Part of the men, including Miss Ellen Earl presented us that flag with an address. The address was replied to by Lieut. Sul Ross.

We marched directly to Fort Belknap. When we arrived, there were other companies of Texas Rangers assembling. There were nine of the companies in all.

Col. M.T. Johnson had authority to organize those companies into a regiment, which was done on the parade ground at Fort Belknap, near where Newcastle now stands.

S.P. Ross, better known as Pete Ross, held a commission as Captain. He was instructed by Sam Houston, then Governor of Texas, to go to Fort Cobb, then headquarters for the Indian Territory, enlist Plasedo, chief of the Tonkawas, to pick forty-five warriors from that reservation and join their regiment with them when we reached the Indian Territory, which he did. Col. Johnson was at the same time in command of the regiment.

Mills County Initiates Bounty Program

The Commissioners Court, in a unanimous decision, agreed to initiate a Bounty program in the County on predatory animals. The cost to the County will be 50% of the Bounty on the following animals—Coyotes, Red Fox and Bobcats.

The courts share will be deposited into the Mills County Predatory Animal Control Fund. (a new name that has replaced The Building Committee Fund).

The Bounty to be paid is as follows:

- \$50.00 on grown Coyotes
- \$25.00 on grown Red Fox and Bobcats.
- \$25.00 on Coyote Pups.
- \$12.50 on Red Fox pups & Bobcat Kittens.

The following is an example of how the money will

work on Grown Coyotes: The Bounty hunter will receive a Certificate from the landowner who has contributed 0.5 cents an acre on the land he owns and/or operates. The Certificate will be issued to the owner and/or operator when he contributes to the fund. The owner must sign the certificate and state the Coyote was killed on his place and in Mills County.

Then the landowner and/or operator will attach a \$12.50 check to the Certificate. The Bounty hunter will bring the check and certificate to the County Judges office, along with the pelt.

The Coyotes ears will be clipped. The owners check and the certificate will be turned over to the Judges office and a \$50 check will be

issued to the bounty hunter from the Predatory Animal Control Fund.

The Bounty hunter gets to keep the pelt. No ears, scalps, or live animals will be accepted.

The Mills County Trapper, Mr. Hammond Humphries, will be on the job as before. So Mills County now has a Trapper program and a Bounty Hunter program.

The Program was brought about by a Public Meeting held in the District Courtroom, May 24, 1977, with about 30 farmers and ranchers in attendance.

The Bounty Certificates will be mailed in the next few days to those farmers and ranchers who have already contributed to the Fund.

If there are any questions on the program, please phone or see County Commissioners, Mr. Danny Long -County Extension Agent, or the County Judge.

City Council Sets Tax Rate
At Special Meeting Tuesday

The Goldthwaite City Council met in a special called session Tuesday afternoon and considered the Tax Roll for the coming year.

City Manager Dale Allen presented the results of the Equalization Board meeting and recommended to the Council that a 13% valuation be established for next year's taxes.

Allen said that real property and inventory was set at \$16,243,162 and Vehicle at \$360,950. This would represent 100% of value.

Based on normal percentage of collection, Allen said this would bring \$31,754.74 into the City treasury.

The tax rate of \$1.50 per \$100 valuation remains unchanged from last year. Tax payers of Goldthwaite will be sent notices of their taxes and will have an opportunity to appear before the Equalization Board if inequities arise.

Tax payers may meet with the Board by appointment only, at times to be specified at a later date.

City Manager Allen added that this tax structure was for the City of Goldthwaite only and does not include the Water District.

In other City business, Carl Allen and Pete Dellis were hired to handle the Night Watchman job for the City. Pete Heath was hired as the operator of the Sanitation Land Fill.

City Manager Allen reported the water problems at the river and off channel storage reservoirs were working better and all problems should be corrected soon.

Local Head Start Group Holds Graduation Service

Twenty children were enrolled in the Head Start Program during the 1976-77 school year. Thirteen are still in the program. Seven of the students moved sometime during the school year.

Several goals were accomplished during this year. All twenty children received free physicals through the program at the Childress Clinic.

Their vision was screened by Mrs. Coats. Two were sent to an eye doctor. One of these needed glasses, which the program bought with handicap money.

