, has announced his office has mailed monthly City Sales tax rebate checks totaling \$22 million to 867 Texas cities and towns that assess the 1% tax.

The May checks bring the total rebates for the eight months of the current fiscal year to \$253.3 million, a \$44 million increase over the same fiscal period of 1976.

Goldthwaite received a total of \$1,479.28 during this period, bringing the 1977 payments to a total of \$10,019.39.

Following shows the total city sales tax rebate checks received by the surrounding Mills County towns: Brownwood - \$30,385.72 (this period) making a total of \$207,699.94 during 1977; Hamilton - \$3,115.54 (this period) for a total of 1977 payments of \$21,518.32; Lampasas - \$8,179.77 (this period) for a total of 1977 payments of \$52,832.58; San Saba - \$4,707.99 (this period) for a total of 1977 payments of \$24,836.92.
