A man in his 20's writes: "I intend to do a lot of underwater snorkeling and diving on my vacation in the Bahamas, and a friend says that I can get sunburned under water. Is that true?"  
ANSWERline: Yes. The sun's rays can search you out—even three feet under water. Since the skin can be damaged by the sun's ultraviolet rays, and most skin cancer is sun-related, it's important for you to be extra cautious under the strong Caribbean sun. A sunscreen lotion containing PABA (para-aminobenzoic acid) protects the skin and permits gradual tanning. But, it must be reapplied when your sun exposure includes swimming. Lifeguards often use zinc oxide, a thick white ointment to totally block out the sun's ultraviolet rays. If you are floating on the water's surface to snorkel, this kind of ointment might help protect the back of your neck. The American Cancer Society