The auditory screening was performed by Lynn Harris. Five children were screened by the speech therapist, Doris Haynie. Two needed her services, which they have been receiving.

One child was screened by a hyperactive specialist and received treatment. Another child was screened by Mrs. Williams, diagnostician from the Meridian Coop.

Dr. Tom Cody Graves performed the dental exams. Only four children of the twenty needed dental follow-ups.

All the children received boosters, or began their series of shots, at the Shot Clinics while at Head Start.

The children were given the Super Screening Success by Lois Tom, and several volunteers, at the beginning and end of the year. This shows how much progress the children made. Most of the children made remarkable progress, according to their quarterly progress reports.

Among the volunteer accomplishments were the good attendance of five parents to the Laton Workshop at San Saba in October. The Head Start Christmas Supper planned by the parents. The Bake Sale

efforts made by the parents in order to make money to buy material for curtains for the center. (\$75 was made at this time). The curtains were started in March and finished in April by some of the parents and staff.

Five of the mothers were awarded certificates at the graduation for having volunteered over 30 hours work each. They were Johnette Tyson, Joy Whitt, Josephine Valencia, Charlie Lipke and Pat Miller.

Those who helped the staff move the Head Start equipment out and back in the building for the Stock Show were Karrol Jenkins, Mino and Stephen Coronado, Jerry Gibbard and Mike Williams.

The RSVP volunteers, headed by Ruth Dumas, gave the Head Start children an Easter Party as well as helping during both times of the Super Screenings. Many, many thanks to them.

Hillview Manor hosted a Valentine Party, and the Heritage Home gave them another Easter Party.

Judy Beavers, Home Demonstration Agent, and Peggy Patterson from the Family Planning office, presented a program for the parents at the parents meeting.

Norman Duren lead the tour of the Post Office for the Head Starters.

Fire Marshal Roger Horton told the children all about the fire truck and equipment used by the volunteer firemen. The children also toured Schusters of Texas, Padgett Floral and Savings & Loan.

The Staff must receive in-service training throughout the year. They attended workshops in Llano, San Saba and Midland. By the year 1981, the staff must have CDA Credentials to work in a Head Start Program.

The overall goal of Head Start is to bring about a greater degree of social competence in children of low income families.

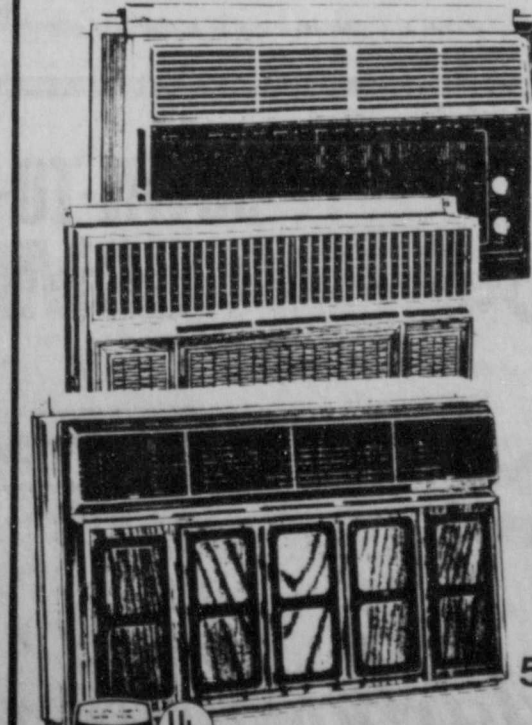
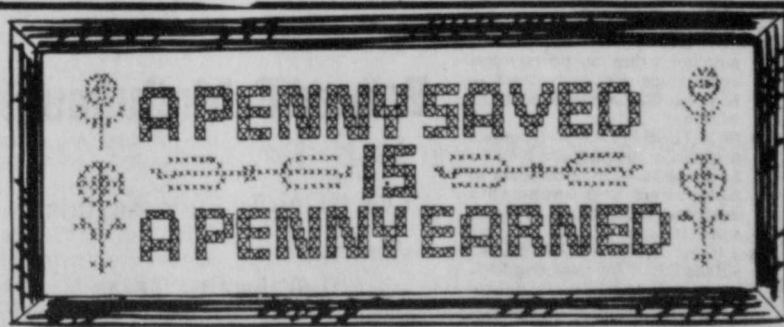

Plans are being made for a Barbecue and Membership drive to be held at the Mills County Park sometime in July.

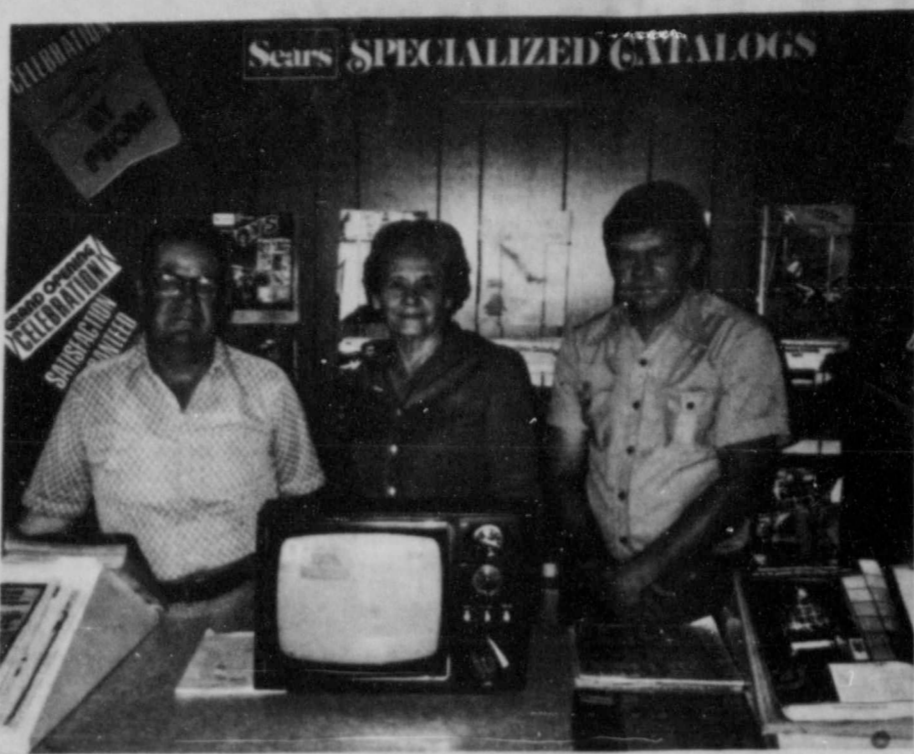

In Farm Ponds

Feeding Boosts Fish Production

If your farm pond is not producing fish up to its potential, maybe it's because of an inadequate feeding program.

"A proper feeding program will increase fish production tenfold," says Don Steinbach, fisheries specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. "Commercial fish feeds will produce more catfish per unit cost than any form of grain. In addition, feeding helps congregating fish for good fishing."

Sunfish and catfish benefit most from commercial feeds but bass do not readily take

artificial feeds. However, they may benefit from increased forage production caused by the feeding.

"Feeding should begin when the water temperature reaches about 70 degrees F. and should continue into the fall until the temperature drops below this level," points out Steinbach.

Both floating and sinking food pellets are available, with the floating type being more

expensive. However, with the floating feed, the fish can be observed while feeding and the correct amount can be determined by how much the fish will eat in a 15-minute period. A feeding area constructed with redwood boards will protect floating feed from wind.

Steinbach advises feeding fish once a day, preferably in the late afternoon. The amount of feed should be based on what they will eat in about 15 minutes but should never be more than 15 pounds per surface acre per day.

"With sinking feed, estimate the weight of the fish and feed 3 percent of this estimate daily," suggests the Extension specialist.

Since fish do not eat as much or as often during the winter months, periodic feedings once or twice a month based on one-half percent of body weight will suffice. An automatic feeder would be best for pond owners who are unable to feed on a daily basis during the

summer. Such a feeder dispenses a measured amount of feed once or twice a day.

"With a proper feeding program, commercial fertilizer should not be applied," emphasizes Steinbach. "Healthy, growing fish produce enough waste products to serve the same purpose as an inorganic fertilizer."

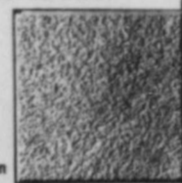
